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ABSTRACT

Over 200 print and audiovisual materials which promote understanding of the importance of agriculture are described in this resource guide for teachers. Items which have been developed specifically for classroom use are described in addition to a large number of general informational materials which could be adapted according to classroom needs. Materials are presented in four sections: print, audiovisuals and kits, collections of materials, and resource guides. Each entry provides the title, publisher/producer, grade level, format, description of the contents, agricultural concepts taught, price, and ordering information. An index is provided which lists all materials according to the following agricultural concepts: (1) agriculture and history; (2) the geography of agriculture; (3) agriculture and technology; (4) the economics of agriculture; (5) agriculture and the world; (6) careers; and (7) major policy issues. Introduction

Agriculture is important to all of us. It affects us directly because it provides us with food, clothing, and shelter. Indirectly, it makes a major contribution to the economy of our Nation and to international trade. But because most of us today live in cities or suburban areas, we rarely understand how important agriculture is.

Farm representatives and educators asked the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to help with this problem, and this *Resource Guide to Educational Materials About Agriculture* is designed to do just that. The *Guide* was developed with the help of a task force consisting of representatives from farm organizations, commodity groups, farm women's organizations, State departments of agriculture, and education.

To develop this guide, we contacted more than 200 organizations and publishers. We asked them what materials they were producing that would help regular classroom teachers, grades K—12, incorporate more information about agriculture into their teaching. The materials we learned about are described in this *Guide*.

Some of these materials have been developed specifically for classroom use. A larger percentage, however, are general informational materials that teachers can use as sources to create their own materials or activities that will fit the needs of their own classrooms. The *Guide* is divided into four sections: print, audiovisuals and kits, collections, and resource guides. Within each section we have given information about individual teaching materials of that type. Each item lists the title, publisher/producer, grade level, format (booklet or film, for example), a description of the contents, the agricultural concepts it teaches, price, and ordering information. Except for some editing to conserve space or for consistency, the information is exactly as provided by the producer.

The agricultural concepts given in each listing will help teachers identify what subject matter and major ideas each title in the *Resource Guide* can help them teach. These concepts are:

1. **Agriculture and history.** Agriculture issues or events as major influences in human history, from making possible the first settled societies to current world food issues.
2. **The geography of agriculture.** What grows where and why.
3. **Agriculture and technology.** How technology and specialization have changed American agriculture in the last 100 years.
4. **The economics of agriculture.** How the agriculture sector works and the relationship of U.S.

agriculture to the rest of the economy. Effects of supply and demand, how prices are set, changing interactions of the factors of production, farming as a business, agribusiness.

5. **Agriculture and the world.** World food population and distribution and its relationship to American agriculture.
6. **Careers.** Careers now and in the future.
7. **Major policy issues.** Land use, conservation, chemicals, government interaction with agriculture, world food supplies for the future, other issues.

For easy reference, all materials in the *Guide* are listed according to the concepts they cover in a special section at the end of this publication.

Teaching materials included in the *Guide* are those that are primarily about agriculture and related issues. Materials that are largely concerned with nutrition, food preparation (recipes), promotional information, or buying advice on food and fiber are not included because many other resource guides already list such materials. Beyond determining that the teaching materials fit this subject-matter criteria, we have not attempted to evaluate them. Inclusion in this *Guide* does not mean endorsement by USDA. Our purpose in creating the *Guide* is to assemble information on a wide selection of materials so that teachers can decide for themselves what will be useful in their classrooms.

We plan to update this *Resource Guide* annually. We will appreciate your suggestions on materials to be included in future editions.
