Food Safety, Food Defense, and Contaminated Food Annexes

<u>Food Safety and Food Defense: Developing a Contaminated Food Annex</u>, Fact Sheet (REMS TA Center and U.S. Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service). Read about food safety and food defense, the assessment of food service operation hazards, implementation measures to enhance food safety and food defense, training and planning for bioterrorism, and how food safety and food defense can be incorporated into school emergency operations plans (EOPs).

<u>Food Safety Emergency Response Pocket Guide</u>, Publication (U.S. Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service). Find key food safety practices and information for school nutrition professionals to consider in various emergency situations to ensure the safe service of school meals and reduce the risk of foodborne illness. 



<u>Food Safety in Schools</u>, Online Course (Institute of Child Nutrition). Learn about food safety concepts that may be applied to preparing and serving food safely and keeping school nutrition facilities safe and sanitary. Topics include food safety, prevention of foodborne illness, microorganism basics, and more. This 8-hour asynchronous learning opportunity is intended for chefs and school nutrition staff, employees, managers, and directors.

Learn about preventing and controlling norovirus, which causes more than half of all food-related outbreaks of gastroenteritis.
