ABSTRACT

The 1993 study of student charges at four-year public colleges and universities examined tuition and fees, room and board and first professional program charges. The study used data compiled by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC) in an annual survey of member institutions which in 1993 drew 485 responses (of 577 mailed). The analysis found that, though student charges continue to rise, the rate of increase for tuition and fees has returned to the level it held throughout most of the 1980s. Tuition and fees for undergraduate residents increased by 7.6 percent compared with 10.4 percent between fall 1991 and fall 1992 and 13.6 percent between fall 1990 and fall 1991. Though state appropriations for higher education continue to fall short, numerous institutions report that their own fiscal situation has stabilized if not improved. Extensive appendixes, the bulk of the document, contain tables showing cost information for specific colleges and universities for undergraduate and graduate tuition and fees for AASCU and NASULGC institutions respectively. Also included are tables showing charges at nonaffiliated institutions and tuition and fees for first professional degrees. (JB)

Introduction

The public higher education outlook for fall 1993 is somewhat better, both for institutions and for their students, than it has been in recent years. Student charges continue to rise at public, four-year institutions, however, in contrast to the double-digit increases of the past two years, the rate of increase for student tuition and fees has returned to the level that it held throughout most of the '80s. Tuition and fees for undergraduate residents increased by 7.6 percent this year, compared with 10.4 percent between fall 1991 and fall 1992, and 13.6 percent between fall 1990 and fall 1991. The leveling off of the rate of increase in student charges may be due in part to recovering state economies and efforts on the part of institutions and systems of higher education to streamline operating budgets. Though in many cases state appropriations for higher education continue to fall short of the mark, numerous institutions report that their own fiscal situation has stabilized if not improved over the last year. (Faculty salary freezes, prevalent during the last few years, are being lifted, and other areas have seen improvement as well. A smaller percentage have reported or expect to experience increases in the number of students applying for aid, reductions in access to student services and deferral of building repair and rehabilitation.)

In the early 1980s, undergraduate resident tuition and fees climbed at a rate of almost 15 percent a year. By 1985, however, the increase had dropped to 7 percent, and for the next six years it remained at about that level, reflecting increased state appropriations to public colleges and universities and unanticipated increases in enrollment. In fall of 1991, the percent increase again shot up to nearly 14 percent and stayed in the double-digits for the following year. This fall the increase returns to a mid-'80s level. Whether a similar rate of increase is likely to continue for the next several years, as happened in the '80s, is uncertain since state higher education appropriations, unlike state economies, still show little sign of recovery, much less of keeping pace

with inflation. The findings for the fall 1993 survey of student charges at public, four-year institutions are as follows:

- **Undergraduate Tuition and Fees.** Resident undergraduate tuition and fees rose by 7.6 percent, from an average cost of \$2,263 in fall 1992 to \$2,434 in fall 1993. Nonresident undergraduate tuition and fees rose by 7.1 percent, from \$5,982 in fall 1992 to \$6,408 in fall 1993. The percent increase for nonresident undergraduates is slightly less this year than that for resident undergraduates, although an increasing number of state institutions are moving towards full recovery of the cost of instruction from nonresident students. (Table 1)
- **Room and Board Charges.** Room and board charges increased from an average of \$3,374 in fall 1992 to \$3,520 in fall 1993. This represents a 4.3-percent rise in cost from last year to this year, down slightly from the 4.7-percent rise in cost from fall 1991-92. (Table 2)
- **Graduate Tuition and Fees.** Graduate charges also increased at a substantially lower rate this year than last year. Last fall graduate charges rose by 10-12 percent, while this year's resident graduate tuition and fees rose by 7.9 percent. Average cost was \$2,803 this fall versus \$2,598 last fall. Nonresident graduate tuition and fees rose by 7.4 percent, from \$6,081 in fall 1992 to \$6,529 in fall 1993. Again, as with the undergraduate charges, the increase for nonresident graduates was slightly less this year than that for resident graduates. (Table 3)
- **First Professional Charges.** Law charges continue to increase at a higher rate. Tuition and fees for resident law students increased by 11.5 percent. The previous fall, resident law charges had risen by 11.2 percent. Nonresident law charges, on the other hand, rose by 9.4 percent this fall, compared with 9.8 percent in fall of 1992. Average resident

tuition and fees for law students now total \$4,446, while nonresident tuition and fees total \$9,797. Medical resident charges increased at a lower rate than last year: 6.9 percent this year versus 9.4 percent last year. Medical nonresident charges increased by 6.5 percent, about the same rate as last year's increase (6.3 percent). Current medical resident charges total \$8,178 this fall: nonresident charges total \$17,573. Veterinary resident and nonresident tuition and fees rose at a somewhat higher rate than last fall. Resident charges increased by 8.2 percent in fall 1993, compared with 7.5 percent in fall 1992. Nonresident charges increased by 6.4 percent in fall 1993, versus 5.7 percent in fall 1992. Dentistry resident and nonresident charges also rose at a slightly higher rate this year. Resident tuition and fees went from \$6,955 in fall 1992 to \$7,571 in fall 1993, an increase of 8.9 percent. Nonresident tuition and fees went from \$14,902 last fall to \$15,889 this fall, an increase of 6.6 percent. (Table 4)

Average Tuition by State

Increases in resident undergraduate tuition and fees charges from fall 1992 to fall 1993 varied by state, though the variability in percent increases was less than the previous fall's. For example, this year the majority of states experienced rises in tuition and fees of between 4 and 7 percent, with 13 states reporting double-digit increases. In contrast, last fall's tuition and fees increases by state were more varied, including 18 states which reported double-digit increases. The largest increases for fall 1993 were experienced in Louisiana (21.3 percent), Alaska (19.5 percent), District of Columbia (17.3 percent), California (16.3 percent—down from 29.0 percent last fall) and Arizona (16.2 percent). In fall 1992, the largest increases occurred in California, Puerto Rico (28.3 percent), New York (19.8 percent), Texas (19.1 percent) and Montana (18.2 percent). In the case of California, extremely difficult economic and fiscal conditions contributed to the high rate of increase. Similarly, in Louisiana and Alaska, the state's ability to support public institutions of higher education is becoming increasingly weakened. Both Puerto Rico and New York had notably high rates of increase for the previous two years running, however this year's figures dropped dramatically to 4.7 and 1.0 percent, respectively (53.2 and 37.7 percent increases were reported for New York and Puerto Rico in fall of 1991)¹ Exceptionally small increases occurred in Mississippi (0.7 percent), Nevada (0.9 percent) and New York (1.0 percent). Two of the states reporting the largest increases this fall, Arizona and Louisiana, had demonstrated very low increases in tuition and fees for the previous two years running. (Table 5)²

¹It should be noted that the increase calculated for New York does not reflect the impact of a new policy in the CUNY System implemented last year. According to this policy, new (first-time) students pay different charges per year than continuing students. The lower rate for continuing students will be phased out over the next few years as these students graduate. The 1992 and 1993 average charges and percent changes for New York are based on the lower, "continuing student" rate, as this rate more closely reflects the current composition of the student body.

²It should be noted that a 100 percent response was not achieved in each state, thus actual state averages may differ from these calculations.

Policy Changes and the Instructional Environment on Campuses

Recent fiscal problems in public higher education focussed attention on higher education appropriations, especially the mid-year funding cutbacks that have caused so much confusion. Initial enacted appropriations for public colleges have not kept up

with inflation in the last three fiscal years, and the loss to inflation has greatly exceeded the funds lost to mid-year cuts. Concern over funding has made policies concerning tuition and fees, enrollment management, nonresident versus resident status, campus staffing and faculty workloads more salient as campuses attempt to provide the same level of service to students with fewer resources.

The fall 1993 student charges survey asked questions about campus conditions and policies, looking at charges and other areas of impact on students and instruction. (Percentages discussed below are based on the number of respondents who answered a particular question. The response rates for particular items ranged from 65 to 70 percent for the questions, excluding the items asking about whether particular changes were related to current state economic and fiscal conditions, which ranged from 46 to 78 percent.)

Respondents were asked to describe fiscal conditions on their campuses, and slightly more than half, 51.5 percent, indicated that the situation was average. When asked to compare the current fiscal condition of their campus to last fall, 42.4 percent responded that the situation was the same as last year. The situation was seen as somewhat worse than last fall by 26.9 percent, while 23.9 percent of the respondents thought it was somewhat better. As might be expected, the majority of respondents, 60 percent, said that an increasing number of students had requested aid, and another 28.6 percent expected more aid requests. Almost half, 45.8 percent, indicated that students would be eligible for greater amounts of aid, due to greater need, and another 27.7 percent expected this to happen. A majority, 64 percent, indicated that their campuses had not reduced access to student services.

Campuses continue to make up for decreased state appropriations by passing on costs to students. A clear majority, 86.4 percent, indicated that they had increased fees. Almost a third, 31.3 percent, had established new fees on their campuses. It should be kept in mind that the costs of fiscal problems are

passed to students not just through increases in tuition and fees, but through decreases in the services and facilities paid for by these charges. At about one third of the campuses, 37.8 percent, building repair and rehabilitation had been deferred. However, almost as large a proportion, 36.8 percent, did not expect such deferral to occur. Cuts in out-of-state travel funds are often a response to funding shortfalls, and 32 percent of the campuses experienced travel restrictions. About a third of the campuses, 35.7 percent, reduced maintenance funds. Some of the consequences of the reductions in repair and maintenance will only be apparent in the future.

A few campuses have changed internal billing procedures on campus, either raising the charges to offices for services such as printing, or instituting charges for services previously provided "for free." In some instances, campus offices newly billed for copying or facing higher copying charges may pass some of these costs on to students who need copies of records. About one fifth of the respondents, 22.1 percent, indicated that this had happened, while a fourth, 26.6 percent, expected it to occur. Changes in personnel practices have followed fiscal problems, as well, with almost half of the respondents, 48.5 percent, indicating that administrative positions have been left unfilled. Another 44.2 percent indicated that administrative positions had been eliminated. A similar proportion, 50.5 percent, reported that staff positions had been left unfilled on their campuses, and 44.4 percent indicated that staff positions had been eliminated. These cutbacks are not without consequences for students, as the functions previously performed by these personnel are left undone or take longer to get done.

Almost a third of the respondents, 30.4 percent, reported enrollment limits were in place. (It should be noted that these enrollment limits often predate the current fiscal problems of public colleges, and are often a response to other factors.) As states look for more ways to balance higher education costs and revenues, one factor that has taken on increasing

importance is the amount charged to non-resident students. Almost a fifth of the reporting campuses, 19.6 percent, indicated that changes in non-resident tuition policy had occurred. Since all states charge lower tuition to their residents, some states have become more vigilant about checking the residency status of students, and made the definition of a resident more stringent. Ten percent of the respondents reported changed policies in this area. Some states have also examined their reciprocity agreements with neighboring jurisdictions to see where savings may be found, 8.1 percent of the campuses reported changes in this area.

The consequences of fiscal constraints directly affect the delivery of instruction. The number of course sections available was reduced at almost a third of the reporting institutions, 30.9 percent, and another 15.1 percent expected this to happen. The number of class selections had been reduced at 29.5 percent of the campuses, and another 14.6 percent thought this was likely to occur. Cutbacks in instruction have gone further than individual classes to include whole programs, with programs cut or consolidated at 28.5 percent of reporting campuses and such changes expected at 22.6 percent. Full-time faculty positions have been left unfilled at 44.6 percent of the campuses, and cut at 28.8 percent of them. Similarly part-time faculty positions have been left unfilled at 34.9 percent of the institutions, and cut at 32.5 percent of them. When faculty are cut it is logical to expect that some classes or programs will be cut as well. It would also be expected that instructional workloads would have to be increased to prevent too great a decrease in instructional offerings, and 25.9 percent of the reporting campuses increased workloads, with another 30.2 percent expecting this to happen. Even when students are able to schedule the classes they want, on many campuses they will find them larger than previously, with 34.5 percent reporting class size increases, and another 39 percent expecting them. Cutbacks in library acquisitions may make faculty and student research more difficult, and affect the quality of

instruction. Such cuts were reported on 28 percent of the campuses, and another 20.5 percent thought this was likely to happen. Cutbacks have also been made in the area of equipment and supplies, with 40.3 percent of the respondents indicating that such cuts have been made, and 24 percent indicating that they expect them.

Methodology

The survey and summary, *Student Charges at Public Institutions*, is an annual project jointly produced by the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. The survey was mailed in June to 577 public, four-year institutions of higher education in the United States and its territories: approximately 84 percent, or 485 colleges and universities, responded. These colleges and universities included 281 AASCU members, 104 NASULGC members, 25 members of both AASCU and NASULGC and 75 nonaffiliated, public, four-year colleges and universities.

Survey forms are preprinted with the previous fall data so that respondents may correct figures. Slight year-to-year variations in average charges are due to corrections made by the institutions. Guidelines developed for the survey seek a consistency of response by specifying conventions for reporting typical annual student charges for full-time students. Data are reported in three groupings: AASCU members, NASULGC members, and institutions not affiliated with either organization. It is important to note that the AASCU and NASULGC memberships are not mutually exclusive. Consequently, institutions holding dual membership will be counted twice when figuring rates for the associations but only once when calculating the overall rate or national average. This may occasionally result in a national average which is seemingly lower than any of the three groups' averages which contribute to it.

To reduce production costs and improve timeliness of data reporting, the institutional listings printed as appendices to the report were made available to all survey participants on diskette by the end of September 1993.
