THE NATIONAL MANPOWER INSTITUTE

The National Manpower Institute is a private, nonprofit institution that believes that full development and use of human potential requires the development of integrated education, manpower, and economic policies that will break down the time traps of youth for education, adulthood for work, and retirement for obsolescence.

THE CENTER FOR EDUCATION AND WORK
