ABSTRACT

Provided is a list of associations and committees of or for women in science, engineering, mathematics, and medicine. The list is organized by discipline, with cross-referencing to cognate specialties. The disciplines include: anthropology; astronomy; atmospheric sciences; biology; chemistry; computer sciences; earth sciences; energy; engineering; history of science and technology; linguistics and speech; mathematics and statistics; medicine and health; physics; psychology and psychiatry; science; and social sciences. Geology and geography entries are listed under earth sciences, meteorology under atmospheric science, and science education under biology, mathematics, and physics. Each entry includes address, telephone number, contact person, the year founded, and (when applicable) information on dues, membership, chapters, publications, services, current activities, and future plans. An index of association, committee, and caucus names is included, with separate lists for women's committees and caucuses of scientific societies and for associations of, and for women in science. They should be included in mailings for that reason.

Lists such as this remain up to date for relatively short periods of time. Users are encouraged to set up their own "network" to keep the information current.

An index of association, committee, and caucus names can be found at the end of the list.
