
Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of eighth-grade students in New Mexico was 256. This was lower than the average score of 266 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Mexico in 2013 (256) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (256) and in 1998 (258).
- The score gap between higher performing students in New Mexico (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 43 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (41 points).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 22 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 percent) and in 1998 (23 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 67 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (68 percent) and in 1998 (71 percent).







In 2013, the average score in New Mexico (256) was

- lower than those in 46 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 3 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 1998, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
- In 2013, female students in New Mexico had an average score that was higher than male students by 8 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 20 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (15 points).
