


Overall Results

- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in DoDEA was 228. This was higher than the average score of 220 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2009 (228) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (229) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (220).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in DoDEA at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 38 points. This performance gap was narrower than that of 1998 (47 points).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (40 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 77 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (78 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (66 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2009, the average score in **DoDEA** was

- lower than that in 1 state/jurisdiction
- higher than those in 43 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 7 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, female students in DoDEA had an average score that was higher than that of male students.
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 17 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (18 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (15 points).
- Data are not reported for students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2009, because reporting standards were not met.
