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ABSTRACT

This report examines baccalaureate student graduation, time-to-degree, and retention at Illinois state universities and presents data on these issues in 21 tables. The analysis notes that a little more than half of all public university first-time freshmen earn a bachelor's degree and that less than 3 percent of freshmen complete their degrees in less than 4 academic years and about 25 percent complete their degrees in the traditional 4 academic years. Eventually about 55 percent of freshmen graduate. Among minority students graduation rates are lower and time-to-degree is longer. Conclusions reinforce current priorities to improve student access, choice, preparation for college-level work and undergraduate academic experience. Policy efforts to address these issues should continue. The tables which make up the bulk of the document present data on degree completion of first-time freshmen; degree completion of first-time freshmen from Black, Hispanic, and other minority groups; average graduation rates of first-time freshmen; average graduation rates of Black, Hispanic, and other first-time freshmen; trends in transfer patterns among first-time freshmen between 1983 and 1988; degree attainment, enrollment status, and non-persistence among first-time freshmen; degree attainment, enrollment status, and non-persistence among Black, Hispanic, and all other first-time freshmen; and enrollment duration among dropouts (all, Black, Hispanic, and all others). BACCALAUREATE STUDENT GRADUATION, TIME-TO-DEGREE, AND RETENTION
AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES

In September 1986 and again in September 1990, the Board of Higher Education adopted policies addressing the improvement of undergraduate education. These policies emphasize the joint responsibility across all education sectors to improve students' preparation for college and to promote academic progress and achievement among students. The policies also call upon institutions to monitor students' progress and use the results in program review and institutional planning.

More recently, the Board's Committee on Scope, Structure, and Productivity and the current Priorities, Quality, and Productivity (P•Q•P) initiative have expanded the policy context for undergraduate education improvement, in general, and for the monitoring of student progress, in particular, by incorporating them within the broader context of improving the productivity of Illinois higher education to meet higher priorities. Institutions are called upon to reduce the time it takes students to earn their baccalaureate degrees, improve graduation rates, and strengthen the quality of undergraduate education.

The proportion of first-time freshmen who earn a baccalaureate degree and the time it takes them to do so provide information about the academic quality and productivity of colleges and universities. Previous reports to the Board of Higher Education on this topic over the last four years have documented that:

- Slightly more than half of the first-time freshmen in public universities eventually earn their baccalaureate degrees, although the proportion varies from campus to campus;
- Among those first-time freshmen who earn baccalaureate degrees, approximately half do so within the traditional four academic years from first enrollment, although this proportion also varies widely by campus; and
- Most baccalaureate degrees are awarded to students who graduate from the campus in which they enrolled as first-time freshmen, with less than ten percent earning their baccalaureate degrees from a different public university.

This report extends by two additional years the public university graduation and retention data presented in previous reports. The report *Undergraduate Education: Transfer and Articulation Reexamined* (May 1994) presents similar information for students who first enroll at a public community college and later transfer to a public university. The shared enrollment and graduation data system established by the public universities and community colleges is the source of information for both reports.

In response to the recommendations of the Committee on the Study of Undergraduate Education adopted by the Board in September 1990, the 49 community colleges and 12 public universities cooperated in constructing the shared enrollment and graduation data system to better monitor student progress, retention, transfer, and degree completion. This system permits the examination of individual student enrollment and degree records across institutions while maintaining the confidentiality of individual students. The database currently contains over seven million enrollment and degree records for approximately 2.6 million individual students who enrolled in or

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received a degree from any Illinois community college or public university between summer 1982 and spring 1993. The nonpublic colleges and universities in Illinois are currently constructing a parallel system which, when matched with the public institution database, will permit examination of transfer and completion patterns among Illinois public universities, community colleges, and nonpublic institutions. Without the cooperation of the colleges and universities in Illinois, analyses such as this would not be possible.

Graduation and Time-to-Degree Trends

Table 1 displays the number of first-time freshmen enrolling in the public universities between summer 1983 and spring 1990. Table 1 also shows the number of these freshmen who earned baccalaureate degrees and the elapsed number of academic years between first enrollment and graduation. For example, of the 26,086 freshmen who enrolled in public universities for the first time in 1983-84 (i.e., between summer 1983 and spring 1984), 699 graduated in less than four years, and an additional 5,912 graduated in exactly four years. By the end of spring term 1993, 14,437 of the students who entered a public university in 1983-84 had received a baccalaureate degree. Table 2 presents this same information as cumulative percentages of first-time freshmen who earn degrees by academic year. For the 26,086 freshmen who first enrolled in 1983-84, 25 percent received a baccalaureate degree within four academic years, 45 percent within five years, and 51 percent within six years. This table highlights the six-year graduation rate, since that is one of the statistics required by the federal Student Right to Know legislation.

The last column on Tables 1 and 2 includes all students who have received a baccalaureate degree through spring term 1993, the last term of available data. By spring 1993 (i.e., within ten academic years from their first term of enrollment), 55 percent of the 1983-84 first-time freshmen earned a degree.

The data presented in Tables 1 and 2 are consistent with the information presented in previous reports. Table 2 shows that, on average, less than three percent of the freshmen in this study earned a degree in less than four years. About one-quarter of the freshmen earned their degrees within four academic years of first enrolling. Just under half of the freshmen earned their degrees within five academic years, while just over half did so within six years. For the cohorts of freshmen presented, the proportion who eventually earn a baccalaureate degree is 55 percent.

Tables 3 and 4 present similar data for Black students, data for Hispanic students are presented in Tables 5 and 6, and data for all other students are presented in Tables 7 and 8. Among Black first-time freshmen, approximately one-quarter eventually earn a baccalaureate degree. For Hispanic students, over one-third of the entering freshmen eventually graduate. These data suggest that the six-year graduation rates for minority students have improved. The six-year graduation rate for Black students increased from 18 percent for the class entering in 1983-84 to 25 percent for the class entering in 1987-88. For Hispanic students, 28 percent of the students entering in 1983-84 earned a baccalaureate within six years, while 37 percent of those who began in 1987-88 completed their work within six years. The tables in the Appendix provide individual campus data.

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A variety of factors which affect graduation and time-to-degree rates was identified in the Board of Higher Education report *Baccalaureate Student Graduation Rates and Time to Degree at Illinois Public Universities* (October 1992). Those factors include student characteristics and behavior (e.g., academic preparation and institutional selectivity, financial circumstances, part-time or interrupted attendance, course completion, degree or program major changing), as well as institutional policies and practices (e.g., course specification within majors, advising, course scheduling, degree requirements, tuition policies, and financial aid policies). At this time, the shared enrollment and graduation records contain no measure of course load, full-time versus part-time attendance status,

academic preparation of students, or other information on a number of variables that would enable further analysis.

Diversity is a defining characteristic of Illinois' higher education system. Each campus has a unique mission and serves a different student clientele. These differences among university campuses are a major strength of the Illinois higher education system that promotes the policy goals of access and choice. The diversity and uniqueness of each public university campus were discussed in the Board of Higher Education reports *Diversity Among Illinois Public Universities* (July 1992) and *Focus Statements for Illinois Public Universities* (January 1994).

The diversity among universities is also manifested in student graduation and retention rates. Average graduation rates by campus are presented in Tables 9, 10, 11, and 12, which summarize the institutional detail tables in the appendix. Table 9 displays the average graduation rates and time-to-degree for all public university freshmen who began from summer 1983 through spring 1990. Average graduation rates for Black, Hispanic, and all other students are shown in Tables 10, 11, and 12, respectively.

Recent national studies also suggest a number of factors influencing graduation and retention rates. The American Council on Education's *Minorities in Higher Education, Twelfth Annual Status Report, 1993* states that retention rates for Black students are comparable to rates for non-minority students when differences in socioeconomic status and academic preparation are controlled. In addition, Alexander W. Astin, director of the Higher Education Research Institute at the University of California at Los Angeles, in a critique of the federal Student Right to Know legislation ("College Retention Rates Are Often Misleading," *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, September 22, 1993) says,

One of the most insidious features of the Student Right to Know Act is that, by focusing entirely on a student "outcome" measure such as graduation and by ignoring the student's original "input," the law creates a strong disincentive for institutions to recruit underprepared students, not to mention poor students and those from underrepresented minority groups (who tend to be less well-prepared academically). If an institution is interested simply in maximizing its graduation rate (a strategy that the law implicitly encourages), that institution would have little to gain and potentially much to lose by admitting significant numbers of underprepared students. The law is, in effect, discouraging institutions from recruiting and admitting poor and minority students.

These points must be kept in mind when analyzing and interpreting graduation, time-to-degree, and retention rates.

In addition to permitting the calculation of graduation and time-to-degree rates for each public university, a major asset of the public university/community college shared enrollment and graduation information system is the ability to examine student transfer patterns among institutions. Among the student cohorts examined in this study, about eight percent earned their degrees from a public university different from the one in which they first enrolled.

Table 13 shows student transfer patterns among public universities. The rows of Table 13 show where the baccalaureate recipients who began as freshman at each public university ultimately earned their degrees. For example, 11,589 students first enrolled at Illinois State University as first-time freshmen between summer 1983 and spring 1988 and earned their baccalaureate degrees by spring 1993. Of these students, 10,605, or 92 percent, received their degrees from Illinois State University, while the remaining eight percent received their degrees from other institutions: 34 students who began as freshmen at Illinois State transferred to and graduated from Chicago State University, 76 graduated from Eastern Illinois University, and so on.

The columns of Table 13 show where the degree recipients at each public university began their academic studies. For example, 139, or ten percent, of the 1,330 degrees granted by Northeastern Illinois University were to students who began as freshmen at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Governors State University and Sangamon State University are represented in the columns of this table, but not the rows; these upper division institutions grant baccalaureate degrees, but do not admit freshmen.

The last two rows of Table 13 indicate the intrasector transfer behavior of public university baccalaureate degree recipients. The first shows the proportion of degrees awarded by each public university to first-time freshmen transferring in from other public university campuses, while the second shows the proportion of each public university's first-time freshmen who transferred out and earned their baccalaureate degrees from another campus. These percentages show that Eastern Illinois University, Western Illinois University, Illinois State University, and Northern Illinois University have a larger proportion of their first-time freshmen who transfer to another public university to earn a degree than students who began elsewhere who transfer in to complete a degree. In addition, Chicago State University, Northeastern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and the University of Illinois at Chicago award a higher proportion of their degrees to students who have transferred in from other universities than the statewide average of eight percent. For example, 27 percent of Chicago State University's baccalaureate degrees were awarded to students who began as first-time freshmen at other public universities.

Retention and Persistence

Even after ten academic years, some students who have not yet completed baccalaureate degrees continue to enroll. Table 14 displays the number of summer 1983 through spring 1988 first-time freshmen, the number who earned their baccalaureate degrees through spring 1993, and the number who had not graduated but were enrolled in either fall 1992 or spring 1993. For example, 941 students (four percent) out of the 26,086 who first enrolled in 1983-84 and who had not earned a degree continued to enroll for at least one term in fall 1992 or spring 1993, ten academic years after first enrolling. A slightly higher proportion of the 1984-85 first-time freshmen were still enrolled nine years later. As expected, the proportion of non-graduates still enrolled increases for more recent entry classes. Since 1992-93 was only the sixth academic year for the first-time freshmen who entered in 1987-88, 12 percent of those students were still enrolled in public higher education in Illinois.

Tables 15, 16, and 17 present data from Table 14 for Black, Hispanic, and all other students, respectively. A higher proportion of both Black and Hispanic students remain enrolled for a longer period than do other students. For the five cohorts presented, an average of 13 percent of Black students and 11 percent of Hispanic students were still enrolled in the fall 1992 or spring 1993 terms, compared with about six percent of all other students. Since a higher proportion of minority students persist in their studies for seven, eight, ten years or more, a longer period of time must be considered when analyzing graduation rates for minority students. However, the overall non-persistence rate of minority students continues to be a problem that must be addressed. The data presented in Table 14 through 17 indicate that, on average, about 40 percent of all public university first-time freshmen, about 60 percent of Black freshmen, and about half of all Hispanic freshmen did not continue their studies in an Illinois community college or public university.

As was the case with graduation behavior, non-persistence rates vary considerably among public universities. Table 18 shows, by campus, the number and proportion of summer 1983 through spring 1988 first-time freshmen who neither earned their degrees nor remained enrolled in a public university or community college, and the duration of enrollment for these non-persisters. The table shows that about one-quarter of the non-persisting students enroll for one year or less in public higher education. An additional quarter enroll for two years or less. Half of the non-persisters, however, extend their enrollment beyond two years before stopping or dropping out.

Enrollment patterns for non-persisting Black students are presented in Table 19, while Table 20 shows the patterns for Hispanic students, and Table 21 shows all other non-persisting students. For minority students, the rates of students discontinuing or interrupting their studies within the first year are higher than the rates for all students shown on Table 18. About 30 percent of Black students and 32 percent of Hispanic students compared with 26 percent of all other students do not persist in their studies beyond the first year. After that first year, however, non-persistence rates are roughly the same for minority students as for all students. About one-half of non-persisting freshmen do not persist beyond two years of study, and a little less than half continue beyond two years, but do not earn a degree within the six to ten year period shown in these tables. Identifying and implementing methods to assist these students to continue their studies through graduation remains a priority.

Since the primary focus of this report is on baccalaureate graduation and time-to-degree rates, analyses of retention and persistence rates for recent public university freshmen have not been presented. However, institutional records as well as the shared enrollment and graduation database could be used to calculate institutional persistence rates; such analyses would be of help to governing boards and institutions in their continuing efforts to strengthen the quality of the undergraduate experience.

Conclusions and Recommendations

A little more than half of all public university first-time freshmen earn a baccalaureate degree. Less than three percent of the freshmen complete their degrees in less than four academic years, and about one-quarter complete their degrees within the traditional four academic years. Given enough time, approximately 55 percent of the freshmen eventually graduate.

Among minority students, graduation rates are not as high and time-to-degree is longer. Approximately one-quarter of Black and over one-third of Hispanic freshmen eventually earn a baccalaureate degree. However, the six-year graduation rates for minority students show improvement. It is also clear that in examining graduation rates for all students, but especially for minority students, longer than traditional periods of time must be considered, since a significant number of students continue to pursue and achieve a baccalaureate degree beyond six years.

A number of students continue to enroll for many years after first enrolling as a freshman; indeed, almost four percent of the 1983-84 freshman class were still enrolled at the undergraduate level in public higher education in fall 1992 or spring 1993, ten years after their first enrollment in a public university. Eight percent of Black and six percent of Hispanic students who first enrolled in 1983-84 remained enrolled in 1992-93.

Too many students, however, do not continue beyond their first year. Of those students who do not persist in public higher education, one-quarter enroll for one year or less, and another one-quarter enroll for two years or less. Rates of persistence are lower for minority students. Particular attention needs to be directed toward not only improving preparation for college, but also facilitating the transition from school to college and promoting success during the first two years of college work.

This report addresses the Board's policies on undergraduate education adopted in 1986 and 1990. These conclusions reinforce the Board's priorities on student access and choice, preparation of students for college-level work, the undergraduate academic experience, and the productivity of Illinois colleges and universities. These issues are also currently being addressed by the Board's Committee to Study Affordability.

Public universities and system offices have begun to examine the effects of institutional policies and practices on graduation and time-to-degree rates and these efforts should continue. Evaluations should include a thorough review of graduation requirements, course schedules, and academic support programs, and the effects of these factors on student retention and graduation. Board of Higher

Education policies call upon institutions to use the results of student progress monitoring in the program review and institutional planning processes.

In addition, information systems should be improved to provide better student monitoring to address questions about high school preparation, student effort and achievement, and institutional commitment. The high school feedback system and the shared enrollment and graduation information system established by the public universities and community colleges are important first steps in reconceptualizing and reorienting information systems, but they must be taken further. The two systems should be merged so that information about high school preparation can be linked with college achievement data. In addition, better measures of student effort and achievement such as credit-hours attempted and completed, grade-point-averages, test scores, or similar measures might also be collected. When the private college and university shared enrollment and graduation information system begins collecting data, records from that system and the public system can be matched to allow tracking of intersector transfer, retention and graduation rates. Most importantly, the information in these systems and its analysis should be used by high schools and by campuses to focus efforts at improving undergraduate education.
