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ABSTRACT

This directory of women in vocational education administration is divided into three major sections. The first--"Careers, Concerns, and Challenges"--provides insights and personal perspectives on administration written by eight outstanding women in vocational education administration. These eight represent the general administrative positions of State Director of Vocational Education (or equivalent), Teacher Educator, Large City Director, Head of State Association in American Vocational Association, Dean of Community College, Administrator of Local Vocational-Technical School, and National Leader. The second section presents 359 women, nationwide, working in a range of administrative positions within vocational education. The alphabetical individual profiles provide this information: name, address, and telephone number; highest academic degree; years of experience; current and previous positions; largest staff and budget supervised; leadership positions; major achievement; area of expertise; and consulting skills. Cross references correlate women administrators with areas of expertise and consulting skills. State rosters list them alphabetically by states, also in alphabetical order. This presentation design (individual profiles, cross references, and state rosters) enables the directory user to identify potential job candidates, consultants, etc., both in terms of capability and geography. The appendix includes various communiques and forms used to identify these women. (KC)

PROJECT SUMMARY

The "Promoting Women in Vocational Administration--In the New Information Society" project was designed to produce and disseminate a computerized directory of women, across the United States, active in vocational education administration. This directory, sponsored by the Women's Educational Equity Act Program of the U.S. Department of Education and the American Vocational Association, contains detailed profiles of women in leadership positions within the various administrative arenas of program planning, budgeting and finance, management and supervision, operations and facilities and others. This directory also includes a series of feature articles by women within vocational education administration who are in exemplary decision-making positions around the country.

Dr. Roni D. Posner, AVA Assistant Executive Director for Professional Development, served as the Project Director. Dr. Diane R. Halbrook served as the Project Coordinator. They worked with an Advisory Council representing the various fields of vocational education administration. The Council developed the criteria by which the women administrators were selected, planned the format of the directory, reviewed the nominations and selected the featured authors. The Council also evaluated the successfulness of the effort.

The Women's Educational Equity Act (WEEA) was enacted in 1974 to promote educational equity for women through a program of discretionary grants and contracts. The Act was reauthorized and substantially revised by the Education Amendments of 1978 and is recodified as Title IX, Part C of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. The reauthorized Act includes a new purpose, to provide financial assistance to enable educational agencies and institutions to meet the requirements of Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972. This program is administered through the U.S. Department of Education.

The American Vocational Association is a national professional organization committed to the development and promotion of comprehensive programs of vocational education. The strength of the AVA depends upon a diverse membership composed of vocational teachers, administrators, teacher educators, researchers, and guidance counselors. The AVA works closely with state departments of education and is the major nongovernmental agency helping to implement the Federal Vocational Education Act.

While this Directory certainly does not include all women in vocational administration, it is an excellent first attempt by this profession to highlight a significant number of truly outstanding individuals. In fact, some Directory users might be surprised—perhaps even shocked—to realize the level and extent of expertise and influence wielded by women across this country in vocational education.

But most importantly, this Directory represents a beginning for AVA. Our intention now is to press forward to obtain the resources to maintain the momentum—to take certain, necessary next steps in providing further services to women (and men) in vocational education. Now that certain extraordinary strengths have been identified, we hope to initiate a Leadership Seminar for women—perhaps to evolve into an annual event. Undergraduate study in Vocational Home Economics Education was exciting and challenging. There was so much to learn, teaching was a respected profession and I was idealistic, eager to become a professional and energetic enough to work at it day and night, if necessary! Personal circumstances had taught me that one is limited only by one's self, not external influences. It was a valuable lesson that has served me well. I chose a major which was important to me.

Mine was a strong teacher education program. It was here I first learned about "Vocational Education," school structure and funding patterns, and developed a beginning philosophy about the role of Vocational Education as a vital segment of the public educational system. That, including a strong belief in homemaking as a vocation, has remained the basis for my philosophy of education which has grown through the years.

Typically, graduation appeared to "complete" my education. Teaching experience, mentoring by my colleagues and an endless curiosity led me to pursue graduate study, first a M. Ed. in Vocational Home Economics Education and later a Ph.D. in administration in Vocational Education. Each program provided new experiences, understandings and skills. Each position required different roles. One's career develops through education, maturation and situation! Research, administration and leadership became more important and new goals focused in these directions.

Currently, as the chair of a comprehensive unit of Vocational Education, I have had the opportunity to pursue those--and other--directions. Four factors in my background have served me well. One has been research skills which have been utilized to make contributions to the field, to solve problems, to improve programs and to provide data for accountability. Another has been professional education skills of planning, delivering instruction/service and evaluation all based on sound learning theory and utilizing a range of teaching strategies and facilities. The third has been management skills applied to administrative responsibilities--getting what is needed from the various human and material resources at hand. And lastly is the ability to nurture. Nurturing is sometimes viewed as a feminine trait, sometimes as a segment of Home Economics knowledge and skills. In any instance, it is an act which is necessary in order to facilitate excellence in others. When performance, quality, and participatory decision-making lie in the hands of those one "administers," it seems more appropriate to nurture than to direct! Only as one can help to develop others to surpass one's own achievements can one contribute to the future.

The major concerns I have for Vocational Teacher Education are interrelated. In the past few years there has been a barrage of studies, examinations and opinions of public education and teachers. The press has repeated the attacks with enthusiasm and interpreted some evidences beyond appropriate conclusions. This coupled with dwindling numbers of students and a depressed economy creates a difficult situation for development, perhaps even survival. It brings forth several particular concerns about areas such as:

- The viability of comprehensive educational systems with Vocational Education as an integral part of the secondary, post-secondary and adult segments of public education.
- The dichotomous relationship of Vocational Education and business and industry where, on one hand, vocational programs seek and receive extensive input for programming as well as support from the private sector while attacks continue to come from others in business/industry concerning the quality of, or even the need for, vocational programs.

Solutions are always more difficult than concerns! However, there are several actions which appear necessary. First, more vocational educators must become more involved in the public and professional debates. Too often there has been response to others' discussions and conclusions rather than participation in the process. A more assertive stance should be taken including extensive, thoughtful and data-based public information efforts. There should be philosophical discussions invited by vocational educators in order to examine some real differences which create other kinds of problems.

Vocational Education is a "step ahead" in areas of equity, I believe. It appears we have moved beyond the elementary stages of trying to eliminate bias because of sex, race, handicap, disadvantage and have moved toward acceptance and support of the individual in whatever choice and development is desired and possible. I hope we can continue that development, bringing others in the educational community along and working through more complex issues in achieving equity. I would like to see us abandon notions of "old boys'" or "old girls'" networks and have, instead, vocational education networks that function without biases, focusing capacities upon solutions to problems and achievement of goals.

The future must hold closer ties between education and the social and economic community. Education is a part of a whole and can best attain excellence when it can function in a holistic context.

The role of women in that future is fundamental. We are now at a time when we can utilize our uniqueness. The educational situation today cries out for innovation, for creativity, for intelligent problem-solving and for high level of skill performances. Women today will help meet those needs.

Each human being in our society will be influenced by family, schools, teachers and the jobs they hold. Needs are endless--ongoing, changing only in focus and depth. There are no limits to what women in vocational education can do. Each must see that in no way are limits imposed on self or others. It is essential to remember the past to avoid "back sliding," to work for greater achievement in the future. But most of all we are, regardless of our background content areas, Vocational Educators. Let that be our banner and our cause as we continue to move to greater contributions consistent with our beliefs, our goals and our individual dreams.

Moving up the ladder of success can be a challenge: exciting and often frustrating, yet very rewarding, whether planned or unplanned. My experience was the latter.

Even though my career path to Executive Director of Career and Vocational Education did not evolve as the result of an earlier calculated plan, I, as an educator, had always maintained a specific philosophy which I refer to as the "5 P's" Philosophy, that is, Preparedness, Pride, Perseverance, Patience and Personal Conviction.

Being prepared, no matter what one's goal, is a position with which few can argue. My professional career began when I graduated from college with a B.S. degree in Business Education from Temple University. This, perhaps, was the only professional level I attained that was the result of a pre-determined goal--a calculated plan. Why calculated? Because as a high school student, I was advised by one of my teachers (who, I will always believe as I reflect back upon her, should never have been a teacher in the first place) that I should not aspire to become a Business Education teacher since (at that time) "the high schools are not hiring Negro teachers here (suburban Philadelphia) or in Philadelphia. Therefore, you will not be able to get a job teaching in a high school."

Perhaps that is when my 5 P's Philosophy was formulated. My pride was hurt. I was more determined than ever to become the best prepared teacher one could be. It was my personal conviction that I could be whatever I wanted to be, and be the best if I persevered, regardless of my color or sex. As a matter of fact, while I was quite aware that racial discrimination was a reality, I was completely naive to the problems of sex discrimination in the work place (and it certainly had never occurred to me that both could be at play at the same time in my case). Ultimately, I did become a teacher in Philadelphia.

Realizing that one must stay abreast if one is to be fully prepared, I became an active, contributing member of many professional organizations (a course of action which I strongly recommend for aspiring administrators) and continued my formal training by earning a masters degree in Business Education, Supervision and Administration.

In 1965, after ten years in the classroom and service in a supportive administrative role to the vice-principal for girls, I became a Supervisor of Business Education.

In 1970, I was offered an Education Personnel Development Act Fellowship to pursue a doctorate in vocational education at Rutgers University. Having only two days in which to make a decision, I accepted, and in 1974 graduated with an Ed.D. degree in Vocational Education Administration.

In 1974, I was invited to accept the position of Director of Vocational Education. In accepting, I became the first female Director of Vocational Education in the State of Pennsylvania and, as reported by the then U.S. Office of Education, the first in the country.

It was almost ten years again when, in 1983, the present Superintendent of Philadelphia public schools, Dr. Constance E. Clayton, invited me to accept the position of Executive Director, Career and Vocational Education for the School District, my current position.

I do not know what the next ten years will bring, but I do know that my present position is the most challenging and rewarding of my career because it gives me the opportunity to make a direct and lasting contribution to the stability of the economy in a world that is rapidly changing both in demographics and technology. Forecasts and projections leave no doubt that we, as today's vocational educators, have our work cut out for us.

The Industrial Age has given way to the Electronic Age. Our production-oriented economy is rapidly being transformed into a service-oriented economy, and nowhere is this more apparent than in the Northwestern Corridor and in our large cities where smokestack industries once predominated. Advancing technology is affecting every aspect of our life, especially in the medical, service-oriented and technically-produced product fields.

As an educational system, we must find a way to become more flexible and responsive to change. We must find a way to ensure that when students--youth and adults--enter vocational-technical education they have the requisite academic skills to pursue training. We encourage dropouts when we place students in programs that require reading, measuring, computing and analyzing, if those students do not have the academic "tools" with which to work. Those responsible for scheduling must cease thinking that vocational-technical education classes are for those who can't make it elsewhere. All students deserve the best and we must be held accountable for providing it.

We must prepare ourselves personally; take pride in what we do and market it; persevere and persist in our flexibility and receptivity to change; temper all this with reasonable patience. Live by a personal conviction that vocational-technical education is alive and well, ready and able to deliver services today, in the year 2000 and beyond. It's good to know that, in this day, how good or how successful you are does not depend on your color or your sex, but on the "5 P's" and a genuine desire to serve people.

Reflecting on one's career development is an interesting, yet awesome task. As Thomas Huxely said, "The most valuable result of all education is to make you do the thing you have to do, when it ought to be done, whether you like it or not. It is the first lesson that ought to be learned. And however early a person's training begins, it is probably the last lesson one learns thoroughly." This in essence is true of my personal career development.

First and foremost, my achievements have been the result of having a family that instilled in me values, standards, faith, work ethics and confidence. I was reared on a farm in rural south Georgia, a community which provided limited cultural, educational, and work opportunities. My educational endeavors required great discipline, diligence, determination and courage. Along the way I encountered what many would call obstacles; however, I viewed them as challenges.

My professional career began in my home community in Georgia where I taught elementary school, while I completed my B.S. degree. After completion of my B.S. Degree in Home Economics, I taught and was head of the high school vocational home economics education departments in Norcross and Newnan, Georgia, supervised student teachers, served as a local Future Homemakers of America Advisor and served as acting state FHA Advisor for the Georgia Association of the Future Homemakers of America.

The significance of my early professional endeavors were enhanced not only by mentors who were strong vocational home economics educators, but also by the historical beginnings of vocational education as a whole. The sponsors of the Smith-Hughes Vocational Education Act of 1917 and the George-Deen Amendments were all Georgia statesmen.

My M.S. Degree and work on a doctorate provided me with additional background in family economics, home management, household equipment, and home economics education, thus broadening my knowledge, skills and abilities.

Shortly after the enactment of the Vocational Education Amendments of 1963, I accepted the position of State Supervisor of Vocational Home Economics Education and Health Occupations at the postsecondary and adult levels in Georgia. This position also included responsibility for the administration of programs for the disadvantaged and handicapped. Developing and implementing vocational home economics education programs for full-time postsecondary students with varied backgrounds was both a challenging and fulfilling experience.

As a result of the diversity of my professional experiences at all educational levels, I was offered the opportunity to come to the U.S. Office of Education. After much soul searching and a great deal of reluctance, I accepted the position as Education Program Officer for Vocational Home Economics Education, U.S. Office (Department) of Education. In this position the opportunities and challenges have been unlimited, the "rewards" too numerous to mention.

From my view point at the Department of Education, I have seen many studies conducted on the status of education. Most of the studies of the American Education Reform have verified what a special Gallup poll in the 70's predicted-- "that public dissatisfaction with the quality of American education will probably continue to spread rapidly." Parents and community leaders have questioned whether or not the public schools of America were doing an effective job for our students. The concern voiced is for the entire public school to become more responsive and accountable for quality education resulting in positive changes with parents, students, community leaders and educators all equally involved.

The Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act of 1984 outlined very clearly the purposes of vocational home economics education. First and foremost, we must address our changing society with its cultural and economic needs, societal problems and technological changes affecting individuals, families and the labor force. For vocational home economics education to achieve quality and excellence, we must constantly be aware and respond to societal problems. We must recognize the changing realities of families, individuals, school life, community and the work force.

As administrators of vocational education, we must learn to be pro-active rather than reactive, with positive perception of our roles; to be innovative in ways which bring about satisfaction and excellence in our specific fields; demonstrate leadership abilities and qualities including enthusiasm, commitment and respect for the dignity and worth of every human being we are privileged to work; and demonstrate a willingness to listen and hear what persons of all ages and all ethnic groups, handicapped and disadvantaged, males and females, have to say in such a manner that they feel our sincerity.

Most of all, we should understand that there is little that is worth doing which can be done alone or in isolation. Communication among administrators as well as our peers is easy when we care enough to ask or listen. We have a great heritage in vocational education for which we all should be responsible and proud. Making vocational education a first class educational program rests upon those of us in administrative positions, whether the position be head of a high school department, a local administrator, head of a higher education institution, an executive director of a vocational student organization or professional organization, a State supervisor or consultant, a state director of vocational education, or whatever future administrative positions may be. We are the leaders and with us are many more followers. May we have the courage and wisdom to change as our nation and world change!

My career started with the Oklahoma State Department of Vocational-Technical Education working for the Future Farmers of America and later moving to the new Division of Technical Education. After serving in these two positions, I was employed as research associate in the Department of Vocational-Technical Education at Oklahoma State University and moved from there to the U.S. Office of Education, Division of Vocational and Technical Education as a program specialist. Following this assignment, I was employed by the American Vocational Association as Director of Field Services, after which I accepted the position of Director of the Washington, D.C. Office of the Technical Education Research Centers. Wanting to try something a little different, I founded my own management development and research company specializing in vocational-technical education and manpower training.

I spent nearly 20 years in Washington, D.C., returned to Oklahoma as a visiting professor at the University of Tulsa, and subsequently accepted a position at Oklahoma State University in the School of Occupational and Adult Education. Working there, I was sought out by Tulsa County Area Vocational-Technical School for the position of Director/Principal, which I accepted.

If you look at the number of positions I have held, it would appear that I can't hold a job! Seriously, I suppose the key element would be that those who have sought me out felt that my preparation and experience could contribute to the overall goals of the organization. Like anyone else, I have attempted to perform to the best of my ability in any position I have held. I am told that my strengths lie in having an in-depth knowledge of the field of vocational education, the ability to plan both short-range and long-range, the ability to organize and follow-up, the ability to analyze a great deal of information and draw implications for the field and an ability to work with people of various backgrounds and organizations.

On the whole, I have faced few career obstacles compared to many of my female colleagues in the field of vocational education. I believe that my initial work experience with the Oklahoma State Department of Vocational-Technical Education for the first several years of my career enabled me to establish a reputation for being a thoughtful, competent, dedicated professional.

I believe that the socialization process over the last couple of decades with respect to women entering the world of work has been positive. As a matter of fact, my very early professional career mentor was a male, and without his guidance and long-term support, I wonder where my career would have led.

Because of structural changes in the labor force, vocational educators must be more active in designing programs to meet the unique needs of the displaced workers. At the same time, we need to make certain that our programs for secondary students match the needs not only of the students but of industry, as well. This means, of course, that we have a gigantic problem in designing curriculum and equipping labs to serve contemporary needs of our students. I believe that we have to prepare our teachers and design our programs for more controlled open entry--open exit admission, thus increasing numbers of adults who will need retraining and upgrading. Obviously, financing of vocational education is a major concern. Equipping sophisticated labs and shops is an expensive proposition. Vocational education programs are unusually dynamic, and it is imperative that the most able and competent teachers be employed. We must constantly seek out ways to regenerate ideas and support experimental efforts to improve the quality of our programs. One of the problems that administrators must address is how to keep the walls of classrooms from closing in on teachers. Perhaps establishing exchange programs with industry personnel would help in this regard. Another major problem is that we are moving toward wholesale turnover in the top administrative positions in vocational education. It is extremely important that individuals who fill key leadership roles understand the historical evolution of vocational education so that decisions made with respect to its future will be well grounded.

In the future I would like to see vocational education programs lead to career ladders. Students need to know where each program will lead them and what their options and choices are. We need to consider more flexible scheduling; schools should be open 12 months a year, 24 hours a day. After all, we have millions of shift workers who cannot attend class during the normal school day. There is no justification in allowing schools to sit idle for the summer when millions of persons could profit from upgrading and retraining. We need to work very hard to establish a closer liaison with business and industry, insuring that the skills and abilities taught will enable our students to compete and perform well on the job. It seems to me that vocational education, more than any other field of education, is uniquely suited to assist this country in regenerating its economic base. We must teach our students to work smarter, not harder, and we must utilize the technology that exists to extend our capabilities. We must constantly be vigilant in working toward quality in all of our programs. Finally, we have a marvelous story to tell, but I don't believe we have been the best story tellers.

My advice to women entering or already involved in vocational education: Do your homework. Get involved in planning and policy-making. Read...Read... Read material that gives an extensive background in the field. You should establish and/or expand a professional network. Be resourceful, reliable, and be a self-starter. Don't be afraid to try new things.

Know and understand the letter of the law as well as the intent. Be an active member of AVA and make yourself available to serve on committees and hold various offices of your state and national associations. Expand your professional contacts to leaders both inside and outside of vocational education. Be willing to take on assignments that will challenge and extend your professional experience and ability. Keep your sense of humor. Be dependable. Spend some time rejuvenating yourself and save some time for your family and friends.

Have you ever been told that your palm shows that the lines identifying your life activities have all intersected with your fate line? For me, I question if that is the explanation of the chain which has linked together my varied jobs? Perhaps yes, perhaps no, but it does make me recall how often I've talked of fate guiding my career.

Like all young women in the early 1950s, I planned for marriage and a family; but not like all, I chose to prepare for security. That security preparation in a career compatible with managing a home and raising a family, was vocational home economics education.

After three years of teaching home economics in a rural community in northwestern Kansas and no prospect of marriage, I pursued a master's degree in guidance at Catholic University in Washington, DC.

Enter fate--my master's degree in hand, I interviewed for a career counseling position working with the mentally handicapped. The employer, however, wanted me not as a counselor, but as a home economics teacher responsible for reorganizing their consumer homemaking program to one in occupational food service. School was starting and jobs were not plentiful. I decided I could do anything for one year. Excitement took over; three years later, after tasting administration and program development, I was convinced I had a new love.

The early 1960s brought volunteer work in neighboring countries and I took advantage of the opportunity to learn Spanish and provide basic instruction in cooking and sewing to our Latin neighbors in Zacatecas, Mexico. Those three years gave me an appreciation of the culture and practice to be fluent in Spanish.

Enter fate--when ready to return to the States, a job was offered with the Kansas home economics supervisory staff with responsibility for a low income housing project. My experiences were varied. The project was moving well. I was learning about federal legislation, local district autonomy, program evaluation, and state legislatures.

Enter fate--I was recommended to try my wings as state supervisor of home economics for New Mexico. I applied and was hired. I doubt I could have planned a better career ladder. The job was mine because I spoke Spanish. I had experience with consumer homemaking and occupational home economics. I had vocational counseling. I had taught the mentally handicapped and had worked with the economically--and academically--disadvantaged. I had state administrative experience and had other work and educational experience which gave me an appreciation of education in general.

Changes from this point on were not as dramatic or traumatic. I could refer to my fortuitous job changes as having been engineered by a series of mentors, but the effort was not a conscious one. I worked one year as chair of elementary and secondary education, which I can now identify as an opportunity to prove myself in managing people as well as a major budget.

In 1975, just after one year in the academic arena, I was appointed as state director for vocational-technical education; the first female to be appointed in the continental United States. This honor has been one I've appreciated and treated with care for ten years. It has been a responsibility which I have not taken lightly knowing that the evaluation of my activities will affect other women aspiring to administration in vocational education. To me, my election as the 1985 president of the state directors for vocational education was recognition that I have served well and successfully provided the way for others to follow.

State directors of vocational education have relatively short tenure and a high turnover rate. For some directors, it is a result of the political system; for others, it is the demands of the job. I am concerned that this lack of stability will result in a more fragmented system, less unity, and a concentration of effort on individual state problems, rather than the national issue of vocational education.

Vocational education has much to offer the educational community in the area of relevancy and application. Pedagogy courses encourage teaching from the concrete to the abstract or from application to theory. Vocational education, because it is both process and product oriented, can provide the system for responding to the future and the predicted lifelong learning needs.

For those women who are considering or who have not considered administration, it is worth the effort, whether you arrive by fate or planning. It is satisfying because of the rewards of responding to human need through vocational education services. Administration provides a leadership role as coordinator of the various programs and services in the state which relate to occupational preparation. Administration is personally rewarding because the influence one can exert has an impact on the entire state. A career in vocational education administration provides a way for helping the individual to "become."

My first awareness of the concept of vocational education began with involvement in one of the vocational student organizations--Phi Beta Lambda. From a collegiate atmosphere pursuing a business education degree, I became aware that similar training of less than a baccalaureate degree was being offered through the statewide network of vocational technical schools. One of the challenges I faced as state president of this organization was to encourage a working relationship between professionals and students from these different types of educational institutions.

As national president of Phi Beta Lambda, I learned that there were additional vocational student organizations serving students in other fields of vocational education.

An awareness and understanding of vocational education at the national level continued through my first professional position as Director of Industry-Education Relations with the Future Business Leaders of America-Phi Beta Lambda, Inc. Interaction with other vocational student organization staff members, leaders, and members of Congress was enhanced.

An understanding of the relationship between the national structure of vocational education and representatives in each state's Department of Education was developed. A Master of Science in Education degree completed during this stage of my career development provided interaction with teachers and an understanding of the challenges which they faced. Additional experiences as a teacher and a sales manager for a major hotel corporation finished the list of minimum qualifications needed for a teaching position in Arkansas and the basis for a move home.

The Arkansas position was that of teacher-coordinator of a cooperative vocational education program for disadvantaged business students at a Little Rock high school. After experiencing curriculum development, full-time teaching, and placement of students in this position, a job became available as assistant supervisor of business education with the Arkansas Department of Education. Along with teacher supervision assignments, responsibilities included serving as state advisor for Arkansas FBLA and FBL.

My career path to this point had been something akin to following the "yellow brick road." It was fun, happy, and extremely positive while being quite busy

and demanding. While I had not yet considered discrimination against me because of being female, I had been made keenly aware of my youth and "lack of experience." It seemed that efforts to secure educational credentials and work experience, often by attending classes or working in the evening after a full day at another job, were not even recognized by some and certainly not rewarded. I longed for the day when my youth would not be so obvious--amazingly, that day has arrived.

With the passage of the 1976 Vocational Education Amendments, each state was required to employ a person to devote full time to the statutory requirements for overcoming sex bias and stereotyping. The state director asked me to take the position since he was eager to have someone with a vocational education background. Though not apparent to me then, in retrospect, I was the logical choice among the staff since I was clearly the newest staff member and probably perceived as the emerging "new woman." Not until I embarked on the task of convincing conservative Arkansas vocational educators to change their attitudes about women and men in jobs nontraditional to their sex, did I realize that this request also required many of them to change personal values and deal with inner conflicts that had been developing for years. Others later joined me in this effort, and results show that some impact has been made. However, to those of us who were on the firing line day after day, the task seemed insurmountable. We were not prepared to be personally charged with this national effort.

Ten years after completing a master's degree, Dr. Dean Clayton, Vocational Education Program Coordinator at the University of Arkansas, was urging me to complete a doctoral degree. With his encouragement, and support from my family, Dr. Ballard, and other professional friends, I was awarded my doctorate in Vocational Education in May of this year. I feel now that my background and experience will support me as I pursue new opportunities in the future.

Given the relationship between the federal vocational legislation and local program activities, one of my greatest concerns for vocational education is the number and type of restrictions being imposed on the use of federal vocational education funds by legislation. Methods must be found which will allow accomplishment of goals within a range of administrator decisions.

My most fervent hope for vocational education is that we can maintain and improve our responsiveness. It seems that responsiveness is the greatest asset of the program and the greatest contribution we can make to economic development and society. Now, where do women fit into the concept and program of vocational education? Right alongside the men--working each day to do our best, give our best, and be our best. Unfortunately, when we are willing to work so hard, we are often viewed as a threat to those who would just as soon take life easier but remain unscathed in the process.

One suggestion for improvement that I would offer is that women give more thought to career planning. This has improved to some degree during the last ten years, but it appears that some women who complete college degrees today still may do so for some other reason than their perception that a life-long career will follow.

The opportunity to share these thoughts is quite an honor for me, and I offer my best wishes to each of you.

Swainsboro, Georgia is not big enough to kill a cat, but it's the place where my path to an administrative career began. In Swainsboro, I was born into a family of educators. My mother was a teacher and my father was a principal and local superintendent. As a child I cut my teeth on books.

But that was a long time ago. Now, I am gratified that women are being recognized more and more for our leadership abilities. The path I took to become the executive director of the Georgia Vocational Association (GVA) has not been filled with obstacles, but rather a continuous stream of challenges.

When I began teaching, my first challenge was to begin a marketing education program in an Atlanta high school. I taught there for eight years and transferred to a different high school for the next seven years.

In 1961, I was nominated and elected president of GVA. As president, I judged our association's purpose to be to take care of the needs of vocational educators on a professional level and to improve vocational education for our students.

In 1966, I was hired as the first executive director of GVA on a part-time basis. My challenge as an administrator was to share with the public and legislators the needs of vocational education in order to ensure quality in our instruction.

My greatest challenge as a woman administrator came in the legislative arena. Attitudes, in 1966, were different because there were few women legislators or lobbyists. At times I felt I had to prove myself more as a knowledgeable administrator because I was a woman. Once this was established I began to be included in the inner circle of legislative activities. One essential ingredient to being an effective lobbyist and public relations person was to be visible at all times so I would be recognized by the public.

My position became full-time in 1968. I was challenged more than ever with creating a stronger organization. Seeing the results of my lobbying and other efforts made my motivation that much stronger. Serving vocational education in this particular way still intrigues me. I never went back to a school classroom; the whole state is my classroom now. I hope the effects of my work were also that much larger.

In Georgia, vocational education is going through some changes. Last year, the General Assembly passed a sweeping educational reform bill--the Quality Basic Education Act. I am enthusiastic about it in general, but have some concerns about its implementation and long-range effects. Many policy decisions affecting vocational education were left up to the state board of education and are being decided now. The following are some areas of concern:

- o Middle school programs are in question. Some exploratory programs at this level may be eliminated.
- o Extended-day and extended-year teaching contracts may only apply to certain vocational areas. Funding for qualified teachers may have to come from local school districts.
- o A new weighted funding formula goes into effect next year based on class enrollment. Until it has been tried and proven, its effect is unknown.
- o New high school graduation requirements that were set by the state board have affected enrollment.
- o The statewide system of postsecondary vocational-technical schools has been put under a new board of vocational-technical education bringing changes in governance and direction.

These are varied concerns, but the solution I see is very broad. I believe we can serve our interests best by informing the public, the state board and our legislators of what is going on in our classrooms today. I often speak with people who have an image of vocational education that is behind the times. The public hasn't kept up with the changes in vocational education. Updating our image to reflect the present reality of our programs is our goal.

This year, in Georgia secondary schools, we have a new electromechanical technology program, Principles of Technology courses that teach science and mathematics as a background to energy systems and new curriculum guides that reinforce writing and mathematical skills. Our postsecondary schools are contributing enormously to the economic development of the state. These are just a few facts the public needs to know. If the public and policy makers know our quality product, they can make informed decisions. We hope they will support vocational education and our unique needs.

My vision for the future is that vocational education be recognized as an integral part of the education program--just as essential as mathematics and English. I believe that regardless of what career a person chooses, vocational skills are needed for everyday existence. Some facet of all our lives requires vocational training, whether it be as consumers, college-bound students who may need to support themselves through school, or workers who need retraining or additional training to advance or keep up with the job market. Our future plans must be directed toward making the public see vocational education as basic education.

I would like to see more women in vocational education accept the challenge of an administrative career. Training and job opportunities are available for any woman with determination. The ice has been broken. Go for it!

Like most careers, mine has been a combination of experiences, some carefully planned, some completely fortuitous, and some an unplanned, but logical, result of previous experiences.

Obtaining my first vocational teaching experience was fortuitous in that a friend asked me to teach basic language skills to dropouts. Because this idea was challenging, my friend persuasive, and the compensation extraordinarily good, I agreed.

One teaching experience soon led to another. I was asked to establish a high school reading program; then I accepted a position at Tri-Cities State Regional Vocational Technical School teaching reading and technical report writing. Later, I taught technical report writing at Nashville State Technical Institute and began work toward a doctorate in higher education administration at Peabody College.

As far as my career, several fortuitous events also occurred at Nashville Tech during this period. A few months before I received my doctorate, a man with a positive attitude toward women and minorities became president. The dean of instruction took a leave of absence and I was appointed acting dean. The dean subsequently resigned, and after a national search, I became dean.

As a graduate student preparing for a teaching career in English, I never dreamed that someday I would be responsible for hiring faculty to teach in engineering technology and business programs; developing master plans; planning and moving into new buildings; developing curricula in occupational therapy, robotics and business management; and purchasing robots, computers and CAD equipment. It has been an unusual, interesting, and rewarding career.

Like anyone, I have encountered various obstacles. At the same time, I would confess that I have had tremendous support. A number of individuals, both male and female, have been willing to assist me greatly in my efforts.

Today, administrators of vocational programs in two-year colleges face several critical issues. Such reports as A Nation At Risk: The Imperative for Educational Reform, and High School: A Report on Secondary Education in America reflect renewed emphasis on academic standards. Responsible, concerned administrators in two-year colleges must insist that this shift toward

quality includes a concern for strengthening vocational programs as well as strengthening academics.

Another important issue in the two-year college is the opportunity to work with older, non-traditional students. Because of the greater participation of minorities, returning women, and employed adults, vocational educators at two-year colleges will be working with students who are older and/or face quite different problems than those faced by the traditional recent high school graduate.

Having adequate funding remains a perpetual issue for two-year colleges which provide education for engineering technicians and craftsmen. These colleges must respond quickly to new developments in technology, providing training on essential, and expensive, equipment similar to that currently in operation in industry. In addition, employing, developing, and retaining effective faculty poses a financial challenge. Because vocational instructors are expected to be experts in their fields, often two-year colleges find themselves competing with business and industry to employ and retain these experts. Too frequently, the colleges simultaneously face a mature faculty and inadequate resources for essential faculty development.

During the next decade as the two-year colleges address the issues of providing quality programs, recruiting and retaining non-traditional students and obtaining adequate funding for equipment and faculty, they will, out of necessity, become more flexible. Faculty, staff, and administrators familiar with the problems, questions, and concerns of the eighteen-year old will re-orient their thinking to relate to the minority, returning women, and employed adult students. Being creative and developing fund-raising programs, two-year colleges will obtain adequate funding and will operate more efficiently. Closer working relationships with business and industry, more cooperative relationships, will be cultivated by the colleges. Because students will move among senior colleges, community colleges, technical institutes, and area vocational schools, more articulation agreements to facilitate transfer will be developed. More innovative faculty development programs will provide the opportunity to return to industry and/or college on a regular basis. In short, an exciting and challenging future faces vocational education.

The dynamic field of vocational education holds outstanding opportunities for both men and women who wish to pursue a career in administration. For those who desire a career in this field, some suggestions follow. First, "to thine own self be true, and it must follow as the night the day, thou canst not then be false to any man." Those interested in a non-traditional field need a well integrated personality, a strong sense of self, and an ability in the face of adversaries to be themselves. They must learn to assess their strengths and to recognize their weaknesses.

Finally, administrators must balance their careers and personal lives. Emerson noted that "for everything you have missed, you have gained something else; and for everything you gain, you lose something else." Administrators should be aware of this theory of "compensation" and carefully evaluate their trade-offs.

Vocational education administration is an exciting, interesting, challenging, and rewarding field. I would encourage talented women and men who have interest and abilities to consider it as a viable career option.
