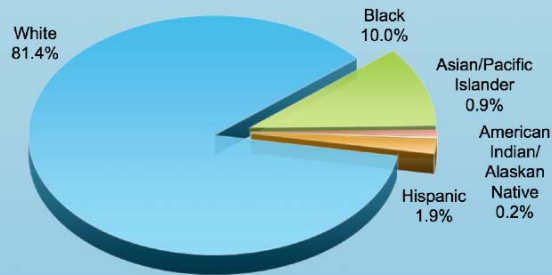

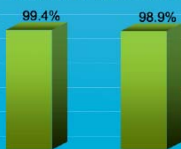

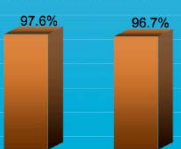

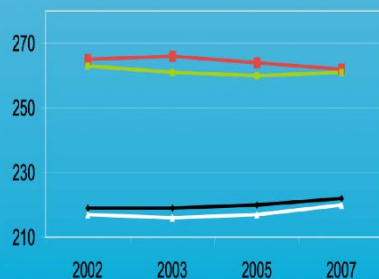

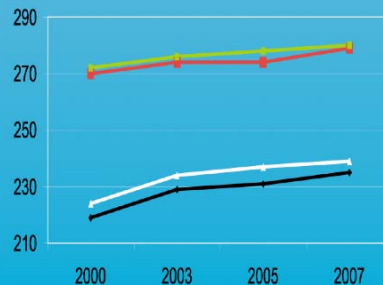

Kentucky Math Achievement

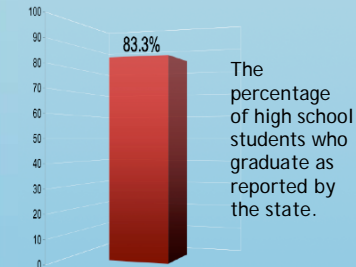

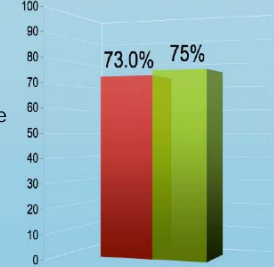
