Table reads: In 2006, the mean scale score on the state 4th grade reading test was 80 for non-Title I students and 73 for Title I students. In 2009, the mean scale score in 4th grade reading was 84 for non-Title I students and 78 for Title I students. Between 2006 and 2009, the mean scale score improved at an average yearly rate of 1.3 points for non-Title I students and improved at an average yearly rate of 1.7 points for Title I students, indicating a narrowing of the achievement gap for Title I students at grade 4.

Note: The Kansas Computerized Assessments (KCA) is scored by computing the percent correct.

Table reads: In 2006, 86% of non-Title I 4th graders and 70% of Title I 4th graders scored at the proficient level on the state reading test. In 2009, 92% of non-Title I 4th graders and 80% of Title I 4th graders scored at the proficient level in reading. Between 2006 and 2009, the percentage proficient improved at an average rate of 2.0 percentage points per year for non-Title I students and 3.3 percentage points per year for Title I students, indicating a narrowing of the achievement gap for Title I students at grade 4.
