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ABSTRACT

This directory presents information on 290 programs in colleges and universities nationwide for those who already have a bachelor's degree and want to complete requirements to earn a teaching license, a master's degree, or both. Information comes from a survey of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education's member institutions conducted in the spring of 1999. The directory does not include programs offered by state governments, school districts, or other sources. Program descriptions reflect institutional and state requirements at that time. Programs are arranged in alphabetical order and by institution of higher education. The directory focuses on the approximate amount of time necessary to complete the program and provides descriptions of each program's requirements, types of teaching license that may be earned, and whether or not a master's degree is offered. A list of additional resources is included. (SM)

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INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on your decision to consider a career in education. Teaching is a challenging profession, but the rewards are extraordinary.

Individuals are prepared to teach in a variety of ways. In the past, most educators completed requirements for their teaching license as part of a college or university undergraduate program. Although this remains a common way to become a teacher, many programs exist for individuals who already hold a baccalaureate degree but have not taken any education courses. This directory presents information on 290 programs in colleges and universities for those who already have a bachelor's degree and want to complete requirements to earn a teaching license, a master's degree or both.

Information included in the directory is the result of a survey of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education's member institutions. Program descriptions were voluntarily submitted and while the directory provides a broad sample of all such programs available in U.S. colleges and universities, it does not include all of them. The directory does not include programs that may be offered by state governments, school districts, or other sources.

The survey was conducted in spring 1999. Program descriptions reflect institutional and state requirements at that time. Because programs are subject to change, we suggest you write, call or e-mail the college or university for additional information. The contact person listed for each institution will be able to give you details about the program and how to apply. Questions about the program should be directed to the offering institution, not to AACTE.

How to Use This Directory

Programs are arranged in alphabetical by state and by institution of higher education. The approximate amount of time necessary to complete the program (full time and part time) is included. There is no guarantee that you will complete your program in that time frame. The amount of time you will need to earn a teaching license will vary according to your personal circumstances and background. Some programs require extended placements (internships) in elementary or secondary schools as part of the course of study. This may present a challenge for people who plan to work full time while completing requirements for a teaching license. However, a number of colleges and universities report that through cooperative arrangements with local school districts, many teaching candidates are employed in schools while completing licensure requirements.

The descriptions in this directory will give you a general idea of each program's requirements, the types of teaching license that may be earned, and whether or not a master's degree is offered. Many people prefer to work simultaneously toward a master's degree and a teaching license because school district salaries usually are higher for individuals with these degrees.

SA, RA, NPA	Colleges and universities that offer teacher education preparation programs must be approved by the state (SA) and many are regionally accredited (RA). In addition, the teacher preparation program may meet standards for national professional accreditation (NPA). These approval and accreditations provide greater assurance that the program will lead to a teaching license recognized in other states.
NTE	National Teachers Examination. Required in some states as a requirement for a teaching license. The NTE has been replaced in many states by the PRAXIS examination.

Tips

- Consider where you want to teach and whether or not you are willing to relocate. In spite of a shortage of teachers nationally, not all school districts have or anticipate having vacancies in every subject and grade level.
- Review your undergraduate and/or graduate transcript. Are the courses you took in your major and minor fields still current? Are they subjects that commonly are taught in elementary, middle, or secondary schools? If your baccalaureate degree was earned a number of years ago—especially in a field that has had rapid advances in knowledge—or if your major field isn't one taught in elementary or secondary schools, you may need to take courses in a teaching field as well as in professional education. Courses in the teaching field generally are available through that field's academic department or unit.
- Although the teaching credential you earn may be recognized in one state, it might not be accepted in another. If you intend to relocate in the near future, find out which states your teaching license or certificate will be accepted.

Program Name: Alternative Fifth-Year Program (ALTA)

Approximate Time to Complete: 24 months (FT); 36 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for an Alabama teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Early Childhood; Elementary; Middle School/Secondary: Language Arts/English, Music, Mathematics, Science, History/Social Studies, Health; Special Education; Collaborative Teacher K-6, 6-12, K-12.

Program Description: The Alternative Fifth-Year Programs (ALTA) leads to the Master of Education (M.Ed.) degree and certification at the A level. They are designed for individuals who wish to enter the teaching profession but have not completed a teacher education program at the undergraduate level. Admission to an ALTA program requires a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution with an overall GPA of 2.5. Candidates must take the GRE General Test, maintain a GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate satisfactory performance on a written comprehensive examination (SA, RA, NPA).

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AUBURN UNIVERSITY

Program Name: Alternative Fifth-Year Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 16-20 months (FT); 36 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for an Alabama teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Secondary: Language Arts/English, Spanish, Mathematics, Science, Music (K-12); Special Education: Early Childhood Special Education, Emotional Conflicted Mental Retardation, Specific Learning Disabilities; Physical Education (K-12); Vocational and Adult Education: Adult Education, Agribusiness Education, Business and Office Education, Marketing Education.

Program Description: This is open to individuals who have baccalaureate degrees who are interested in entering the teaching profession. Since the program leads to a master's degree, individuals must be admissible to the Graduate School. Also, most departments require a minimum GPA of 2.75 on all coursework taken at the undergraduate level. The program may be completed in five quarters as a full-time student and includes a one-quarter internship (SA, RA, NPA).

Credential Areas: Early Childhood; Elementary; Secondary: Language Arts/English, Biology, History/Social Studies, Mathematics; Special Education: Early Childhood, Collaborative Teacher (K-6), Collaborative Teacher (6-12).

Program Description: The Internship Program is an alternative credentialing option developed in collaboration between CSU Bakersfield and four local districts. The program blends theory and practice through close relationships between school and university faculties. The program begins with preparatory coursework on introductory skills and competencies to begin teaching as well as field work in a school classroom. Candidates selected to continue receive an Intern Credential. At that point they are fully employed by a school district and assigned to a regular classroom. Interns are engaged in the study of learning and teaching with an emphasis on classroom experiences under the guidance of university and district personnel. Intern teacher salaries are commensurate with the candidate's years of employment. This program provides the intern teacher with skills needed to complete credential requirements (SA, NPA).

Students who participate in the program are eligible to receive individualized assistance by a university or district-trained support provider; reimbursement for textbooks; and supplementary training in literacy, reading and mathematics (SA, NPA).

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CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FRESNO

■ Program Name: Block A

Approximate Time to Complete: 12 months (FT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California teaching credential (Multiple Subject K-8).

Program Description: The Block A, Elementary and Middle School Block is a school-based cohort program that prepares students in practical applications as well as theoretical aspects of teaching by coordinating coursework with classroom practice. Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California teaching credential (Multiple Subjects Credential).

Credential Areas: Elementary.

Program Description: The Option IV Program is a "re-entry" type program for students who have a bachelor's degree in a field other than teaching and are seeking to complete requirements leading to a credential in Elementary Education. Students entering the Option IV Program typically have extensive work and life experiences that serve as an asset to their work as classroom teachers. The program enrolls 25 to 30 students each academic year and operates with this cohort of students as a block program. All classes are taught on an elementary school site (SA, RA, NPA).

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■ **Program Name:** Teacher Internship Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 18-24 months (FT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Early Childhood; Multiple Subject; Single Subject; Special Education.

Program Description: This program provides a 1-year alternative certification option to obtain an Early Childhood, Multiple Subject, Single Subject, or Special Education teaching credential. Upon successful completion of one semester of prerequisite requirements, the Internship Program permits individuals to teach in an elementary, secondary or special education classroom setting under an Internship Credential. Interns earn a modestly reduced salary and complete work toward their teaching credential. During the 1-year internship, teacher interns are supported by a university supervisor as well as a cooperating teacher. All interns are assigned to a grade-level cohort and attend four Saturday professional development training days each semester (SA).

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CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

■ **Program Name:** Multiple Subjects Internship Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 8 months (FT); 12 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California teaching credential (Multiple Subject and Multiple Subject CLAD or BCLAD Emphasis).

Credential Areas: Elementary

Program Description: These are three-semester programs to which candidates may apply while completing the first semester of the regular credential program. Admission is contingent on approved employment with a participating district, superior standing in the first-semester coursework and student teaching, and recommendations from university and district personnel. The remaining two semesters involve paid teaching internship positions and collegiate coursework (SA, RA, NPA).

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■ **Program Name:** Single Subject Professional Track Program

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California teaching credential (Single Subject in a Content Area)

Credential Areas: Secondary: Business Education, Theater, Physical Education, and others.

Program Description: This program is open to teachers who are already teaching full-time on an internship, emergency, or long-term substitute credential. Candidates must meet prerequisite and subject matter expertise requirements before entering the program, which allows them to complete credential requirements while teaching for pay in the public schools. Classes are arranged to accommodate teaching schedules. Candidates are assigned a Support Provider at their school site (SA, RA, NPA).

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■ **Program Name:** Special Education Intern Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 24 months (FT); 29+ months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a Master of Science in Education with Specialty in Special Education degree and are eligible for a California teaching credential (Education Specialist Credential in Mild./Moderate Disabilities, Moderate/Severe Disabilities preliminary or Clear Credentials).

Credential Areas: Special Education K-12.

Program Description: This internship program is designed to support teachers on the job in local school districts. The interns receive systematic support, guidance, and feedback from both the participating school districts and from the university faculty and staff. Several key features of the University Intern Program include: on-site peer support buddy, university intern coordinator, and release time (SA, RA, NPA).

- **Program Name:** Special Education Part-Time Program

Student teaching involves two placements in elementary schools in San Diego Unified Schools, each lasting approximately eight weeks (SA, NPA).

Program Description: The APEX Program is designed to provide a high quality alternative preparation program for credential candidates employed on emergency teaching permits. In consideration of the unique scheduling and time constraints of emergency-permit teachers, the coursework is arranged in a time frame that accommodates working teachers while providing support supervision in the classroom in which they are employed. Qualifications for the program include a baccalaureate degree and employment on an emergency permit in a K-8 classroom. Course work is field-based. One-on-one supervision and support are given to the candidate (SA, NPA).

Program Name: Teaching Intern Program (TIP)

Approximate Time to Complete: 18-24 months (FT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a California Preliminary Multiple Subject Cross-Cultural, Language and Academic (CLAD) teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Elementary.

Program Description: This is an 18-month intern program designed for fully employed elementary teachers holding emergency permits or waivers. It is an independent (but not self-paced) learning experience with a common curriculum and identified support system of university faculty and site-based educators. Credential Areas: Elementary; Secondary: Language Arts/English, Spanish, French, Other Foreign Languages, Music, Art, Mathematics, Science, History/Social Studies; Special Education (in cooperation with other colleges and universities).

Program Description: This program is open to non-certified personnel in public schools throughout the Pikes Peak area. In cooperation with area school districts and higher education institutions, it encourages individuals who are employed by school districts in a variety of capacities (e.g., paraprofessionals, secretaries, facilities workers) to complete undergraduate degrees and teacher education programs. With state funding for tuition and books, individuals complete an associate's degree at a community college, meeting credit load and grade-point-average requirements. Program Description: These programs are designed for individuals who hold bachelors degrees in the liberal arts or sciences (for the elementary program) or in the discipline they wish to teach at the secondary level (mathematics, science). 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REGIS UNIVERSITY

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UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO AT DENVER

Program Name: Initial Teacher Education

Approximate Time to Complete: 16 months (FT); 21 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for a Colorado teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Elementary; Secondary: Language Arts/English, Spanish, French, Other Foreign Languages, Mathematics, Science, History/Social Studies; Endorsements in Special Education, Bilingual/ESL, Library Media and Literacy.

Program Description: This graduate level program is intended for people who already hold a baccalaureate degree. It responds to changing directions in teacher education and school reform, including the development of leadership capabilities in students who participate in the program. Five teaching responsibilities are the foundation of the Initial Teacher Education Program: teacher as scholar, teacher as instructor, teacher as professional, teacher as leader, and teacher as student advocate. Students prepare a teaching portfolio that addresses each of the teaching responsibility areas and that demonstrates their readiness to teach. Each teacher candidates completes three internships in a partner school over the course of a school year (SA, RA, NPA).

CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

Program Name: Summer Through Summer Postbaccalaureate Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 14 months (FT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates may earn a master's degree and are eligible for a Connecticut teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Elementary; Elementary Urban Strand

Program Description: In this full time post baccalaureate program, all teacher candidates have internships that provide experiences working with diverse populations of students. The urban strand, in particular, targets teaching in urban settings and is planned to respond to the presence of a highly multicultural society and to issues and challenges of equity and diversity. The program is conducted over four semesters, from one summer through a second summer. After completing coursework in the first summer, students have year long, school-based internships in schools that comprise CCSU's Professional Development School Network. The program theme of developing leaders in learning communities is enacted through sequential semesters of action research specific to internship sites. This program earns credits toward a master's degree as well as initial certification (SA, RA, NPA).

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SOUTHERN CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

Program Name: SCSU/Lisbon Internship Program

Approximate Time to Complete: 14 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a Master of Science in Education degree and are eligible for a Connecticut teaching credential (Conn. Endorsement #65—Special Education Grades 1-12).

Credential Areas: Special Education.

Program Description: The SCSU/Lisbon internship program is a functional and experiential one, within which students begin coursework in the summer and continue studies, while working on their internships, during the fall and spring. The first five-week student teaching experience (at the end of the fall semester) is really a work-in-progress in which students new to the field are guided by SCSU faculty and supervisors and by public school teachers and administrators. By the time the second student teaching period begins (at the end of the spring semester), students demonstrate expertise as beginning educators. The final summer is used to complete master's degree requirements (SA).

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UNIVERSITY OF HARTFORD

Program Name: Masters in Education

Approximate Time to Complete: 12 months (FT); 24-36 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for a Connecticut teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Early Childhood; Elementary; Secondary: Language Arts/English, Mathematics, History / Social Studies; Special Education.

Program Description: Students may apply for admission regardless of undergraduate major or previous coursework in education. Advisors work closely with each student to identify gaps in general education and content preparation and to locate resources to fill these gaps. Education coursework includes classroom as well as field-based learning, with flexible options to fit the needs of working adults. Student teaching and field experiences may be done in urban, rural and suburban settings. For full-time students, assistantships are available, including opportunities to participate in an innovative partnership program with Hartford public schools (SA, RA, NPA).

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DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY

Program Name: Graduate Certificate in Secondary Teaching

Approximate Time to Complete: 12 months (FT); 12-15 months (PT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates are eligible for a District of Columbia teaching credential. Students may also earn a Master of Arts in Teaching Degree (18 months full-time or 24-30 months part-time).

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for a District of Columbia teaching credential.

Program Description: The Secondary Education Program is offered with several teaching partnerships with area school systems, allowing for different teaching experiences or field placements. Program Name: Accelerated Licensure Program Leading to the Master of Arts in Teaching

Approximate Time to Complete: 10-24 months

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a master's degree and are eligible for a District of Columbia teaching credential.

Credential Areas: Early Childhood; Elementary; Secondary: English, Mathematics, Social Studies; Special Education.

Program Description: This collaborative with participating school systems and educational organizations recruits and prepares new teachers who meet the requirements for graduate study but would not otherwise be qualified to begin full-time teaching. The curriculum is grounded in the core propositions of the National Board for Professional teaching standards and is customized to meet state and district licensure and performance requirements. Course work and delivery formats are varied and participants are supported by experienced college faculty and school personnel who serve as coaches and mentors. Selected program partnerships enable participants to teach full-time while completing licensure and degree requirements (SA).
