# STATISTICS OF LAND-GRANT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1947

**T**HIS IS the complete report of 69 land-grant institutions for the year which ended June 30, 1947. Too few of the institutions had sent in reports by October 15 to make it possible, as has been the practice in previous years, to prepare a preliminary report for distribution at the November meeting of the Association of Land-Grant Colleges and Universities. However, a report of the fall enrollments in land-grant institutions was compiled from Circular 238, "1947 Fall Enrollment in Higher Educational Institutions,"<sup>1</sup> and distributed at the meeting.

**STAFF.**—There was an increase in the total number of staff members in institutions for white<sup>2</sup> students of approximately 20 percent. The increase occurs almost entirely in the number of men staff members, the number of women showing an increase of less than 1 percent. Men administrative staff members increased 10.5 percent, while the women administrative staff members decreased 24 percent. In the 17 colleges for Negroes there was an increase of 23.9 percent in the total staffs. These increases were distributed throughout all departments.

**STUDENTS.**—The data for 1946-47 show a full-time enrollment of 465,724 in the regular session in the institutions for white students, compared with 294,109 for 1945-46. The total for men is 356,597 students in 1946-47 as compared with 191,919 in 1945-46, and the total for women is 109,117 in 1946-47 as compared with 102,190 in 1945-46. In the institutions for Negroes the total enrollment was 20,404 students in 1946-47 as compared with 15,761 in 1945-46.

As of June 30, 1947, 272,315 veterans of World War II were enrolled in the institutions for white students, and 7,975 in the institutions for Negroes.

**UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS, BY FIELD.**—Increases in number of students occurred in all fields in the institutions for white students in 1946-47 as compared with 1945-46, except in medicine and nursing.

The greatest increases were in agriculture, 102 percent; engineering, 88 percent; arts and sciences, 85 percent; and pharmacy, 85 percent. In the 17 institutions for Negroes the greatest increase was in arts and sciences, approximately 53 percent. Part of the increase in arts and sciences and part of the decrease in home economics students, may be due to a difference in reporting for the 2 years, the students in home economics having been reported in 1945-46 under "home economics" and under "arts and sciences" in 1946-47. A similar situation may account for the seeming decrease in engineering students.

It should be noted that because of the shortening of the questionnaire sent out by the Office of Education for 1946-47, the fields of commerce, education, fine arts, journalism, and music are included under "other professional."

**DEGREES.**—The number of degrees conferred in all fields has increased. Degrees conferred by professional schools only, have been tabulated in detail for 1946-47. This is a departure from the practice followed in previous years when degrees from professional departments in arts and science schools have been added.

Professional degrees are tabulated in table 11, by sex and institution. Master's and doctor's degrees in arts and sciences are not tabulated by sex in the detail of this bulletin, but are available in the records of this Office.

**INCOME.**—In institutions for white students total educational and general income for 1946-47 shows an increase of \$105,406,252 over the previous year. Income from all sources increased except from the Federal Government. Increases were greatest from the following items: Student fees, 181 percent; sales and services, 83 percent; and State appropriations, 23 percent.

Increases occurred in the institutions for Negroes from all sources except from the Federal Government and from private gifts and grants.

**EXPENDITURES.**—Total expenditures for educational and general, and "other noneducational" items in 1946-47 increased \$11,708,546 over the previous period. Expenditures for every service showed an increase over the previous year.

Increases in all items of expenditure except "extension" occurred in the institutions for Negroes.

**FEDERAL FUNDS.**—Federal funds were \$8,556,722 less than in the previous period. The decrease is due in part to the expiration of war contracts by the Navy and War Departments, and in part to a difference in reporting for the two periods. In explanation, the Clarke-McNary funds show a decrease of \$7,472 under the figure for the previous year, and Norris-Doxey funds, a decrease of \$5,232. The schedule of allotments of Clarke-McNary funds to the land-grant institutions, issued by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, shows that allotments of these funds were made to 36 institutions in 1946-47 of which 9 of the institutions reported them to the Office of Education. In 1945-46 these funds were reported by 15 institutions. Allotments of Norris-Doxey funds were made to 20 institutions. Six of them reported the funds to the Office of Education for 1946-47 and 5 for 1945-46, but not the same ones. Inclusion of these funds in one reporting period and not in the other accounts for some of the decrease.
