

**Education Savings Accounts** 

Student eligibility requirements: Primary requirements

March 2021

Below is the most common eligibility requirement for education savings account programs and the number of states that have them.

• Students with a disability: Four states. Generally, these programs require eligible students to have an identified disability and an Individualized Education Program. One state's criteria for eligibility includes students with an identified disability, along with other factors, such as residing in a low-performing school district or being a child of an active duty member of the armed forces.

Note: Some states require students to attend a public school prior to participating in a private school choice program. Please refer to the "Student eligibility requirement: Previous public school attendance" data point to see which states and programs have such requirements for the given private school choice program.

Arizona	Arizona Empowerment Scholarship	<ul> <li>Students who meet one of the following criteria:</li> <li>- Is identified as having a disability.</li> <li>- Attends a public school or is scheduled to attend a public school that recieves a D or an F letter grade.</li> <li>- A child of a parent who is a member of the armed forces of the United States and who is on active duty or was killed in the line of duty.</li> <li>- Is a ward of juvenille court.</li> <li>- Has a sibling who receives or has received the scholarship.</li> <li>- A child who lives on an Indian reservation.</li> <li>- Has a parent who is blind or deaf or hard of hearing.</li> <li>- Participated previously in the program.</li> </ul>
Florida	The Gardiner Scholarship	Students who meet all of the following criteria: - State resident - Has a disability and an IEP - Must not be enrolled in public school - Must not be enrolled in a program with the Department of Juvenile Justice.

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Mississippi	Equal Opportunity for Students with Special Needs Program	Students who have had an active Individualized Education Program within the past three years and maintained eligibility.
		Applications for participation in the program are approved on a first-come, first-served basis until enrollment reaches 50% of the yearly limit. Once enrollment reaches 50%, the department of education will set application deadlines and maintain a waitlist. Applications are approved in chronological order according to the waitlist.
North Carolina	Personal Education Savings Account	Students with disabilities that have not been placed in a nonpublic school or facility by a public agency at public expense.
Tennessee	Individulized Education Account (IEA) Program	Students with an IEP who have been diagnosed with any of the following: - Autism - Deaf-blindness - Hearing impairment (including deafness) - Intellectual disability - Orthopedic impairment - Traumatic brain injury - Developmental delay - Visual impairment (including blindness) - Multiple disabilities
West Virginia	Hope Scholarship Program	<ul> <li>Students who reside in the state and meet one of the following criteria:</li> <li>Entering Kindergarten and eligible to attend a public school.</li> <li>Attended a public school in the previous year.</li> <li>Attended a public school for 45 days prior to applying for the scholarship account.</li> <li>If, by 2024, less than 5% of eligible students participated in the program in the previous school year, home school and private school students are eligible to participate effective July 1, 2026.</li> </ul>
