## Directory of Open-Space Facilities in Pennsylvania

In recent years many schools have been built in Pennsylvania which are specially designed for flexible teaching practices and children's differentiated learning styles. These have been termed open-space buildings because there are limited permanent walls to separate classrooms as opposed to the "egg crate" designs of traditional schools. The open-space areas within the buildings range in various functional shapes from triangular, octagonal, and circular to L-shaped and rectangular.

The structural plans of open-space buildings provide for the accommodation of large numbers of children in large work spaces and allow for various groupings and regroupings of pupils under the direction of teacher teams. The work areas differ in sizes according to need, some being equal to a double classroom whereas others are comparable to ten classrooms. Many open space buildings have movable interior walls that may partly or entirely screen off sections of the large open space. These flexible open areas can be readily adapted for small and large group instruction as well as for individual learning areas.

Since the organization and separation of space is quite different from traditional buildings, new terms are used to designate these spaces. Rather than rooms, divisions or classes, the spaces are now referred to as pods, clusters or areas.

The attached list includes new school buildings in Pennsylvania which have open-space construction and those which recently renovated or built a new wing designed for open concept teaching. The brief description of each school is intended only as a general indicator of the school facility. For further information, the name and address of a contact person is provided for each school.
