SUBJECT: **SUMMER SCHOOL EDUCATION PROGRAM, 2015–2016**

Each year, the Houston Independent School District (HISD) offers a summer education program designed to assist students with a variety of instructional needs. The 2016 summer education program allowed students the opportunity to repeat required courses needed for promotion, to get ahead by taking required courses before the next school year, or to receive specialized instruction based on eligibility. Centrally coordinated summer school programs in 2016 included accelerated instruction for State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) and STAAR End-of-Course (EOC) retesters; bilingual or English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for English-language learners (ELL); credit accrual/recovery for students needing to graduate; Extended School Year (ESY) services; Promotion/Retention classes; and other school-based programs. The summer education program supports HISD's Strategic Direction Core Initiative 3: Rigorous Instructional Standards and Supports. The attached report shows student enrollment and outcomes for students who were eligible for and attended summer school in 2016.

### **Key Findings Include:**

- A total of 40,495 students attended the HISD 2016 Summer School program in grades 1–12.
- Of the students enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, most were in grade 5, (13 percent), followed by grade 3 (12 percent) and grade 9 (11 percent).
- A greater proportion of grades 1–8 students attending the 2016 summer school program fell into the Below Basic and Basic reading proficiency bands than would be expected given the HISD distribution of student reading proficiency levels.
- For secondary students, a greater proportion of students fell into the Below Basic reading proficiency band when compared to the HISD secondary students who took a reading inventory at the end of the 2015–2016 school year.
- When compared to the number of students retained at the end of the 2014–2015 spring semester (n=29,576), there was a 23 percent decrease in the number of students retained spring 2015–2016 (n=22,804).
- At the end of spring 2015–2016, half of the students in grades 1–8 were retained due to course grades only, 23 percent failed or missed the STAAR exam only, 18 percent failed to meet multiple standards, and five percent were retained despite meeting all standards.
- Of the students retained at the end of spring 2015–2016, 67 percent of students in grade 5, and 57 percent of students in grade 8, were retained because they failed to meet the STAAR reading and/or mathematics student standard only, or were absent for the exam. Moreover, in grades 5 and 8, an additional 27 percent and 30 percent of students, respectively, were retained for both failing to meet STAAR reading and/or mathematics standards and failure to meet course grade requirements.

- Of the students enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, 71 percent attended either 21 or 22 days.
- Students in grades 5 and 8 were effected by the state STAAR waiver. Nevertheless, many of the students in these two grades attended 21 days or more (74 and 65 percent, respectively).
- Grade 5 (94 percent) and grade 8 (98 percent) students were likely to attend summer school at a different campus than their Spring 2016 campus.
- In the summer of 2016, students in grades 9–12 took 53,251 courses, for an average of five courses per student. Of the courses taken by high school students (grades 9–12), 98 percent were designated face-to-face instruction and two percent were taken through Apex/ApexIS or by other distance learning providers.
- Of the 2016 summer courses taken, 95 percent were in STAAR\EOC subjects. Five percent were from other course selections such as industry classes, physical education, and language courses.
- A total of 7,001 students in grades 9–12 took at least one STAAR\EOC exam during the 2016 summer school program.
- Of the five STAAR\EOC exams administered during the summer, Biology had the greatest proportion of students meet the student standard (69 percent). English II had the lowest proportion of students meet the student standard (16 percent).

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# Summer School Education Program, 2015–2016

## Introduction

Each year, the Houston Independent School District (HISD) offers a summer education program designed to assist students with a variety of instructional needs. The 2016 summer education program allowed students the opportunity to repeat required courses needed for promotion, to get ahead by taking required courses before the next school year, or to receive specialized instruction based on eligibility. Centrally coordinated summer school programs in 2016 included accelerated instruction for State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) and STAAR End-of-Course (EOC) retesters; bilingual or English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for English-language learners (ELL); credit accrual/recovery for students needing to graduate; Extended School Year (ESY) services; Promotion/Retention classes; and other school-based programs. The summer education program supports HISD's Strategic Direction Core Initiative 3: Rigorous Instructional Standards and Supports. The report addresses the eligibility, enrollment, attendance, and outcomes for the 2016 HISD summer school program.

Since 2010–2011, the Texas Education Agency has had the same promotion standards, with the exceptions of 2014–2015 and 2015–2016. To be promoted, students must meet academic achievement standards or demonstrate subject matter proficiency for the grade level or course. Additionally, students in grades 5 and 8 must pass the STAAR. If a student in grade 5 or 8 does not pass the reading and/or mathematics STAAR, the school must provide accelerated instruction in the applicable subject and the student receives two more opportunities to retake the STAAR exam to meet the state standard. If a student in grade 5 or 8 fails either reading or mathematics on all attempts, the student is retained, unless promoted through a school committee decision or other plan. The state allowed three attempts for students, two during the school year and one during summer. TEA provided a waiver in 2014–2015. The mathematics standards changed in 2014–2015 and subsequently, the state suspended the promotion standard for this subject. Therefore, in 2014–2015, the STAAR reading was the only state assessment used in grades 5 and 8 to determine student promotion. In 2015–2016, the TEA commissioner suspended the third administration of the STAAR reading and mathematics exams for grades 5 and 8 and waived the promotion standard attached to the exams due to a delay in test results.

Between 2010–2011 and 2013–2014, in addition to other requirements, all HISD students in grades 3 through 8 were required to pass the state assessments in reading and mathematics to be eligible for promotion. In 2014–2015, in conjunction with the state, HISD waived the student promotion standards attached to the mathematics state assessment for grades 3 through 8. HISD students in grades 3 through 8 were still required to pass STAAR reading to be promoted. In 2015–2016, the district waived all promotion standards attached to the STAAR exams in both reading and mathematics for grades 3 through 8. Grades 5 and 8 were waived by TEA as discussed earlier. In addition to state assessment requirements, students have been required to meet achievement standards for their courses or could be promoted through a school committee or plan. Specifically, students in grades 1 and 2 were required to pass the high-frequency word assessment to be promoted and students in grades 1 through 8 were required to pass their classes.

## Methods

### Data Collection and Analysis

Several student data files were used to collect Spring and Summer 2016 information including, end of the year (EOY) promotion, retention, and enrollment (Chancery Promotion, Retention, and Enrollment file), students reading proficiency levels (iStation and Chancery Reading Inventory file), summer school

attendance (Chancery Promotion, Retention, and Enrollment file and Chancery Historical Grades file), and student demographics (Texas Education Agency PEIMS Average Daily Attendance file).

For the report, an HISD student cohort was created using the Chancery Promotion, Retention, and Enrollment file (Chancery PSE) for grades 1–8. This analysis includes HISD students who had promotion or retention records and excluded students who withdrew prior to the end of the 2015–2016 school year. Students from the Chancery PSE file were matched to the 2015–2016 Texas Education Agency (TEA) Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) average daily attendance (ADA) file for purposes of analyzing student demographics. A final HISD cohort of 127,794 grade 1–8 students was included for summer school eligibility and attendance analysis. Both the Chancery PSE file and TEA PEIMS ADA file were used to describe the student demographics.

Students from the HISD student cohort were included in the 2016 HISD summer school cohort if they were coded as present for at least one day of summer school; a total of 29,654 grade 1–8 students. High school summer school attendance was drawn from the Chancery Historical Grades file and included any HISD student with a positive summer school enrollment indicator. The Chancery Historical Grades file does not include summer school attendance records. However, it does include students who took summer school from either an HISD school or an outside provider. A total of 10,841 students in grades 9–12 enrolled in summer school. In the Chancery Historical Grades File, only the summer school campus site was available. Therefore, all spring and summer enrollment analysis used the same campus. In sum, a total of 40,495 HISD students, grades 1–12, attended the 2016 summer school program.

Lexile scores were taken from iStation results for students in grades 1–8, Grade 3 and 4 STAAR reading exams, and from the Reading Inventory (RI) for secondary students. From the HISD student cohort, 78,897 grade 1–8 students had an end of year iStation Lexile score. If the student took multiple EOY iStation assessments, the highest score was included in this report for analysis. Third and fourth-grade students received a Lexile score on their STAAR Reading assessment in 2015–2016. The STAAR Reading Lexile scores were used for any third and fourth-grade student who did not have an EOY iStation Lexile score. The reading proficiency analysis includes 4,009 Lexile scores taken from the 2015–2016 STAAR Reading assessment for a total of 82,906 students in grades 1–8 for the Spring 2016. Of the students, in grades 1–8, enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, 16,728 had a Spring 2016 EOY or STAAR Lexile score. Lexile scores and reading proficiency bands for secondary students were collected from the Chancery RI file. A total of 5,627 high school summer school students had an EOY Lexile reading proficiency band, as compared to 25,014 HISD Spring 2016 students. Lexile score categories for grades K–12 were provided by the Secondary Curriculum and Development department. A chart with corresponding Lexile score bands for each Lexile proficiency category (reading level) by grade can be found in **Appendix A** (p. 22).

In any file, students were dropped if their campus was not included in the standard HISD school list (RDSPD, etc.) or their student identification number could not be matched to TEA PEIMS ADA.

### Data Limitations

Several categories within the Chancery PSE file included incomplete information, including federal aggregated ethnicity and students enrolled in grades 9–12. Every attempt was made to match student demographic records with TEA PEIMS records and HISD's student information system. Students with missing data were not used for this analysis. Students from the Texas Connections Academy did not have promotion or retention information and were subsequently dropped from the HISD eligibility cohort. However, Texas Connection students were included in the summer school analysis cohort if they had attendance records for summer school.

## Results

The report addresses the eligibility, enrollment, and attendance for the 2016 HISD Summer School program. Included analyses are: HISD Spring 2016 enrollment, 2016 summer school eligibility, summer school program enrollment, Lexile reading bands for students enrolled in the summer school program, and summer STAAR\EOC results.

- For reference, the Houston ISD Spring 2016 enrollment is included in **Table 1**. A total of 214,146 students were enrolled in Early Childhood – grade 12 at the end of the Spring 2016 semester. This is different from the fall PEIMS snapshot in October and more closely reflects students available at the end of the school year to be promoted or retained for the next school year.


- A total of 40,495 students attended the HISD 2016 Summer School program in grades 1–12 (**Table 2**), both for enrichment and failing to meet HISD promotion standards.
- Compared to the Spring 2016 HISD grade level enrollment (Table 1, p. 5), Grade 5 had the highest grade-enrollment proportion (32 percent). In addition to grade 5, four other grade levels had at least one-quarter of the students enroll in the 2016 summer school program (grades 3, 4, 9, and 10) (Table 2). Grade 12 had the lowest grade-level proportion of students from Spring 2016 enroll in the 2016 summer school program (7 percent).
- Of the students enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, most were in grade 5, (13 percent), followed by grade 3 (12 percent), and grade 9 (11 percent). Grades 1, 2, and 4 all had 10 percent of the 2016 summer school program enrollment (Table 2).

*What were the Lexile levels for students in the 2016 summer school program?*

- A greater proportion of students, from grades 1–8, attending the 2016 summer school program fell into the Below Basic and Basic reading proficiency bands than would be expected given the HISD distribution of student reading proficiency levels (**Figure 1**, p. 7). For secondary students, a greater proportion of students fell into the Below Basic reading proficiency band when compared to the HISD secondary students who took a reading inventory at the end of the 2015–2016 school year (**Figure 2**, p. 7)
- In 2015–2016, 82 percent of 2016 summer school students in grades 1–8, fell into Below Basic or Basic reading levels based on their Lexile scores on iStation or STAAR Reading while 52 percent of all HISD students fell in these lower ranges (Figure 1).


- Of the HISD students enrolled in 2016 summer school program who took an EOY iStation or RI reading assessment, 78 percent of twelfth graders had a Below Basic reading level and 74 percent of eighth graders had a Below Basic reading level (**Table 3**, p. 8).

- Students from grades 5–8, who scored a Below Basic or Basic on their EOY reading assessment, and were enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, accounted for 44 percent of all summer school students in grades 1–8 (Table 3).
- A greater proportion of high school students attending the 2016 summer school program had a Below Basic reading proficiency (56 percent) than high school students in the district (40 percent) (Table 3). There was a smaller proportion of 2016 summer school high school students reading on the basic, proficient, and advanced levels when compared to the district proportion (Figure 2, p. 7).

### Grade 1–Grade 8

#### *How many students were eligible for the 2016 summer school program in grades 1–8 based on promotion standards?*

- Fewer students were eligible for the 2016 summer school program than in the previous 2014–2015 academic year. In 2015–2016, the largest proportion of eligible students and the largest proportion of retained students, based on promotion standards in spring, were from grades 5 and 8. This may be due in part to the change in promotion standards requirements for 2015–2016 as described on page 3. Grade 1 and grade 2 also had an increase in the number of students retained at the end spring (**Table 4** and **Table 5**, p. 9).

- When compared to the number of students retained in at the end of the regular 2014–2015 school year (n=29,576), there was a 23 percent decrease in the number of students retained in spring 2015–2016 (n=22,804) (Table 4).
- Of the students enrolled in HISD during spring 2016 in grades 1–8, 18 percent were retained in spring 2015–2016, while 82 percent of students were promoted (Table 4). This compares to 77 percent who were promoted in spring 2014–2015 (HISD Research and Accountability, 2016).

- At the end of the 2015–2016 spring semester, half of the students in grades 1–8 were retained due to course grades only, 23 percent failed or missed the Spring STAAR exam only, 18 percent failed to meet multiple standards, and five percent were retained despite meeting all standards (Table 5, p. 9).
- Of the students retained at the end of the 2015–2016 spring semester, 67 percent of students in grade 5, and 57 percent of students in grade 8, were retained because they failed to meet the STAAR reading or mathematic student standards only, or were absent for the exam. Moreover, in grades 5 and 8, an additional 27 percent and 30 percent of students, respectively, were retained for both failing to meet either the STAAR reading or mathematic standards and failure to meet course grade requirements (Table 5).

*What were the demographics for the eligible students in grades 1–8? How do they compare to 2014–2015 student demographics?*

- Concerning the students eligible for the 2016 summer school program, student demographics for gender, English Language Learner (ELL), special education, and Title I were consistent from 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, with less than a five percentage-point difference between the two years at the district aggregate grade level (grades 1–8) (Table 6).
- Ethnic demographics did not largely shift between 2014–2015 and 2015–2016 school years. In 2015–2016, Hispanics (65 percent) had the highest representation of the student group eligible for summer school, followed by African Americans (31 percent), Whites (3 percent), and all other ethnicities combined (2 percent) (Table 7, p.11).

#### *What were the reasons students attended the 2016 summer school program in grades 1–8?*

- In 2015–2016, 10,612 students (36 percent) enrolled in grades 1–8 attended the 2016 summer school program after failing to meet grade standards. These students were classified as either failing course work or missing grades (**Table 8**, p. 12). This was 861 less students than the 11,473 that qualified for the 2016 summer school program due to failing academic course work (Table 5, p. 9).
- The second largest reason students in grades 1–8 attended the 2016 summer school program was for campus enrichment purposes (n= 6,051 students, 20 percent) (Table 8). These were students who passed all academic and testing standards but enrolled in summer school and were coded as receiving enrichment services.
- In grades 5 and 8, 5,211 students attended after failing to meet student standard on the STAAR exam, or were absent during testing windows. The students attending due only to STAAR standards accounts for nearly 18 percent of all grades 1–8 summer school attendance (Table 8).

#### *Did the attendance drop in the 2016 summer school program for grades 1–8 after the state changed the promotion standards?*

The 2016 Summer School program began on June 6, 2016. On June 10, 2016, the Texas Education Agency Commissioner, Mike Morath, waived testing requirements for promotion impacting students in grades 5 and 8 (TEA, 2016). The removal of the STAAR promotion standards meant any student who failed to meet STAAR standards in reading or mathematics did not have to retake a third administration exam or be retained solely based on their STAAR assessment scores. With the 2016 summer school program starting on June 6 and ending July 7, 2016, there were 22 total days of summer school.

- In the 2016 summer school program, 5,211 students in grades 3–8 attended due to failing to meet STAAR standards or were absent for the STAAR assessment. An additional 2,198 students in grades 3–8 failed to meet STAAR standards or were absent for the assessment and failed to meet academic standards in grades 3–8 (Table 8).
- Of the students enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, 71 percent (n=183) attended either 21 or 22 days. Two percent had less than 11 days in attendance (Table 9, p. 13).
- The TEA STAAR waiver effected students in grades 5 and 8 who failed either the STAAR reading or mathematics exam and their promotion standards were changed by the state waiver after summer school had begun (TEA, 2016). However, many of the students in these two grades attended 21 days or more (74 and 65 percent, respectively) (Table 9).

- The Chancery PSE file does not indicate the date a student stopped attending summer school. However, as evidenced from Table 9, the large majority of students attended nearly all the possible summer school days.

*How many students in grades 1–8, attended the 2016 summer school program at a different campus than they were enrolled in at the end of the 2015–2016 spring semester?*

- Of the students in grades 1–8 attending the 2016 summer school program, 32 percent (n=9,346) attended a different campus than they were enrolled in at the end of the 2015–2016 spring semester. Most of these students were enrolled in grades 5 and 8 at the end of the 2015–2016 spring semester. In grades 1–4 and 6–7, most students attended the same campus for summer school as they were enrolled in for Spring 2016 (**Table 10**, p. 14).
- In grade 5 (94 percent) and grade 8 (98 percent), students were likely to attend summer school at a different campus than their Spring 2016 campus. An examination into the different campuses indicate the students from grades 5 and grades 8 attended summer school at a campus that served the next level of grades. For example, most fifth graders attended summer school at a middle school and most eighth graders attended summer school at a high school (**Appendix B**, p. 23). See Appendix B for a list of summer school enrollment numbers for the 2016 summer school program by campus. The summer school enrollment numbers are for all programs including enrichment.


*How many students were promoted following the 2016 summer school program and by what criterion?*

- **Table 11** displays the summer 2016 promotion and retention counts of students eligible for the 2016 summer school program. Of the students eligible summer school, 54 percent were promoted; 27 percent were promoted by a committee decision; and 11 percent remained retained by the end of summer 2016.


**Figure 3. Promotion Status of Students by Semester Term, Grades 1–8, 2014–2015 and 2015–2016**

- Overall, the percentage of all students from spring 2016 who were promoted by the end of summer 2016, increased from 96 percent in 2014–2015 to 97 percent in 2015–2016 (**Figure 3**).
- From 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the percentage of students promoted in the spring increased from 77 to 82 percent, while the percentage promoted in the summer decreased by eight percentage-points (Figure 3).
- The percentage of students retained for promotion standards remained the same from the summer of 2014–2015 to summer 2015–2016 although there were less students retained in 2015–2016 (Figure 3).
- The percentage of students promoted for meeting promotion standards increased from 77 percent by summer 2015 to 89 percent at the end of summer 2016 (**Figure 4**, p. 16). The percentage of students promoted by committee decisions decreased from 19 percent in 2015 to 14 percent at the end of summer 2016 (Figure 4).

- Of the 10,841 high school students (grades 9–12) enrolled in the 2016 summer school program, 42 percent were in ninth grade (n=4,561), 30 percent were in tenth grade (n=3,266), 21 percent were in eleventh grade (n=2,259), and seven percent were in twelfth grade (n=755) (**Table 12**).
- In the 2016 summer school program, the most courses were taken by students enrolled in ninth grade (45 percent), followed by tenth grade (28 percent), eleventh grade (19 percent). The fewest courses were taken by twelfth graders (8 percent) (**Table 13**).
- In the 2016 summer school program, students in grades 9–12 took 53,251 courses, for an average of five courses per student. Of the courses taken by high school students (grades 9–12), 98 percent were designated face-to-face instruction and two percent were taken through Apex/ApexIS or by other distance learning providers (Table 13).



- Of the 2016 summer courses taken, 95 percent were in STAAR\EOC subjects. Five percent were from other course selections, such as industry classes, physical education, and language courses. Of the STAAR subject areas, students were more likely to take math (29 percent) and English/Language Arts (27 percent) courses during the 2016 summer school program compared to Science (21 percent) and Social Studies (18 percent) (**Table 14**).

- During the 2016 summer school program, if a student enrolled in a STAAR subject course (English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies), it was to primarily recover credits (**Figure 5**).
- More students took a Math credit recovery summer course than any other subject/reason combination (n=11,642) during the 2016 summer school program (Figure 5).

*How many credits were earned by students attending the 2016 summer school program for grades 9–12?*

- Of the 53,251 courses taken in the 2016 summer school program, slightly more than a third earned high school credit. Three courses received a full credit (two semesters), and 20,328 courses (38 percent) earned a 0.50 credit (one semester) (**Table 15**, p. 19). A total of 32,920 courses were taken with no credit received (62 percent). Some of the high school summer courses which did not receive credit were review courses where credit was not given upon completion.
- Most of the credits earned were in ninth grade (44 percent), followed by students in tenth grade (29 percent), eleventh grade (21 percent), and twelfth grade (6 percent) (Table 15).

*How many students attending the 2016 summer school program took an End of Course (EOC) exam and what were the outcomes?*

- A total of 7,001 students in grades 9–12 took at least one STAAR\EOC exam during the 2016 summer school program (**Table 16**).

- Of the students taking a STAAR\EOC assessment during the 2016 summer school program, most were enrolled in grade 9 (54 percent), followed sequentially by grades 10–12 (26, 15, and 6 percent, respectively) (Table 16).
- Most of the high school summer school STAAR\EOC test takers took an Algebra I exam (6,718), followed closely by English I (6,687), and Biology (6,559) (**Table 17**, p. 20).
- Of the five STAAR\EOC exams, Biology had the greatest proportion of students meet satisfactory student standards (69 percent). English II had the lowest proportion of students meet satisfactory student standards (16 percent) (Table 17).
