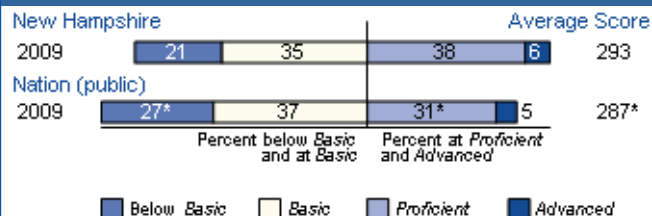


Overall Results

- In 2009, the average score of twelfth-grade students in New Hampshire was 293. This was higher than the average score of 287 for public school students in the nation.
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 44 percent in 2009. This percentage was greater than the nation (37 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 79 percent in 2009. This percentage was greater than the nation (73 percent).

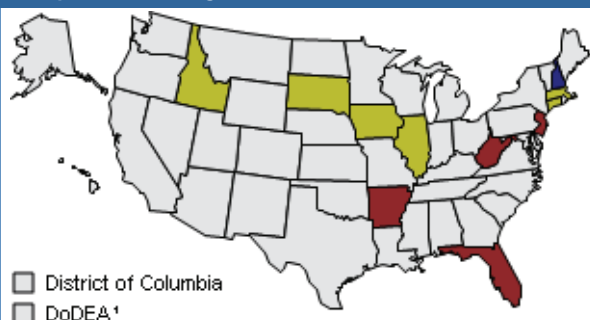
Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions

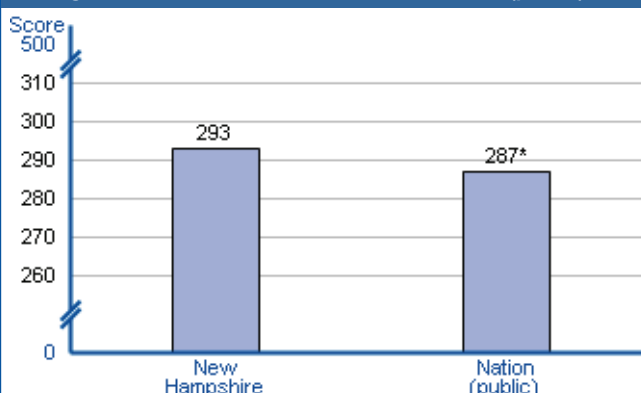

In 2009, the average score in **New Hampshire** was

- lower than that in 0 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 4 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 6 states/jurisdictions
- 41 states/jurisdictions did not participate

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, female students in New Hampshire had an average score that was higher than male students. This performance gap was wider than the nation (12 points).
- Data are not reported for Black students in New Hampshire, because reporting standards were not met.
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in New Hampshire, because reporting standards were not met.

NOTE: Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages. The national results are based on nationally representative samples of twelfth-graders from 1,670 schools. State results in NAEP reading are reported for twelfth-grade public school students in the 11 states that volunteered to participate in the first twelfth-grade state pilot program in 2009: Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, South Dakota, and West Virginia.
