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## WCPSS ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) RESULTS, 2010-11

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One method of delivering college-level coursework to high school students is through the Advanced Placement (AP) program. Many colleges and universities provide credit to students who earn a qualifying score on any of the 34 available AP exams<sup>1</sup> offered by the College Board. All qualified comprehensive high schools in the Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) offer AP courses and exams, although the availability of specific courses varies from school to school. Many students take more than one AP course, but not all AP students take the corresponding exams, administered once per year in the spring. The cost to take each AP exam is currently \$87<sup>2</sup> with fee reductions for students with financial need.

AP Exam scores are used to determine whether a student is qualified to receive college credit and advanced placement into a higher level course in college. The scores are reported on a 5-point scale as follows:

- 5 = Extremely well qualified
- 4 = Well qualified
- 3 = Oualified
- 2 = Possibly qualified
- 1 = No recommendation

Analysis of 2010-11 AP reports from the College Board reveals the following:

- 1. The number of WCPSS students taking AP exams continues to grow. Between 1996-97 and 2010-11, the number of students taking AP exams increased by 249%, and the number of exams taken increased 281% (Figure 1). AP course enrollment counts showed an overall 12.6% increase from 2008-09 to 2010-11<sup>3</sup> (Table 5).
- 2. WCPSS students returned their highest overall exam average (3.41) since the 2003-04 school year, while the percentage of exams with scores of 3 or higher surpassed 77% for the first time since 2004-05 (Table 1). U.S. exam averages have been on a steady decline since the mid-1990s, but the 2010-11 N.C. average (2.94) is at its highest level during that same time period (Table 2; Figure 2).
- 3. The exams with the largest number of test-takers in WCPSS in 2010-11 were Environmental Science, English Language/Composition, Psychology, and U.S. History, all in excess of 1,000 exams (Table 3). Since 1996-97, the number of Environmental Science exams has increased from 0 to 1,448; English Language/Composition, 497 to 1,409; Psychology, 13 to 1,302; and U.S. History, 470 to 1,189. Additionally, Calculus BC increased from 77 to 814;

and Statistics, from 135 to 896 (Table 3). Fifteen subjects had fewer than 65 test-takers district-wide in 2010-11 (Table 4).

- 4. All subjects with five or more test-takers, except for French Language, had score averages above 3. Fifty-one percent of exams taken in 2010-11 resulted in scores of 4 or 5 (Table 4).
- 5. More than 43% of seniors, 37% of juniors, almost 10% of sophomores, and less than 1% of freshmen in WCPSS enrolled in at least one AP course in 2010-11 (Table 9).
- 6. The number of AP courses offered varies by school, with Enloe High School accounting for the largest number of courses in 2010-11. Half of WCPSS high schools offer at least 15 of the 34 AP courses available from College Board (Table 5).
- 7. Overall enrollments in AP courses have risen almost 13% since 2008-09. During that time, all ethnicities have shown increased AP course enrollment. Hispanic/Latino enrollments have seen the largest percentage increase at 97%, followed by Multiracial and Black/African American enrollments at 71% and 27%, respectively (Table 6). Enrollments by Economically Disadvantaged students have increased almost 83% (Table 7). While females have consistently accounted for more AP course enrollments, enrollments for male students have risen faster than for female students, 20% compared to 7%, over the past three years (Table 8).

Total Number of AP Exams Taken by WCPSS Students




