
ation's Reading Report Card 2013 State Snapshot Report

Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Arizona was 213. This was lower than the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Arizona in 2013 (213) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (212) and was higher than their average score in 1992 (209).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Arizona (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 50 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (47 points).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 28 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (21 percent).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 60 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (58 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (54 percent).



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 23 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (22 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (23 points).
- In 2013, female students in Arizona had an average score that was higher than male students by 6 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 28 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (32 points).
