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## ABSTRACT

This study presents findings from the 2001-2002 Transfer Program Follow-Up Survey of Parkland College (Illinois) graduates. A total of 423 students from baccalaureate/transfer programs were contacted approximately 6 weeks after graduation. Of those, 253 returned surveys, for a response rate of 59.8%. More than 58% of respondents were female, 81% were white, 7.6% were black, and 77% were under 25 years old. More than 46% of graduates were in A.S. programs and 42% were in A.A. programs. Almost 89% of respondents attended Parkland with an intent to transfer to a four-year college or university, and 86% indicated they would enroll in one the following semester. Satisfaction rates for all seven major programs were high. Between 77.4% and 97.1% felt very or somewhat satisfied with (1) course content (97.1%); (2) equipment, facilities, materials (96.7%); (3) lectures (96.3%); and (4) preparation for further education (91.3%). Nearly 79% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities to solve problems, while 78.3% indicated improvement in writing, 72.6% in speaking, 72.1% in doing math, and 57.6% in reading. More graduates reported they transferred to the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (15.1%) and to Illinois State University (11.8%) than to the other 12 in-state and 16 out-of-state institutions reported. 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
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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

I. Out of 423 graduates contacted in the 2001-2002 Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey, 253 returned surveys (response rate of 59.8%).

### II. PROFILE OF OUR TRANSFER GRADUATES:

- \* There were more female (58.4%) than male (41.6%) graduates.
- \* Approximately 8 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White:

- \* 46.3% of the graduates were in AS programs, 41.6% in AA degree programs, 6.4% in AGS programs, 3.1% in AES programs, and 2.6% in AFA programs.
- \* Graduates ranged in age from 19 to 66 and most (77.5%) were under 25 years old.

### III. OUTCOMES:

- \* 88.9% attended Parkland with an intent to transfer to a 4 year university/college.
- \* 86.2% indicated that they will enroll in the following semester.
- \* Satisfaction rates for all 7 major program areas were high: between 77.4% and 97.1% feel very or somewhat satisfied in:

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 2001-2002 by the Office of Institutional Research and Evaluation (OIRE) and the Career Center (CC).

Methodology

CC and a faculty advisory committee developed the survey instrument from the Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey questionnaire. In this study, graduates were asked questions that were pertinent only to the baccalaureate/transfer programs.

OIRE was responsible for mailing and CC for following up of surveys. The combined efforts generated a response rate of 59.8%. Four hundred twenty three (423) graduates of baccalaureate/transfer programs were initially contacted approximately six weeks after graduation. Non-respondents were mailed a second survey three weeks later. The remaining non-respondents were contacted by telephone calls starting three weeks following the second mailing. Some graduates who were unresponsive to the telephone survey were mailed a paper copy to complete and return.

OIRE was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results

Data are presented in Table 1 on response rates and Tables 10-20 on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic and college services; perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduate improvement; and the name of the institution to which they plan to transfer. Data by Gender, Ethnicity and Age Group are compiled in Tables 2-9. Tables 21 and 22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
