ABSTRACT

The contents in this catalog represent a basic collection of occupational booklets and paperbacks suitable for any library or school. It was prepared to assist librarians, teachers, counselors, and educators in obtaining free and inexpensive resources on career education. Students can also use the catalog as a reference handbook for sources of career information. The preliminary section entitled "100 Millionaire Success Stories" is based on factual cases and is included to encourage young people to develop their ideas and to take risks in business ventures. There are 217 career fields and topic areas listed alphabetically, with pamphlet titles and major sources given within each field. Complete addresses of 403 sources are listed alphabetically at the back of the catalog. It is suggested that sources can be used for developing vertical files, pamphlet collections, counselor libraries, and curriculum material centers. Of the 1,216 items listed, 604 are free to librarians and teachers and the remaining are priced at no more than \$3.00. (TA)

ABOUT THIS BOOK

This catalog was prepared to assist librarians, teachers, counselors, and educators in obtaining free and inexpensive resources on career education. The contents represent a basic collection of occupational booklets and paperbacks suitable for any library or school. Students will find the catalog useful as a reference handbook for sources of valuable career information. The preliminary section entitled "100 Millionaire Success Stories" is based on factual cases and is included in this book to encourage young people to develop their ideas and to take risks in business ventures.

There are 217 career fields and topic areas listed alphabetically, with pamphlet titles and major sources given within each field. Complete addresses of 403 sources are listed alphabetically at the back of the book. Addresses may, of course, change from time to time. All sources are excellent for developing vertical files, pamphlet collections, counselor libraries, and curriculum material centers.

Of the 1,216 items listed, 604 are free to librarians and teachers. No item is priced over \$3.00. Understandably, the supply of certain free items may eventually become exhausted. In some cases, different titles will be sent as replacements.

It is recommended that only one copy of each free publication be requested. The person making the request should ask for a specific title rather than make a blanket request for all the free materials available. If possible, use library or school letterhead stationery, identify yourself as a teacher or librarian, and include a return mailing label. Every letter of request for free materials should contain a statement that the SUPPLIER IS TO DISREGARD THE REQUEST IF THE SUPPLY OF FREE MATERIAL IS EXHAUSTED. There is no need for a supplier to waste time and postage on a service which he offers free. NEITHER THE SUPPLIER NOR THE AUTHOR CAN POSSIBLY GUARANTEE THE CONTINUED AVAILABILITY OF EVERY ITEM LISTED.

Payment by check should be enclosed with orders for those publications having a price. Unless prepaid, many orders for inexpensive pamphlets will not be filled. Librarians interested in developing a career library may want to write all sources and request complete lists of publications available.

In addition to the titles listed herein, there are at least four basic reference sources which should be included in every career education library: (1) THE OCCUPATIONAL OUTLOOK HANDBOOK (U.S. Dept. of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics), (2) THE ENCYCLOPEDIA OF CAREERS AND VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE (2 vols., J.G. Ferguson Pub. Co.), (3) BOOKS FOR OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS: A LIST FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGES, TECHNICAL INSTITUTES AND VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS (Edward Mapp, Bowker Co., N.Y.), and (4) LOVEJOY'S CAREER AND VOCATIONAL SCHOOL GUIDE (Simon & Schuster).

Anyone interested in organizing a pamphlet library should write for the booklet entitled "The Pamphlet Library: Use of the Sha-Frame System" (1972, 14p., \$1.00), and "Sources of Free Teaching Materials - 1975: 135 Lists to Write For Plus Over 1300 Pamphlet Titles" (1975, 58p., \$3.95). "100 MILLIONAIRE SUCCESS STORIES"

1. PET ROCKS

Gary Dahl, of Los Gatos, California, made one million dollars in 90 days. He wrote a funny little manual on care and training of pet rocks, packaged it with the rock in a cardboard carrying case, and sold it for \$4.00.

2. BARBERING

Norris Womack, of Texas, is a multimillionaire who owns two ultra-swanky barber shops, operates a barber college, and markets his own line of hair products. His philosophy is that Texans are willing to pay extra well for the best of something they really want.

3. TOLL FREE DIGEST

Paul Montana has become financially successful by publishing the "Toll Free Digest", which lists thousands of "800" numbers that can be called free of charge. A half million books have been printed in three years.

4. LIFE INSURANCE

Wes Wyatt, of Stillwater, Oklahoma, became a multimillionaire by being a super salesman. He owns a life insurance agency and investment company. His first job was selling sewing machines door-to-door.

5. CRUNCHY GRANOLA

Wayne Schlotthauer, of Paradise, California, started in a small bakery, went into the garbage business, then bought the recipe for Crunchy Granola. He's worth \$10 million.

6. WRITING

Anne Rice made \$1 million from her first book entitled "Interview With the Vampire".

7. DIAMONDS

Mayoshi Ikeda, a Japanese immigrant, washed dishes for \$1 an hour. Today he is a diamond wholesaler worth \$18 million.

8. HOTELS

Cecil Day, of Atlanta, Georgia, runs 149 Days Inns and is a millionaire 100 times over. He started as a real estate salesman and made his first million at age 20.

9. FLORIST

Arthur O. Stone, of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, started as a delivery boy. Today he is a multimillionaire with franchises to 35 shops.

10. FOOD SERVICE

Walter S. Fong, a naturalized American citizen, owns a chain of 37 supermarkets in the Sacramento, California area. He began plucking chickens at 50 cents a day. Today his stores employ 900 people and gross \$2 million per week.

11. PLASTIC BAGS
Herman Weist, a millionaire from Louisville, Kentucky, began by peddling fruits and vegetables door-to-door. In his garage, and with only \$1000, he invented a machine to make plastic bags. His fortune followed.
12. McDONALDS
Ray A. Kroc is worth \$500 million. He sold the original McDonald's restaurant special mixers to make 48 milkshakes at one time. Today he is chairman of the board. McDonald's does a business of \$1 billion a year.
13. PIZZA
Jeno Paulucci founded Chun King Chinese food, which grosses \$100 million a year. His second multimillion dollar corporation was Jeno's, Inc. He began as a wholesale grocery salesman, sleeping in his car and shaving in gas stations. Today Jeno's employs 1200 workers and is Duluth, Minnesota's largest employer.
14. GREETING CARDS
Joyce Clyde Hall founded Hallmark Cards, Inc., which employs 10,000 people and has annual sales of \$325 million. He began by selling perfume and imported cards door-to-door. Today he produces a billion cards a year.
15. TRUCKING
Cleo Crouch, of St. Joseph, Missouri, is worth \$3 million. He began as a terminal manager and bought out a firm for \$5,000.
16. BAKING INDUSTRY
L. S. Hartog, of Atlanta, made \$5 million in the baking and restaurant franchise business. He started in a bakery greasing cake pans, and then bought a bakery for \$750. He bought businesses, expanded, and sold at a profit.
17. CREDIT AND INVESTMENT
W. Bennett, of Atlanta, is worth \$2 million. He began as an accountant and now owns 21% interest in General Resources Corp., a conglomerate which controls seven companies.
18. INSURANCE
W. Clement Stone, Chicago insurance mogul, amassed a fortune of \$400 million. He began selling newspapers, then life insurance. With only \$100 he launched his own life insurance business.
19. PAPER INDUSTRY
Norman H. Stone, a multimillionaire, is head of a gigantic corporation which operates 24 paper mills and corrugated box plants. He started by selling paper and twine. With only \$500, he started a paper business. Today the Stone Corp. employs 3900 people and does an annual business of \$200 million.

20. APPAREL INDUSTRY

Jim Haggard, founder of the Haggard slacks empire, began as a window washer. Today his business grosses \$145 million a year. He immigrated from Lebanon to New Orleans when he was 14. He sold overalls and hit on the idea of selling overalls at a single low price. In a Dallas office building, he set up shop with secondhand sewing machines.

21. CARTOONIST

Charles Schultz, creator of the Peanuts, Charlie Brown, and Snoopy strips, has his comics appearing in 1,655 newspapers. He grosses over \$150 million a year on the strips, cards, T-shirts, etc. Schultz flunked four courses in high school. He went to work for an advertising firm as an artist and delivery boy for \$16 a week. Today 100 million people enjoy his cartoons.

22. FOOD INDUSTRY

Peter Volod, a multimillionaire, is sole owner of the King Korn Trading Stamp Co. and former owner of the Fireside Marshmallow Co. He began as a grocery clerk, messenger boy, newsboy, and macaroni salesman. He then founded the Fireside Marshmallow Co.

23. AVIATION

Bill Lear, multimillionaire from Reno, Nevada, founded the Lear Jet aviation empire. He quit school in the eighth grade and worked as an auto mechanic. He patented a car radio for Motorola, plus 175 other patents, and founded two companies.

24. GRANDFATHER CLOCKS

George T. Fowler, of Fairhope, Alabama, is worth \$5 million. The business he founded manufactures and sells grandfather clock kits. He began by obtaining jewelry on consignment and starting a jewelry store chain. His newest mail-order firm makes chandeliers.

25. CONTAINER INDUSTRY

Sam Kipnis, an immigrant, founded the National Container Corp. and sold it for \$185 million. He started in a box factory for no pay until he learned the job. With \$300, he opened a box-making shop.

26. ELECTRONICS

Ben C. Wang, worth \$2.5 million, owns 20% of Wango, Inc. After working for IBM, Ampex, and Scientific Data Systems, he founded Wango in Los Angeles to manufacture mini-computers. When he arrived from Shanghai, he had \$100 and was \$2,000 in debt.

27. PUBLISHING

Ed Uhlan, a polio victim, expanded \$5 into \$5 million. He sent out postcards asking people to pay \$300 to see their poems printed in an anthology. His autobiography "The Rogue of Publishers' Row" tells the story. His firm, Exposition Press, publishes novels, cookbooks, and other manuscripts that other publishers turn down. Residing in Massapequa, N.Y., he employs 22 people.

28. RESTAURANT CHAIN

Nick Barone, worth \$2 million, was penniless when he arrived from Italy. From one pizzeria, he expanded to five restaurants and four franchises in Chicago. He began as a dish washer and bus boy.

29. HOTELS

Kemmons Wilson, a multimillionaire from Memphis, founded the Holiday Inns. Today his firm owns 300 hotels worth \$1 billion, plus 1700 franchises. After quitting school, he took a job marking the stock board at a brokerage firm. He bought a popcorn machine and sold popcorn in a theater. His pinball machines were put in drugstores, and the profit went into construction.

30. BUSINESS

Jerry Weaver, a multimillionaire from Gadsden, Alabama, controls four manufacturing firms and is chairman of a bank board. He began as a tool and die maker, and then bought old tooling equipment. Using the equipment as collateral, he established the Dixie Tool and Die Co. As a boy, his family was so poor it had to hunt, fish, and grow food in order to eat.

31. MEAT PACKING

Nat Buring, a multimillionaire from Memphis and founder of the Buring Packing Plant, is principal stockholder of the \$9 million meat company. He quit school in the eighth grade to peddle meat in the streets. At night he made sausage in a washtub and peddled it during the day.

32. SCRAP METAL INDUSTRY

Gracie Smith, mother of six, is worth \$10 million. As an independent scrap dealer in El Dorado, Arkansas, she started by buying old batteries and copper wire. She cleaned the scrap at night and sold it to a metal broker the next day. In addition to the Benton Iron & Metal Co., she owns three other companies and is involved in several others.

33. ADVERTISING

George Lois, a multimillionaire adman from New York, heads Lois Holland Callaway, Inc. He was the first to call a Volkswagen a "beetle", and helped get Robert F. Kennedy elected as senator. He began as a designer and his creativity skyrocketed him to success.

34. FOOD SERVICE

Sherwood Johnson developed the Shakey's Pizza Parlor into a worldwide \$100 million-a-year business. With \$1700 he opened his first pizza parlor, but had to soap the windows because money was not available for curtains. Franchises were sold and in 1967 his shares were sold for \$4 million.

35. ENGINEERING

Gene Hirs, a multimillionaire from Birmingham, Michigan, founded the Hydromation Filter Co. to purify oil for machines. After quitting his job at Ford, he invested \$3,000 to set up shop in his garage. Today he is worth \$5 million.

36. BANKING

Billionaire John D. MacArthur, of Singer Island, Florida, has everything but a high school diploma and college degree. He owns all the stock in the Bankers Life and Casualty Co. While selling insurance in Chicago, he came up with the idea of monthly insurance premiums. For \$2500 he bought a bankrupt company and put his idea into practice.

37. AUTOMOTIVE

John Koons, of Falls Church, Virginia, became a millionaire with Ford dealerships. As a youngster, he broke his neck in four places while swimming and has been paralyzed on one side ever since. He went into business with only \$350.

38. MAIL DELIVERY

Multimillionaire Peter Olsen could hardly speak English when he arrived 15 years ago from Germany. Today he owns the National Postal Service, a large distributor of third-class mail for businesses. Starting as a bellhop, he used his money to organize a weekly shopper newspaper business.

39. MOVIE INDUSTRY

Kirk Kerkorian, worth \$100 million, is a majority stockholder in MGM. He was kicked out of school in the eighth grade and worked as a newsboy, prize fighter, bouncer, and pinsetter. After the war he sold surplus aircraft and gained control of Western Airlines.

40. REAL ESTATE

Leonard Santini, a multimillionaire from Ft. Myers Beach, Florida, started by borrowing money to buy a mule, plow, and eight acres. He planted peppers and potatoes, used the profit to buy more acres, and kept expanding. In 1902 he could have bought all of Miami Beach for \$500. His interests in motels and shopping centers are worth \$10 million.

41. AUTOMOTIVE

Tex Collins, a millionaire from Sun Valley, California, turned a \$24,000 investment in 80 acres of Palm Beach into \$850,000. His auto parts firm does \$1 million a year. He began as a rodeo rider, stunt man, horse breeder, and drag racer.

42. RESTAURANTS

Jesus Monroy, a Mexican immigrant now living in Los Banos, California, owns a chain of 30 restaurants. Starting as a dishwasher, he is now a self-made multimillionaire. From dishwasher in a restaurant, he became manager and then owner. It took him eight years to acquire the 30 restaurants of the Fosters-West chain.

43. FOOD SERVICE

Maurice Warshaw, a multimillionaire from Salt Lake City, started re-selling junk. He set up a produce route delivering door-to-door, and then built a store. His capital was \$62. Today his Grand Central Stores consist of 17 stores grossing \$85 million a year.

44. BUILDER

Roy Speer, worth \$10 million, owns 21 companies that employ 620 people and gross \$25 million a year. He started as a shoeshine boy, earned a degree, and borrowed \$20,000 to organize a land-development company. In Florida he has built 4,000 homes, apartments, and condominiums.

45. MOBILE HOMES

Don Tidwell, a multimillionaire in Arizona, worked for a mobile home builder and then started his own company. After selling his shares for \$2.5 million, he started another firm which is worth \$20 million today. As a youngster, he lived over a chicken coop and picked cotton.

46. AUTOMOTIVE

Andy Granatelli, of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, has made millions from five automotive and promotional companies. As chief executive of STP Corp., he increased annual sales from \$6 million to \$120 million. He started by opening an auto service station. During the Depression he almost starved.

47. BUSINESS

Luther White is president of D&H Tire Service in Kansas City. It is one of the 100 largest black-owned and operated businesses in the U.S. Seventeen years ago he left Minden, Louisiana with only \$1.18 in his pocket. He started by learning how to change tires, and then became manager. He set up his own tire service company and today it employs 49 people and grosses \$2.1 million per year. He's worth \$3.5 million.

48. IMPORTING

Korean Chris Kim turned a business selling false eyelashes from Korea into a \$15 million-a-year cosmetics business. Working his way through college, he quit a secure job as comptroller-treasurer of a pharmaceutical firm. In the first six months after starting his own business, he sold a million pairs of lashes. His luxurious estate is in Washington, D.C.

49. CARNIVAL

Allen and Irvin Deggeler, worth over \$4 million, owns the largest carnival amusement ride company in the U.S. - Deggeler Amusement Co. Quitting school at 14, they worked in a carnival before buying a secondhand Roll-O-Plane. Making the rounds with it at various carnivals, they used the profit to buy kiddie rides and expand. Today they have 100 truckloads of fun.

50. INVENTIONS

Howard Arneson, a San Francisco basement inventor, runs a business that grosses \$6.5 million a year. He started by inventing a device to clean swimming pools, and used the money to form a company. His profit in sale of the company was \$7.3 million. Jack Ryan, of Bel Air, California, made his million by inventing toys - the Barbie Doll, model racers, children radios, etc. He sells his toy inventions to the Mattel Co.

51. CONSTRUCTION

Thomas J. Origer, a multimillionaire civil engineer from Chicago, started building row houses in 1961. After building 40, he was a millionaire. Today he is worth \$10 million and recently purchased Chicago's team franchise in the new World Football League. In 1959 he had lost everything in the cement business.

52. FENCE MANUFACTURING

Benito Fernandez, a product of New York's Spanish Harlem, owns a \$4 million corporation - Typhoon Industries - that manufactures fence. Being an immigrant from Puerto Rico and unable to speak English, he had to spend seven years getting his accounting degree from Queen's College. During college, he built a home himself and sold it at a profit. Today his company has assets of \$100 million. He lives in a mansion on Long Island.

53. PAINT

Smith Johnson, a millionaire from Pauling, N.Y., is president of a rubber company. He invented the modern steel paint pail, making it possible to stack paint cans on top of one another during shipment. His company began manufacturing the pail and he received royalties on 80 million. He added to his success by patenting 16 more ideas.

54. SCRAP METAL

Alton Scott Newell, a multimillionaire from Terrell Hills, Texas, heads scrap metal processing and machine manufacturing companies with assets of \$7 million. From a low-paying job in an auto wrecking yard, he opened his own yard with \$100. He began designing and building giant shredders and balers to handle the scrap. Today his companies have annual sales of \$14 million.

55. HOTELS

Benny Binion framed his first million and displays it in his Las Vegas hotel, the Horseshoe Club. Having no schooling, he went to work with dice at age 20. Today he has the largest hotel-casino in Las Vegas.

56. AUTO DEALERSHIPS

Charles Schmitt, a millionaire who sells \$15 million worth of new and antique autos every year, has dealerships in Beverly Hills and St. Louis. He started by washing cars, and then rented a stall to set up his own business of washing and waxing cars. The business expanded into antique cars and got the St. Louis Rolls Royce agency. The next year he sold 77 pre-owned Rolls Royces.

57. AUTO LEASING

Barry Lipin is stone deaf. Yet, he is a successful auto leaser with an annual business over \$2 million. Learning to lip-read, he and his brother started the U.S. Auto Leasing Co., which leases 900 cars a year.

58. DRIVE-IN RESTAURANT

Frank Gordy flunked out of Georgia Tech. Today he earns \$3.5 million a year selling hot dogs and hamburgers in his drive-in restaurant across from the university. The Varsity Inn is the largest drive-in in the world, serving 15,000 people a day. A car-hop can earn \$12,000 a year. It all started with a hot dog stand where students could eat cheaply.

59. OIL

Louis Roussel, worth \$200 million, started by buying land leases and then selling them to oil companies at a profit. He invented and patented a device for offshore oil rigs, and continued to expand. Today he owns a bank, a newspaper, three insurance companies, real estate, and office buildings. At age 31, he was a streetcar conductor in New Orleans.

60. BUSINESS

Charles H. Percy, millionaire U.S. senator, started by selling magazines. In college he provided food and laundry services for 15 fraternities, grossing \$150,000 a year. At the Bell and Howell Camera Co. he eliminated people through the use of form letters. His ideas earned him the presidency of Bell & Howell. Sales rose from \$5 million to \$160 million.

61. WELDING EQUIPMENT

James Donovan, a millionaire from Denver, controls eight companies worth \$6 million. He began as a farm hand, barber, dishwasher, carpenter, auto mechanic, and encyclopedia salesman. Then, he developed a soldering iron that worked off a battery. Within 10 years he had a busy factory making welding equipment.

62. WHOLESALE

Isadore Hecht, a multimillionaire from Star Island, Miami, Fla., built and sold the West Indies Fruit Co. It is America's third largest importer of bananas. He then bought a Miami dog-racing track and made it a multimillion-dollar-a-year business. He started by buying fruit from farmers and bringing his wagon into Jacksonville, Florida.

63. INVESTING

Peter Traynor, worth \$6 million at age 34, heads Leverage Funding Systems, a Los Angeles corporation that invests money for 1500 physicians. He started by selling secondhand clothing, mowing lawns, and landscaping. He sold \$3 million worth of insurance the first year for Penn Mutual. The third year he wrote \$12 million. Setting up his own investment company, he made profits of over \$2 million last year. Today he lives in the Trousdale Estates near Hollywood.

64. BUSINESS

Bernard McDonough, from Parkersburg, West Virginia, is worth \$62.5 million. He owns a shovel factory, cement plant, and a New York shoe complex. He began by working for a tool-manufacturing firm in Parkersburg. Thirty-five years later he bought all the stock for \$3 million. Today he works out of a small office behind a shoe store.

65. ELECTRONICS

Milton J. Shapp, governor of Pennsylvania, is worth \$3 million. He began by driving a coal truck, and working in a small radio parts factory. He became a draftsman, salesman, and sales manager, and then invented a television booster and master community antenna. With only \$450, he started the Jerrold Corp. Eventually it employed 2100 people and had annual sales of \$50 million.

66. GASOLINE STATIONS

Tom Turner is president and board chairman of Sigmor Corp., the largest non-refinery gasoline retailer in America. He's worth \$45 million and lives in Texas. His 436 service stations span the length and width of Texas. He began as a night attendant at a service station, and then borrowed to lease a station. His profits were used to buy other stations. At one time he couldn't afford a coat and stuffed a newspaper into his sweat shirt to break the blowing wind.

67. INVESTING

Gregory McKay, an immigrant from Holland, is worth \$8 million at age 31. Living in a mansion in Bel Air, Calif., he became a millionaire at a very young age. He started by investing small amounts in oil and cattle stock, and the Equity Funding Corp. He founded Innovest, Inc. in 1964 and in four years was a millionaire. He now owns McKay Industries, the parent company for nine subsidiaries doing \$100 million a year.

68. TEXTILES

Sidney Stern, worth \$8 million, heads his own fabric company in Los Angeles. He started in the stockroom and then sales. He opened a fabric outlet in New York and a manufacturing plant in Switzerland. At age 36 he sold them for \$3 million. He still works every day at his Stern Fabric and Lace Co. As a youngster, he dropped out of school in the ninth grade to help his poor parents.

69. BANKING

Hoke Maroon, of Miami, Florida, has controlling interest in a six-bank chain known as Floriday Commercial Banks, Inc. With only a fifth grade education, he started at the bottom as an errand boy at a bank. He was promoted to teller, bookkeeper, and cashier. Put in charge of a small loan business, he expanded to 12 offices. He made \$1 million profit when the company was sold. Today he runs a bank in Vero Beach, Florida and is a multimillionaire.

70. MACHINERY

Vern Schield, a multimillionaire from Iowa, founded the Schield-Bantam Co. to produce small, truck-mounted power cranes and excavators. He had designed a truck-mounted shovel crane out of a Model A Ford and manure spreader. The company was sold for \$4 million. His ideas for labor-saving devices came while he worked mining lime.

71. FAST-FOOD FRANCHISE

Charles Giragosian, a multimillionaire from Coral Springs, Florida, owns Chicken Unlimited, a fast-food franchise operating 200 stores in six states. He put himself through college by working as an usher in a theater, and then became manager. Starting his own business making pancake syrup, he lost out to bigger companies. Next, his hot dog stand failed. But the ice cream parlor succeeded. His profits went into building apartments, and then he started selling fried chicken. Today he's worth \$5 million.

72. RACE TRACK

Jerry Collins, a multimillionaire from Florida, owns eight race tracks and three circuses. He bought a bankrupt dog-racing track for \$5,000 and grossed \$1.8 million the first year. His eight tracks have grossed \$1 billion since he has owned them. When the Clyde Beatty-Cole Circus went broke, he bought it and made it profitable.

73. CERAMICS PRODUCTS

Stanley Preebe, from Parma Heights, Ohio, is worth \$5 million. S. J. Preebe and Associates is a nationwide leader in sales of heat refractory products used to line industrial furnaces. He began by selling magazines and newspapers. Both of his parents died while he was in high school. He worked in a foundry to put himself through college. It was while selling refractory products that he decided to start his own sales company. After three years of business loss and open-heart surgery, he knew it would be a struggle. Eventually, sales increased and tripled. He was soon a millionaire.

74. BUILDER

Roxie Gian, a multimillionaire building contractor from Hallandale, Florida, owns land, department stores, supermarkets, and racehorses. He's worth \$60 million. He quit school and worked free as an apprentice stonemason. Putting an ad in the paper for repair service, he did any kind of work including plastering, laying sidewalks, etc. He finally landed a big remodeling job in Buffalo, and then Loblaws hired him to build supermarkets. He pioneered in developing shopping plazas, having the ability to discover prime areas.

75. FOOD INDUSTRY

Lee Bickmore, chairman of Nabisco, has a personal fortune in the multimillions. He started by unloading freight cars and sweeping out offices at Nabisco. Then he became a salesman, division manager, and president. His father raised nine children on a farm and there was no money for college. He worked his way through by helping at a five-and-dime store. Today a chauffeur picks him up at his Short Hills, N.J. home.

76. BEAUTY PARLOR

Larry Mathews, a multimillionaire from New York, built a chain of beauty salons and barber shops, and sold them for \$25 million. He still owns 57 beauty salons, six beauty schools, four men's styling shops and several firms that market his line of beauty aids. He started by completing a beauty-culture course under the GI Bill. With only \$290 he started his first salon. He hit on the idea of being open 24 hours a day and it caught on like wildfire. Today he charges \$1500 for a hairdo. As a kid, he stood in the free milk line at school.

77. CAMPER TRAILERS

Eugene Vesely, of Lapeer, Michigan, is president of the Vesely Co., the world's largest manufacturer of camper trailers. His first endeavor in starting a construction company failed, but he eventually got the contract to build a school. Going into the camper business came about when he planned a trip to Alaska. He invested \$20,000 in plans and materials in building a trailer and did not want to lose the money. So, he went into the camper business full scale. Today he's a multimillionaire.

78. ADVERTISING

Donald Burr, chairman of the board of Brandwynne Advertising Agency, is a millionaire. He started by working for Hazel Bishop and Yardley of London. He took Yardley into the teenage cosmetics industry and sales for the company increased fivefold. At age 13 he learned to earn money by playing his trombone in a band.

79. RESTAURANTS

Carl Hoppi, a Bavarian immigrant at age 19, arrived in America with \$15 to his name. Today he is a multimillionaire with a chain of six restaurants and 335 food concessions on Long Island. He started as a blacksmith's helper, then bartender. He leased a hot dog stand and worked a second job as a waiter. A dining room was added to the stand and he continued to expand.

80. BANKING

Milton Grant, a multimillionaire black man from Los Angeles, is board chairman and chief stockholder of Family Savings and Loan Association. He started with a second-hand garbage truck and a third-grade education. He shined shoes and worked as a dishwasher and cook. He bought a hog farm and fed his stock the garbage he collected. His profits went into real estate and a savings and loan business.

81. REAL ESTATE

Carl Baldwin, a millionaire from Piedmont, California, had six painful operations on his clubbed feet, was poor as a child, and had only a grade school education. Today he owns land all over California. He started as a Western Union messenger boy and then sold real estate. His profits went into recreational land in California and Oregon. He still uses crutches occasionally.

82. INVENTIONS

Tony Fox, a second-grade dropout, orphan, and ex-convict, is a multimillionaire and owner of a business that markets a rubbish compactor. He started by pumping gas, and bought war-surplus spotlights and rented them to supermarkets for grand openings. His first invention was an unusual saw, the patent of which he sold. Then, a miniature snowmobile, which he sold to Studebaker for \$5 million. He founded the Pollution Packer Co. which grosses millions. His lavish home is in Bloomington, Minnesota.

83. LOCKSMITH

Marvin Oates, worth \$10 million, built a firm named Buzz Oates Enterprises. At age 12 he worked for a locksmith and soon started his own little shop in a garage. He bought a building and expanded into furniture, carpeting, and appliances. Today the firm grosses \$3.5 million.

84. FROZEN FOODS

Edward J. Piszek is sole owner of Mrs. Paul's Kitchens, Inc., doing \$60 million a year. It is a leading packager of frozen seafood and consists of five plants and 1400 employees. He started in a restaurant and found himself loaded with an overstock of seafood. He froze it and discovered that it still tasted great. His frozen food business was started with only \$450. Profit was \$10,000 the first year. Today his business is still going strong and he resides outside Philadelphia.

85. FARM MACHINERY

Byron Godberson owns Midwest Industries of Ida Grove, Iowa. It manufactures farm machinery and boating equipment. Sales are \$10 million a year. He started on the farm driving tractor, and invented a hydraulic lift to empty farm wagons. A new plant was built to produce a farm wagon, and eventually marine equipment and boat trailers. At 47 he is a multimillionaire.

86. CLOTHING

Murray Rosen, who owns a 10-store chain of women's discount stores plus two shopping centers, dropped out of grade school as a youngster. He worked as a cutter in the garment district of Manhattan, and then bought a concession stand where he sold dresses. He kept on expanding and today is a multimillionaire in Miami Beach, Florida.

87. STEEL INDUSTRY

Henry Walter, a millionaire steel executive from Chicago, started as a delivery boy and bookkeeping clerk. He worked his way up to president of the Gerrard Steel Strapping Co., which was later sold to U.S. Steel. Born in a ghetto shanty in Chicago, he studied and worked his way to financial success.

88. FOOD CHAIN

Thomas P. Raley, owner of a 34-store grocery-drug chain, is a multimillionaire. He started by working his way up from night receiving clerk to district manager of a national grocery chain. He convinced a property owner to put up a building to serve as his store. His profits were used to build other stores. He is now sole owner of Raley's, Inc., headquartered in Sacramento, California. The chain grosses \$75 million a year. As one of 14 children of a poor farmer-preacher, he spent many hours plowing behind a mule.

89. DISCOUNT STORES

D.J. Witherspoon, a multimillionaire from Omaha, Nebraska, heads a discount store empire covering 11 states and employing 3,000 people. He is worth \$100 million. As one of 16 children in a dirt-poor family, he picked cotton from sunup to sunset. Working as a janitor while he attended college, he decided to start a company to do rack-jobbing; stocking shelves in supermarkets with discount health and beauty aids. He decided to open his own discount store and four years later had 45 stores. Today his company, Pamida, Inc., operates 160 Gibson discount stores.

90. APPAREL INDUSTRY

Ralph Panico, of Sherman Oaks, Calif., runs a dressmaking business that made him a multimillionaire in five years. His first venture was the seed business which failed. His business of packaging vegetables in cellophane failed also, as did a dressmaking business and mail-order business. His dress-manufacturing firm was destroyed by fire in 1969 so he started over and finally made it big. However, he lost his eyesight shortly thereafter.

91. BAKERY

Louis Mene, worth \$2 million, could not speak a word of English when he arrived as a 17-year old immigrant. He started by cleaning the stables and horses that pulled the bakery wagons. Later, he became a delivery driver and then bought a failing bakery. Today the bakery grosses \$600,000 a year. Recently it was sold for \$1 million.

92. DANCE STUDIOS

Allan Bergandahl, having only a eighth grade education, returned from Korea flat broke in 1955. Today he and his wife are multimillionaires and own 32 Gloria Marshall Figure Control Salons providing \$5 million annual income. He started as a dance instructor and then supervisor. He reopened a closed dance studio but the owner took it back. Then, he and his wife rented space and set up their first figure salon. Profits were used for expansion. Residing in Lakewood, Calif., the Bergandahl's are worth \$3 million.

93. AUCTIONEERING

Fred Clark, a multimillionaire from Sunland, Calif., is worth \$3 million. Every day at his auction galleries he deals with the wealthy stars of Hollywood. He started by selling sand to gardeners and nurseries. He hauled and sold excess shipyard lumber and then went into contracting and building. His surplus building supply business was sold and he opened Pasadena Auction Galleries. The millions he has made are invested in real estate.

94. SEAFOODS

Henry Singleton, known as "The Shrimp King", grosses \$25 million a year from his processed seafoods business. He is the world's largest processor of shrimp, shipping vacuum-packed shrimp cocktails, breaded oysters and stuffed fish across America in his own refrigerated trucks, and around the world in his fleet of ships. He started by chopping off heads of shrimp for a fish market. After being a seaman on a freighter, he bought a boat and entered the shrimp business. He bought more boats, then sold them and began processing shrimp. Four times he mortgaged the Singleton Co. to the hilt to expand. Today he has 1,000 employees.

95. CONSTRUCTION

Alex G. Spanos is sole owner of A.G. Spanos Enterprises, a group of five construction firms in Stockton, Calif., grossing \$45 million a year. His first business was selling homemade sandwiches to cannery workers, ranch hands, and laborers. He became a labor contractor hiring Mexican farm workers and shipping 6,000 men a day. It made him a millionaire. Soon he was constructing office and apartment buildings and shopping centers. It all started with an \$800 bank loan.

96. AUTOMOTIVE

Jim O'Donnell, president of the Stutz Motor Car of America Co., manufactures America's highest priced automobile - the \$32,000 Stutz. He worked his way through college to become an accountant. He then worked for an office machine manufacturer and became a money broker - one who negotiates terms of a loan between borrower and finance company. He then started the Pres-to-Line Corp., which manufactured accessories for typewriters and computers. It boomed and he expanded into investment banking. He then bought out a bankrupt auto firm and began making the Stutz car. As a youngster, he carried buckets of water to railroad workers.

97. CITRUS INDUSTRY

Santo Consiglio, of New York, owns \$2.5 million worth of stock in Tropicana Products, Inc. The company was formed to pack citrus fruit sections in gallon jars for hotels and restaurants. It added orange juice and today grosses \$90 million a year. Consiglio started as a delivery boy for a small grocery.

98. FISHING WORMS

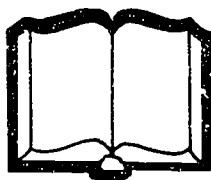
Fred Rhyme sells 250 million worms a year and makes \$600,000 doing it. His business, Rainbow Mealworms of Compton, Calif., ships worms live all over the world at a price of \$2.50 per thousand. It has made him a millionaire. His customers are pet shops, fish-bait stores, zoos, and university research stations. He got the idea from a friend who reared mealworms in his garage as a hobby. He rented a building and started breeding worms. Today his firm has 150 million worms in the hatching stage and 20 million ready for shipment.

99. INSURANCE

Arthur G. Gaston, a multimillionaire black man from Birmingham, Alabama, owns a bank, apartment houses, motel, and an insurance company. His success began when he became aware of the custom of Negroes to collect money from workers at payday in order to bury other Negroes. Solicitors had long lists of names and made a racket of it. He set up the Booker T. Washington Burial Society and began selling policies door-to-door. He promised the client a \$100 burial. Today the Booker T. Washington Insurance Co. has \$100 million in assets. Worth \$8 million himself, Gaston had dropped out of school as a youngster in the tenth grade.

100. MUSIC STORES

Clyde Wallich, of Enrico, Calif., is head of the Wallich Music City Corp., valued at \$10 million and having nine stores. His holdings are worth \$2 million. As a 23-year old, he bought a small record shop and converted it into an electronics firm. He then bought 50% of the "Music City" record store and began displaying records out where customers could browse and touch. Sales climbed from \$100,000 to \$2 million. He kept reinvesting his profits and soon was a millionaire. Today his music store chain has 290 employees.
