Profile of Undergraduate Students: 2011–12

These Web Tables provide comprehensive information on undergraduates who were enrolled in U.S. postsecondary institutions during the 2011–12 academic year. Estimates for enrolled students are presented by attendance status, degree or certificate program, undergraduate major field of study, average grades, student demographic characteristics, financial aid status, credit card debt, work, disability status, and distance and remedial education. These tables are similar to those produced for the 1995-96, 1999-2000, 2003-04, and 2007-08 National Postsecondary Student Aid Study (NPSAS) undergraduate profiles, and they are grouped into six sections:

Section 1 focuses on postsecondary enrollment and attendance, displaying estimates for all undergraduates by level, control, and type of institution; student class level; attendance pattern; distance from home; and participation in distance education.

Section 2 provides percentage distributions of all undergraduates by degree or certificate program, undergraduate major field of study, and average grades.

Section 3 presents estimates by student demographic characteristics, including sex, race/ethnicity, age, dependency status, income, marital status, responsibility for dependents, high school completion status, local residence while enrolled, citizenship status, and parent education level.

Section 4 looks at financial aid and credit card debt. These tables summarize financial aid among all, dependent, and independent undergraduates, as well as the percentage of students with credit cards in their own name and, among those who

carried a balance, the average and median monthly amount.

Section 5 examines students' work experiences while enrolled. Estimates are reported by undergraduates' work intensity while enrolled and, among those who worked, the average and median hours that they worked per week and whether their primary role was work or study.

Section 6 presents estimates of undergraduate enrollment by students' disability status and remedial education coursetaking.

DATA

All estimates presented in these
Web Tables were generated from the
2011–12 National Postsecondary
Student Aid Study (NPSAS:12), a comprehensive, nationally representative
survey of how students finance their
postsecondary education conducted
by the National Center for Education
Statistics (NCES). NPSAS:12 also
includes a broad array of demographic
and enrollment characteristics.

NPSAS:12 used a two-stage sampling design. Institutions were selected for inclusion in the first stage, and students were selected from these institutions in the second stage. The NPSAS:12 target population consisted of all eligible undergraduate and graduate students enrolled any time between July 1, 2011, and June 30, 2012, at Title IV1 eligible postsecondary institutions in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Prior cycles of NPSAS included sample institutions from Puerto Rico. Approximately 95,000 undergraduates and 16,000 graduate students were NPSAS:12 study respondents.

VARIABLES USED

All estimates presented in these Web Tables were produced using PowerStats, a web-based software application that allows users to generate tables for many of the postsecondary surveys conducted by NCES. ENDNOTES

¹ Title IV institutions are those eligible to participate in the federal financial aid programs included in Title IV of the Higher Education Act. These programs include Pell Grants, federal student loans, work-study, and other federal aid.

² The NPSAS samples are not simple random samples; therefore, techniques for estimating sampling error assuming simple random sampling cannot be applied to these data. PowerStats takes into account the complexity of the NPSAS sampling procedures and calculates standard errors appropriate for such samples. The method for computing sampling errors used by PowerStats approximates the estimator by replication of the sampled population using a bootstrap technique.
