Annual Report on Transfer and Articulation October 2008

In 2008's Public Chapter 863, the General Assembly directed the Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) to work with the University of Tennessee and the Tennessee Board of Regents to facilitate "universal articulation" of lower division "transfer paths" to baccalaureate majors.

This legislation builds on a 2000 Act requiring establishment of a community college transfer track of 60 semester credit hours. The 60-hour limit on associate degrees had been achieved. Furthermore, the Tennessee Board of Regents restricted 41 of the 60 hours in the university parallel associate to a General Education Core and made the learning outcomes and distribution requirements for the core common to all universities and community colleges in the system. The University of Tennessee is moving forward with a similar General Education core commonality across its institutions.

The 2008 legislation addresses the remaining 19 semester credit hours of the 60-hour university parallel associate and the assurance of direct articulation of these pre-major courses to specific baccalaureate majors. The legislation directs universal articulation of 19-hour community college transfer paths to all state universities. For example, a transfer path to the B.S. in Criminal Justice will be the same at all community colleges, and all universities will accept in transfer these hours toward degree requirements of the Criminal Justice major.

Universal lower division transfer path articulation will be built first for baccalaureate programs showing the highest transfer rate. The two systems will be accountable for implementing these articulation and transfer procedures and providing clear and effective information to community college students about curricular paths to the degree.

Public Chapter 863 extends the directive of the previous PC 795. Public Chapter 795 requires the Tennessee Higher Education Commission to report to the Joint Education Oversight Committee and the chairs of the House and Senate Finance, Ways and Means Committees on the progress made toward full articulation on October 1 of each year.

In previous years, the Commission has reported on progress made by the coalition of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, the Tennessee Board of Regents, and the University of Tennessee system that addresses articulation agreements among the public institutions. With articulation agreements now in place and the university track program adopted by both systems, the Commission will begin assessment on the success of these arrangements and will also report on the implementation of "universal transfer" of lower division sub-major courses.

The remainder of this year's annual report continues an approach begun last year, providing analysis of recent transfer activity at public institutions: its volume, timing, and directionality. Taken together, last year's and this year's annual reports will create a baseline for future trend analyses.

Notable findings include the following:

- Transfer remains a way of life for today's Tennessee college students. Of the 183,857 undergraduate students enrolled for college credit in Tennessee's public universities and community colleges in Fall 2007, 31.2 percent had transferred at some point in their collegiate career. Forty-three percent of the public university bachelor's degree graduates in 2006-07 started at an institution other than the one from which they graduated.
- Tennessee's public institutions vary greatly in their reliance on transfer student enrollment. The percentage of the Fall 2007 enrollment represented by transfer students ranged from 20.3 percent at the UT Medical Health Science Center to 4.2 percent at Walters State Community College.
- *Transfer is multi-directional.* Taken together, transfers from public universities to community colleges, between community colleges, and between universities accounted for more transfer activity in Fall 2007 than did transfers from community colleges to universities.
- Most students transferring to a public university do so without an associate degree. Nearly two-thirds of transfers to public universities in Fall 2007 did so with fewer than 60 credit hours. Even among those who transferred 60 or more credits, 68.8 percent transferred without an associate degree.
- Hours to degree are generally lower for students who graduated from the same institution at which they started. Average hours to degree were highest for students who began at a Tennessee for-profit institution or an out-of-state institution. Average hours to degree were higher for community college students who transferred with an associate degree than for such students who transferred without one.

Tennessee Transfer Student Profile Fall 2007

In Fall 2007, there were 183,857 undergraduate students enrolled for college credit in Tennessee's public universities and community colleges. Of those students, 57,339 or 31.2 percent had transferred at some point in their collegiate career.¹

Transfer Student Volume and Demographics

- Of Fall 2007 undergraduates enrolled for credit, 14,205 (7.7 percent) transferred that semester (**Table 1A**).²
- On average, transfers made up 8.2 percent of undergraduate enrollments in public universities and 7.0 percent in community colleges.
 - The percentage of fall enrollment represented by transfer students ranged from 20.3 percent at the UT Medical Health Science Center to 4.2 percent at Walters State Community College (**Figure 1A**).
- Adult students aged 25 and up accounted for 33.4 percent of the undergraduate transfer population, compared to 29 percent of undergraduates overall (**Table 1B**).
 - Within public universities, adults were 29.6 percent of undergraduate transfers compared to 22 percent overall.
 - Within community colleges, adults were 39.5 percent of undergraduate transfers compared to 39 percent overall.
- Minority student representation among undergraduate transfers was almost identical to minority representation within the undergraduate population overall. African American students accounted for 18.0 percent of undergraduate transfers, and Hispanic students constituted 2.3 percent (**Table 1C**). These percentages varied little by system.

Credit Hours and Academic Major at Time of Transfer

- Of the 3,219 students who transferred to a public university with 60 or more credit hours, most (2,216, or 68.8 percent) transferred without an associate degree (**Table 2A**).
- Of the 5,398 students who transferred to a community college, more than half (55.5 percent) did so before earning 12 credit hours (**Table 2B**).

¹ For this calculation, students were counted only once regardless of the number of times they transferred between institutions.

² Throughout this report, students were considered transfers only if they met all the following criteria: received credit from another postsecondary institution; were enrolling for the first time at the receiving institution; and had earned no prior degree at the baccalaureate level or above.

Over half of all transfers to public universities in Fall 2007 were accounted for by students in four areas of academic study; Undeclared (23.3 percent); Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services (12.9 percent); Health Professionals and Related Clinical Sciences (9.9 percent); and Multi/Interdisciplinary Studies (7.0 percent). (Figure 3B)

Analysis of Sending and Receiving Institutions

- Transfer within Tennessee's public higher education system is multidirectional. In 2007:
 - 3,919 undergraduates transferred from a community college to a university;
 - o 1,795 transferred from a university to a community college;
 - o 1,214 transferred from one university to another; and
 - 940 transferred from one community college to another. (Tables 4A and 5A)
- Middle Tennessee State University received the greatest number of public transfer students, with 1,207 transfers, which was 15.3 percent of all public transfers or 23.5 of the universities' total (**Tables 4A and 5A**).
- Most public universities received the majority of their community college transfers from one or two primary feeder schools. Universities that received over half of their community college transfers from a single college were the University of Memphis (78.8 percent of its transfers were from Southwest Tennessee CC), UT Chattanooga (60.8 percent from Chattanooga State Technical CC), the UT Health Science Center (57.1 percent from Southwest Tennessee CC), and UT Knoxville (52.4 percent from Pellissippi State Technical CC) (**Table 4B**).
- Of the 4,859 undergraduates who transferred from a community college to another public institution in Fall 2007, 80.7 percent transferred to a university and 19.3 percent to another community college (**Tables 4A** and **4C**).
 - The community college that sent the greatest share of its Fall 2007 transfer class to public universities was Southwest Tennessee CC, at 91.6 percent (**Table 4C**).
 - The community colleges that sent the greatest share of their Fall 2007 transfers to a single university were Northeast State Technical CC, which sent 76.2 percent of its transfers to ETSU, and Southwest Tennessee CC, which sent 75.3 percent of its transfers to the University of Memphis (**Table 4C**).
 - Among community colleges, Cleveland State CC sent the greatest share of its transfers to other community colleges (34.2 percent),

with the majority of those transferring to Chattanooga State (**Table 4C**).

- Nearly six of every ten (59.7 percent) public undergraduates who transferred from a university to another public institution transferred to a community college. The other 40.3 percent transferred from one university to another (**Table 5C**).
 - ETSU was the university that sent the greatest percentage of its transfers to community colleges (73.1 percent). Austin Peay was the university that sent the greatest share of its undergraduate transfers to other universities (56.7 percent) (**Table 5C**).

Institution of Origin for 2006-07 Baccalaureate Graduates


- Forty-three percent of the public university bachelor's degree graduates in 2006-07 started at an institution other than the one from which they graduated. (**Table 6A**).
 - However, the percentages vary by system. Transfer students accounted for almost half of the graduating class of Tennessee Board of Regents universities but only 30.2 percent at University of Tennessee campuses (**Table 6A**).
 - The graduating classes at individual UT campuses contained higher percentages of native students than any TBR university with the exception of Tennessee State University (**Table 6C**).
- Hours to degree were generally lower for students who graduated from the same institution at which they started. Among baccalaureate graduates from TBR universities, students who began at out-of-state institutions or Tennessee for-profit institutions had the highest average hours to degree. Average hours to degree were higher for community college students who transferred with an associate degree than for such students who transferred without one (**Table 7**).



Figure 3B Distribution of Public University Transfer Students by Academic Major, Fall 2007


