Other new features on each county profile sheet include:


- College graduation rates for students from the county.






Percentage of Adults With a Bachelor's Degree or Higher 40.




Registered Voters Who Voted in 2004 Election







 Counties with a higher percentage of bachelor's degree holders than Mexico



In-State College-Going Rate for 2006 High School Graduates






In-State College-Going Rate








Median Household Income






Median Household Income






Median Household Income






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects







In-State College-Going Rate






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects






Percentage Entering College With Developmental Needs in One or More Subjects

EDUCATIONAL NEEDS INDEX

The Educational Needs Index (ENI) combines fifteen county-level data elements into a single number that reflects the level of educational need in each county. The elements include measures of educational attainment, measures of poverty and unemployment, and the distribution of the population across different age and racial categories, along with the growth rates of those demographic categories.

The ENI is scaled so that zero represents the average of all the counties in the United States. Positive ENI numbers indicate counties that have more critical educational needs than the average US county. These are counties that have relatively limited levels of educational attainment combined with economic challenges compounded in many cases by population growth and a shift toward younger and at-risk minority groups. Negative ENI numbers indicate counties that have less critical educational needs and are doing more-or-less well compared to the average US county. Among all the counties in the United States, the lowest ENI (lowest level of educational need) is -1.598 and the highest ENI (highest level of educational need) is 2.205.

Educational Needs Index

The Educational Needs Index (ENI) combines fifteen county-level data elements into a single number that reflects the level of educational need in each county. The elements include measures of educational attainment, measures of poverty and unemployment, and the distribution of the population across different age and racial categories, along with the growth rates of those demographic categories. The ENI is scaled so that zero represents the average of all the counties in the United States. Positive ENI numbers indicate counties that have more critical educational needs than the average US county. These are counties that have relatively limited levels of educational attainment combined with economic challenges compounded in many cases by population growth and a shift toward younger and at-risk minority groups. Negative ENI numbers indicate counties that have less critical educational needs and are doing more-or-less well compared to the average US county. Among all the counties in the United States, the lowest ENI (lowest level of educational need) is -1.598 and the highest ENI (highest level of educational need) is 2.205. The ENI, found on the Web at educationalneedsindex.com, was developed by a nationally respected team of educational researchers. Since the ENI is a statistically complex combination of county-level data, it is extremely difficult to calculate comparable values for larger areas such as Area Development Districts, Areas of Geographic Responsibility, and states





ABOUT THE COUNCIL
