

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

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
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Five years ago, the Nellie Mae Education Foundation established the New England ABE-to-College Transition Project – the first grantmaking program within our Adult Literacy initiative. Our goal was to bridge the gap between academic work required for a GED certificate and skills required for college-level work. We developed a partnership with the renowned New England Literacy Resource Center (NELRC), whose expertise in educational transitions for adults inspired and shaped our undertaking. So far, the 25 ABE-to-College Transition programs that received our grants and participated in technical assistance activities with NELRC have prepared more than 1,600 GED recipients for college.

Recently, Dr. Julia Gittleman of Mendelsohn, Gittleman & Associates completed an evaluation of the Project. What resulted is one of the few studies that documents GED recipients' access to higher education — *The New England ABE-to-College Transition Project Evaluation Report*.

Readers will also find important information on how to take a bite out of college tuition bills. Last academic year, 8,400 students saved \$44 million in college tuition costs by participating in NEBHE's Regional Student Program (RSP). See pages 18–22 for more information about the RSP. For information on traditional grant and loan programs, see pages 24–30 where NEBHE's Wendy Lindsay presents a guide to financial aid and an overview of scholarship and loan programs available in each New England state.

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
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New England Board of Higher Education ... Working Together for College

alf a century ago, six visionary New England governors realized that New England's future hopes rested with higher education. Against a backdrop of deep economic uncertainty and exploding college enrollments fueled by the G.I. Bill, these governors formed the New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE) and committed their states to the shared pursuit of excellence. Soon after that, NEBHE was approved by New England's six state legislatures and authorized by the U.S. Congress.

Much has changed since those days. New technologies have transformed New England's workplaces, schools and homes. The clang of the machine shop has given way to the click of the mouse. New populations have enriched the region's economy and culture. And a college education has become a prerequisite of upward mobility—a pathway to economic success and civic engagement.

A few things have *not* changed. One, New England's future is inextricably linked to the innovation emanating from its 270 colleges and universities and the intellectual potential of its nearly 850,000 college students. Two, six states can do more together than one can do alone. And three, *higher education is still the future of New England*.

Today, each New England state is represented on the New England Board of Higher Education by eight delegates—leaders of education, business and government who are appointed by their states' governors and legislative leadership. They are supported by a staff of dedicated professionals who work closely with public and private partners throughout the sixstate region.

NEBHE Programs

More than 700 majors with a tuition break NEBHE's **Regional Student Program (RSP)** provides New England residents with major tuition savings at out-of-state public colleges



and universities in New England. Established in 1957, the RSP is available to students who pursue specialized degree programs not offered by their home-state public institutions. In academic year 2004-2005, the RSP saved more than 8,400 New Englanders \$44 million in tuition!

The RSP also saves New England's taxpayers millions of dollars because the states don't have to start up and maintain expensive academic programs that are already offered by their neighbors. The RSP is a common market for higher education.

Diversity in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics

The fastest-growing segments of New England's job market require skills in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). Yet many of the region's fastest-growing populations have been severely underrepresented in these fields. NEBHE's **Excellence Through Diversity (ETD)** program aims to create a regional environment that supports the full participation of groups that have been traditionally underrepresented in STEM disciplines in academia and industry—particularly African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and Southeast Asians. ETD's Annual Science Network program, co-sponsored by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, brings together hundreds of high school, undergraduate and graduate students interested in STEM disciplines to meet with academic and industry professionals for a day of networking and information sharing. ETD provides professional development opportunities for graduate students in STEM disciplines and an online information clearinghouse featuring

STEM resources. ETD also is engaged in a Congressionally funded research study examining key issues related to underrepresented populations in STEM disciplines and careers.

More Programs

NEBHE's **Policy and Research** programs provide vital data and analysis of higher education trends, convene opinion leaders and practitioners to share best practices and forge strategies to address New England's higher education challenges.

NEBHE's **Professional Development** programs provide cutting-edge curriculum and professional development for community college faculty in collaboration with secondary school teachers and college and university faculty. Programs focus on science, technology, engineering and math fields.

NEBHE's **International Exchange Programs** offer affordable study-abroad opportunities at colleges and universities in Quebec and Nova Scotia.

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

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

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Regional Student Program Tuition Break for New England Residents

he New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) provides residents of the New England states — Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont — with an out-of-state tuition break when they enroll in approved majors at public colleges and universities in other New England states.

All of New England's 78 public colleges and universities participate in the RSP, offering more than 700 majors with the RSP tuition break. Programs are available through the RSP at all academic levels: associate, bachelor's, master's, certificate of advanced graduate study, doctoral and first-professional.

RSP eligibility

The approved RSP majors are listed in the annual state-specific RSP *Apple Book* catalogs. The *Apple Books* are available in print and online from the New England Board of Higher Education. Visit **www.nebhe.org** or telephone 617-357-9620.

Residents of a particular New England state are eligible for an approved major, because that major is not offered by any home-state public institution. Students apply for RSP status on the institution's application form; no separate application is required. The institution notifies applicants who are accepted for admission whether they have been granted RSP status.

The approved majors listed in the *Apple Books* do not necessarily include every program for which residents might expect to be RSP-eligible. Participating colleges and universities may decide against offering certain programs through the RSP, such as those programs that are highly competitive.

In addition to being eligible for programs listed in the *Apple Book*, in certain cases graduate students may petition for RSP eligibility by documenting that the program in question is not offered by any home-state public institution. (RSP Policy 3B2a.)

Also, in certain cases students who reside near a state border may apply for RSP eligibility at an out-of-state public college that is closer to their home than an in-state public college offering the same program. (RSP Policy 3B3.)

The RSP tuition break

The RSP tuition rate reflects a significant break on an institution's out-ofstate tuition rate. Public colleges and universities charge *out-of-state* tuition to students who permanently reside in other states and *in-state* tuition to students who permanently reside in the state where the college or university is located.

Information on tuition rates is available from participating colleges and universities and from the New England Board of Higher Education.

In academic year 2004-05, more than 8,400 New England students were enrolled through the RSP and saved nearly \$44 million on their annual tuition bills. Participating students enrolled on a full-time basis saved on average nearly \$6,500 in tuition each in academic year 2004-05.

The RSP is a tuition-discount program. Students are eligible based on their program of study, not on financial need. RSP students are eligible to apply for financial aid from other sources.

Shared resources

The RSP enables the six New England states to expand educational opportunities for their residents, while avoiding duplication of costly academic programs. Established by NEBHE in 1957, the RSP has provided New England residents with savings on more than 190,000 annual tuition bills. Meanwhile the RSP has helped the individual New England states avoid spending billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures for academic programs already offered in other New England states.

Meeting College Costs Using Financial Aid

In academic year 2004-05, the average cost of attending a four-year private college in the United States was more than \$29,000 a year, according to the College Board. The average cost of attending a four-year public college was \$14,000 for an in-state student and \$21,000 for an out-of-state student. Multiply that by four, and the average pricetag for a bachelor's degree is \$118,000 at a private college and \$57,000 to \$84,000 at a four-year public college.

Understandably, prospective college students and their families often find these costs daunting, and most turn to financial aid to help foot the bill.

In fact, at least half of all students receive financial aid to help pay for college.

Financial aid is available from a variety of sources, including the federal government, state government agencies (listed on page 27), colleges, private foundations, community organizations, corporations and the military.

What are students and families expected to pay? That depends on their current financial situation and ability to help pay the cost of a college education. Students and families provide relevant information on the financial aid applications required by the colleges, who in turn decide what a family is expected to contribute.*

For starters, students and their parents need to complete the federal government's FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to be considered for any financial aid, including loans.

In addition to the FAFSA, colleges usually require students to complete a college financial aid application form. Some colleges also require their applicants to complete the College Board's application, called Profile, for awarding non-federal student aid funds.

The FAFSA asks students and their parents to report income from the previous calendar year and provide other information such as number of children in college and amount of money in bank accounts. The federal government calculates the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and reports this information to the colleges selected by the student. A Student Aid Report is also sent to the student.

Colleges often use their own criteria to determine a student's EFC based

on information from the applications they require. The colleges identify the student's eligibility for financial aid by subtracting the EFC from the Cost of Attendance.

What is the Cost of Attendance? The colleges determine the estimated full cost of attendance for their students, which includes not only tuition, fees, room and board, or the costs of off-campus living, but also books and supplies, transportation and personal expenses.

*Students who are independent report only their own income and assets (and their spouse's, if married). A student is considered independent if one of the following applies: Born before Jan. 1, 1981 (for 2004-05 academic year), married, enrolled in a graduate program (beyond bachelor's degree), has legal dependent(s), is an orphan or ward of the court or a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces.

Types of Financial Aid

There are three basic types of financial aid: (1) scholarships and grants, (2) federal work-study and (3) loans.

Scholarships and Grants

Scholarships and grants are gift aid, because, unlike loans, they are not paid back. They are awarded based on financial need and other criteria, such as achievement, religious affiliation, ethnicity, memberships, hobbies or special interests.

Scholarships and grants are offered by the federal government, state financial aid agencies, colleges, private businesses, foundations and community organizations, towns, high schools, veterans' groups, etc. Information is available from colleges, high school guidance offices, public libraries, community organizations, scholarship directories and online resources (see page 26).

Federal Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants are awarded by the colleges to students who are identified as eligible by the federal government, based on information provided in the FAFSA. Individual states have grant and scholarship programs for their residents. (See detailed list for New England states on page 27.)

Federal Work-Study Program

Work-study money is awarded by the colleges to students identified as eligible by the federal government, based on information provided in the FAFSA. The students earn the award amount through part-time employment provided or arranged by the college.

Loans for Students and Parents

Loans, which account for about 60 percent of all financial aid, can be taken out by students, parents or both. Students do not have to pay back their loans until after leaving college; however, parents must begin making payments soon after the loan is disbursed.

Federal Perkins Loans are very low-interest loans administered by the college for students with exceptional financial need.

CALCULATING ELIGIBILITY

Cost of Attendance

Tuition, fees, room and board, books and supplies, transportation, personal expenses.

Expected Family Contribution Determined from the FAFSA and/or the College Board's Profile and any other financial aid application required by the college.

Eligibility for Financial Aid The maximum amount of money students can expect to receive in financial aid.

FREE INFORMATION

Free financial aid information and free scholarship searches are readily available from several sources including the federal government, state financial aid agencies (see list starting on page 27), college financial aid offices, high school guidance counselors, libraries and the Internet (see page 26).

Watch out for scholarship scams! Explore all free sources before considering any private, fee-based scholarship service. Make sure a private service is reputable. Information is available from the Federal Trade Commission at www.ftc.gov or telephone 1-877-FTC-HELP.

MEET DEADLINES

Students need to check with the college financial aid office to find out which application forms are required and what the deadlines are. Financial aid applications must be completed on time, and early is better. Note: Students can apply for financial aid before they have been accepted by the colleges where they have applied for admission.

The FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible after January 1. Students and families can choose to estimate their income for the previous year and verify it later, instead of delaying their application until after filing taxes.

Federal Stafford Loans for Students

Through the federal Stafford Loan Program, students can borrow up to a maximum loan amount each year they are enrolled and pay back the loan after leaving college. Loans are subsidized for eligible students (the interest is forgiven while the student is enrolled) or unsubsidized (the interest accrues while the student is enrolled). If the college participates as a lender in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, students apply through the college's financial aid office. Otherwise, students apply to a bank, credit union or other lender that participates in the Federal Family Education Loans program (FFELP).

Federal PLUS Loans for Parents

Parents who take out federal PLUS loans begin payments within 60 days after the loan has been disbursed. If the college participates as a lender in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, parents apply through the college's financial aid office. Otherwise, parents apply to a bank, credit union or other lender that participates in the Federal Family Education Loans program (FFELP).

Other loan programs are available from state financing authorities, as well as from private lenders and some colleges.

Armed Forces

The U.S. Armed Forces offer various college financing options to students who meet eligibility requirements. Information is available at the U.S. military's career guide site: www.myfuture.com. Options include the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) Program, which helps enrollees pay for some college expenses and the Montgomery G.I. Bill, which provides financial support to those who attend college after serving in the military.

Other Ways to Meet College Costs

- Use a tuition payment plan.
- Get an out-of-state tuition break: The New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program provides New England residents with a tuition break when they study approved majors at public colleges and universities in other New England states. Eligibility is explained in the annual RSP catalog, available at www.nebhe.org or from NEBHE at 617-357-9620.
- Participate in community service: Americorps is a national program that allows college-age students to earn education awards in return for national service. Visit www.americorps.gov or telephone 800-942-2677.
- Attend college half-time or part-time and take longer to complete a degree, but still remain eligible for some financial aid (attending at least half-time is required for federal Stafford and Plus loan programs).
- Attend a lower-cost, two-year community college then transfer to a four-year college to earn a bachelor's degree.
- Commute to college instead of living on campus.
- Work for a company or organization that provides tuition assistance.

Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is determined by "federal methodology" and "institutional methodology."

Federal methodology is a calculation, according to a formula specified in federal law, of information provided in the FAFSA, based on the student's income and assets, and in the case of dependent students, also the parents' income, assets and number of dependents. Detailed information available at: www.ifap.ed.gov.

Institutional methodology is a calculation conducted by colleges and universities who require other financial aid applications, such as the College Board's Profile, in addition to the results of the FAFSA.

Tuition Waiver Program

Eligibility: Maine residents attending school within the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or Maine Maritime Academy who are children or spouses of firefighters, law enforcement officers, and emergency medical services personnel who have been killed in the line of duty, or died as a result of injuries received during the performance of their duties. Or, students who were foster children under the custody of the Maine Department of Human Services when they graduated from high school.

Maine Health Professions Loan Program



- **3.** Brief factual descriptions note the year the institution was founded, types of programs offered and degrees awarded.
- **4.** The NEBHE survey asks campuses to provide the names and titles of senior campus officers. In general, the campus officers listed include presidents, academic deans, chief financial officers and undergraduate admissions and financial aid officers.
- 5. Most New England colleges and universities are accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), a regional accrediting body based in Bedford, Massachusetts. - **7.** An institution's student body is classified as **men** for men only, **women** for women only or **coed** for men and women.
