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Miami-Dade County Public Schools: 2022-2023 Student Performance in the International Baccalaureate Program

Results at a Glance

This Research Brief summarizes the performance of Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) students participating in the International Baccalaureate (IB) program. The IB program was offered at six M-DCPS high schools in 2022-2023. Over 3,200 assessments were completed by M-DCPS students in 30 subject areas in 2022-2023. The number of IB assessments completed in M-DCPS increased from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023. Overall, the percentage of IB assessments receiving passing scores decreased by six percentage points from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023. At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year, 84% of eligible M-DCPS students received IB diplomas.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) program is a rigorous pre-university curriculum and examination program that emphasizes the development of students' intellectual, personal, emotional, and social skills. The IB program provides students with a broad general education while offering specialization based on students' interests and plans. The IB program is recognized at colleges and universities throughout the United States and worldwide.

Three IB programs span the years from kindergarten to pre-university. The programs can be offered individually (the Primary Years Programme for students aged 3-12, the Middle Years Programme for students aged 11-16, and the IB Diploma Programme for students aged 16-19) or as a continuum. A fourth program, the Career-Related Programme, is designed to address the needs of students aged 16-19 who are engaged in career-related education. This report focuses on the IB Diploma Programme that is offered at M-DCPS senior high schools.

The IB Diploma Programme (DP) is a two-year liberal arts curriculum designed to promote an understanding of global citizenship. The program encourages students to become critical and compassionate thinkers and informed participants in local and world affairs. The DP curriculum is made up of three core elements and six subject groups. The three core elements are:

- The Theory of Knowledge course, assessed through an oral presentation and a 1,600word essay, encourages students to reflect on the nature of learning and different kinds of knowledge;
- The extended essay, an independent, self-directed research project, culminates in a 4,000-word paper; and

• A Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) component requires students to take part in a range of experiences and at least one project.

The six subject groups are:

- Studies in language and literature;
- Language acquisition;
- Individuals and societies;
- Sciences:
- Mathematics; and
- The arts.

Students may study an additional course in science, individuals and societies, or languages, instead of a course in the arts. Each student takes three to four subjects at the *Higher Level (HL)* and the remaining subjects at the *Standard Level (SL)*. Students taking courses at HL are expected to demonstrate a greater body of knowledge, understanding, and skills.

Descriptions of courses in the first two subject groups are provided below.

- Studies in language and literature courses are as follows:
 - Language A: Literature These courses introduce students to the analysis of literary texts. Courses are available in 55 languages.
 - Language A: Language and Literature These courses introduce the critical study and interpretation of written and spoken texts from a wide range of literary and non-literary genres. Courses are available in 17 languages.
 - Literature and Performance These courses explore the relationship between literature and theatre. Courses are automatically available in English, and by special request in Spanish and French.
- Language acquisition courses are as follows:
 - Language Ab Initio These courses are for beginners (students who have little or no previous experience of learning the language they have chosen).
 - Language B These courses are intended for students who have some previous experience of learning the language.
 - Classical Languages (Latin or Classical Greek) These courses provide opportunities for students to study the language, literature, and culture of ancient Rome or Greece.

IB Assessments Scoring

In both school years, assessments were scored on a scale of 1 to 7 for each subject, with 7 being the highest. A score of 4 is considered a passing score on an IB assessment. Students must earn a total of 24 points on their six IB assessments to receive the IB diploma, subject to certain

minimum levels of performance across all components of the program and satisfactory completion of the CAS requirement. Students can also be awarded up to three additional points toward the overall diploma score for their combined results on the Theory of Knowledge course and the extended essay.

Six M-DCPS high schools offered the IB program during the 2022-2023 school year: Coral Gables Senior, Coral Reef Senior, John A. Ferguson Senior, Miami Beach Senior, North Miami Senior, and South Dade Senior. This Research Brief includes 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 data on these six M-DCPS schools. The tables included in this report provide data on the number of IB assessments completed and the percentage of assessments receiving passing scores by subject area across all six M-DCPS IB schools, by school across all subject areas, and by school and ethnicity across all subject areas. The number and percentage of participating students earning diplomas in the District and at each IB school are also provided. The reader should note that results are not reported if fewer than 10 assessments were taken.

Participation in Assessments

- In 2022-2023, M-DCPS students completed 3,213 IB assessments. The number of assessments completed by M-DCPS students increased by 171 assessments from 3,042 completed in 2021-2022.
- M-DCPS students took IB assessments in 30 subject areas in 2022-2023. Overall, most
 IB assessments were taken in History, Mathematics: Analysis and Approaches, Spanish
 B, Biology, and English A Language & Literature in 2022-2023. Over half (60%) of IB
 assessments taken by M-DCPS students were taken in these five subject areas.
- The greatest number of IB assessments were completed at Coral Gables Senior in 2022-2023 (873 assessments).
- From 2021-2022 to 2022-2023, the number of IB assessments completed increased at four of the four M-DCPS IB schools: John A. Ferguson Senior, Miami Beach Senior, North Miami Senior, and South Dade Senior. The number of IB assessments completed at the other two M-DCPS IB schools decreased.
- The District's Hispanic students completed 71% of all IB assessments in 2022-2023. White students completed 17% of IB assessments, Black students completed 6%, and students classified as "Other" (Alaskan Native, American Indian, Asian, Pacific Islander, and Multiracial categories) took 5%.
- From 2021-2022 to 2022-2023, the percentage of assessments completed by Hispanic and Black students increased by one percentage point, while that for White students decreased by three percentage points, and the Other ethnic group remained the same.

Assessment Results

• Overall, the percentage of IB assessments receiving passing scores in M-DCPS decreased by six percentage points from 90% in 2021-2022 to 84% in 2022-2023.

- The 2022-2023 subject areas in which the highest percentages of M-DCPS IB assessments received passing scores (98%+) were Social and Cultural Anthropology, Business Management, German B, Italian B, and World Religions. The subject areas in which the lowest percentages of IB assessments received passing scores were Visual Arts and French AB (both 58%).
- Coral Reef Senior and Miami Beach Senior had the highest percentages of IB assessments receiving passing scores (93% and 94%, respectively) in 2022-2023.
- From 2021-2022 to 2022-2023, the percentage of assessments receiving passing scores increased at two M-DCPS IB schools, Coral Reef Senior, and Miami Beach Senior.
- In 2022-2023, 93% of IB assessments completed by M-DCPS White students, 84% of assessments completed by Hispanic students, 59% of assessments completed by Black students, and 90% of assessments completed by students classified as "Other" received passing scores.
- From 2021-2022 to 2022-2023, the percentage of assessments receiving passing scores
 decreased by one to five percentage points for all ethnic groups, while decreasing by 29
 percentage points for Black students.

Diploma Results

- Grade 12 students who were enrolled in the IB program, met all program requirements and took the required examinations were eligible to receive IB diplomas.
- A total of 436 M-DCPS students, or 84% of eligible students, received IB diplomas at the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year. The percentage of the District's eligible IB program students receiving an IB diploma decreased by 9 percentage points from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023.
- Of the six M-DCPS IB schools, Miami Beach Senior had the highest percentage of eligible students receiving IB diplomas (98%) in 2022-2023.
- From 2021-2022 to 2022-2023, the percentage of students receiving IB diplomas decreased at five out of the six M-DCPS IB schools.

Summary

This Research Brief summarized the performance of M-DCPS students participating in the IB program. Six M-DCPS high schools offered the IB program during the 2022-2023 school year: Coral Gables Senior, Coral Reef Senior, John A. Ferguson Senior, Miami Beach Senior, North Miami Senior, and South Dade Senior.

Over 3,200 assessments were completed by M-DCPS students in 30 subject areas in 2022-2023; the number of IB assessments completed in M-DCPS increased by 171 assessments from 2021-

2022 to 2022-2023. The greatest number of IB assessments were completed at Coral Gables Senior. Districtwide, 71% of IB assessments were completed by Hispanic students, 17% were completed by White students, 6% were completed by Black students, and 5% were completed by students classified as "Other."

The percentage of M-DCPS IB assessments receiving passing scores decreased by six percentage points to 84% from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023. Coral Reef Senior and Miami Beach Senior had the highest percentages of IB assessments receiving passing scores. White and "Other" students had the highest percentage of IB assessments receiving passing scores in 2022-2023, followed by Hispanic students, and Black students.

Overall, 84% of M-DCPS' eligible students received an IB diploma at the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year. The percentage of eligible students earning an IB diploma decreased by nine percentage points from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023. Of the six M-DCPS IB schools, Miami Beach Senior had the highest percentage of eligible students receiving IB diplomas in 2022-2023: 98%.
