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ABSTRACT

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## INTRODUCTION

Guide to Resource Organizations for Minority Language Groups is a collection of profiles of 242 organizations which serve as resources for the bilingual education community. The organizations included span a wide variety of purposes and language groups, and run the gamut from major national associations to locally significant, community-based groups.

The first compilation of this material undertaken by the National Clearinghouse for Bilingual Education (NCBE) resulted in the Guide to Professional Organizations, published in 1979. To obtain the information, NCBE staff asked bilingual education administrators, supervisors, and teachers to identify organizations which serve as resources and contribute to the education of minority language speakers. The organizations were then contacted for detailed information. For this edition, the original organizations, as well as a substantial number of other organizations which have been brought to our attention, were contacted for information.

Each entry listed includes the name of the organization, the address, phone number, director, contact person, and any of the following information that is available: sponsoring agencies, date of origin, purpose, membership information, parent organization, special divisions or committees, geographical service areas, funding sources, publications, conferences, former name, target languages, and target cultural groups. In addition, keywords were assigned from the Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors, eighth edition (1980).

The entries appear in numerical order by NCBE accession number (e.g., RS0001, RS0002, RS0003). On pages ix-xvi, there is an alphabetical listing of the resource organizations included in this volume. Access to the entries is also facilitated by indexes to languages, location, subjects, and target cultural groups. The alphabetical list of resources and the indexes refer the reader to the appropriate accession number.

To further assist the reader, there are three appendixes at the end of this book: Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) Clearinghouses, National Origin Desegregation Assistance Centers (NODACs), and Title VII Bilingual Education Support Centers.

The information that appears in this publication is paralleled by a detailed record in NCBE's database. Periodic updates will be made with regular revisions of this document.

For more specific information on any resource organization, please contact the organization, not the Clearinghouse.

The Clearinghouse gratefully acknowledges the efforts of all those who collaborated in this project. Readers are invited to submit additions and suggestions for future editions of this publication.
