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ABSTRACT

Prepared in response to requests from librarians and other members of the public for information about the types of projects that have been funded by the Higher Education Act Title II-B Program, a program which assists in training persons in librarianship through fellowships and institutes, this brochure provides information about projects funded in 1987 by Title II-B program grants. For FY 1987, 29 awards were made to support 60 fellowships (45 master's, 5 post-master's, and 10 doctoral), and 2 grants were issued to fund 2 institute awards for 40 participants. Abstracts for each funded project are listed first by state and then by the institution to which fellowships or grants were issued. The following information is provided for each project: (1) institution; (2) project director; (3) number and level of awards; (4) FY 1987 funding; (5) grant period; and (6) project objectives. The length of the institute is also indicated for the funded institute projects. A table summarizing fellowship funding history by state and institution for FY 1966 through FY 1987 is also provided. #### **Project Objectives**

The duration of the institute is two weeks. During that period, the participants will deal with five major topics, as follows:

- *The state of the field.* This will be a broad-ranging survey of East Asian studies and librarianship in North America, focusing attention on teaching and research trends and the accompanying needs that will have to be filled by East Asian librarians.
- *Information technology.* The participants will be introduced to the state of the art in such manners as character processing in Chinese, Japanese, and Korean (hereinafter CJK). There will be sessions on library applications of computer technology, on personal computer applications, on making use of the mainframe computers on home campuses, and other related topics.
- *East Asian bibliographies.* Material will be presented on the history of the East Asian book and relevant bibliographical matters. Considerable attention of CJK materials in North America in the Romanized forms and in vernacular data.
- *Library management.* Theory and concepts in library

management, particularly as they pertain to East Asian libraries, will be another major focus. Sessions will also be devoted to collection of data and to analysis of library statistics.

- ***National and international cooperation.*** It is now generally recognized that no one East Asian library can be wholly autonomous; no library can, by itself, meet the needs of all its users. Cooperation has been slow to develop, but recent trends in the use of computerized data make that cooperation not merely desirable but essential. To give just one example: the Chinese Character Code for Information Interchange (usually referred to as CCCII) was developed on Taiwan and is used by OCLC (Online Computer Library Center) and RLIN (Research Library Information Network) in North America. Just recently we were informed that CCCII (in spite of its place of origin) has been endorsed by the People's Republic of China. All East Asian libraries must be prepared to cooperate on both national and international bases.
