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SUMMARY

This annual report updates the tuition and fee prices published by all of the public higher education institutions in the WICHE member states. It is the product of an annual survey administered to the State Higher Education Executive Officers (SHEEO) offices in each state, except for states such as Arizona, Idaho and South Dakota, where the data for the two-year colleges and technical institutes were provided by individual institutions. A copy of the survey instructions can be found among the appendices. The State Notes section summarizes additional interpretative information provided for selected states and institutions.

This report presents published tuition and fees amounts as averages both unweighted and weighted by full-time equivalent enrollments. Unlike unweighted averages, which treat each institution equally no matter how big or small it is, enrollment-weighted averages provide a truer estimate of the published price a typical student faces based on enrollment patterns. Appendix E provides more information regarding enrollment weighting.

Key Findings

Unweighted average tuition and fees for resident undergraduates in 2015-16 at public four-year institutions in the WICHE region were \$8,081, an increase over the previous year of \$209 (2.7 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average resident undergraduate tuition in the region was 1.0 percent over 2014-15. Tuition and fees for resident in-district students at public two-year colleges in the WICHE states, excluding California, averaged \$3,559 in 2015-16, an increase of \$64 (1.8 percent); and effectively no increase after adjusting for inflation (0.2 percent).

Non-resident undergraduates at public four-year institutions in the region faced an unweighted average published price of \$21,055 in 2015-16, an increase over the previous year of \$738 (3.6 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average non-resident undergraduate tuition in the region was 1.9 percent over 2014-15. Non-resident tuition and fees at public two-year colleges in the WICHE states averaged \$8,271 in 2015-16, an increase of \$89 (1.1 percent), which is no real increase after adjusting for inflation.

Tuition and fees for resident graduates in 2015-16 at public four-year institutions averaged \$9,772, an increase over the previous year of \$307 (3.2 percent). After adjusting for inflation, the change in average resident graduate tuition in the region was 1.6 percent over the 2014-15 school year. Unweighted average tuition and fees for non-resident graduate students in 2015-16 at public four-year institutions in the region were \$21,177, an increase over the previous year of \$619 (3.0 percent). After adjusting for

inflation, the change in average non-resident graduate tuition in the region was 1.9 percent over 2014-15.

The average percent changes in tuition and fees were about one percentage point lower when weighted by enrollment.

ALASKA

In June 2014, Alaska's one separately accredited community college, Prince William Sound Community College (PWSCC), was placed under the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) umbrella. It is now an independent community campus, similar to the arrangement with Kenai Peninsula College, Kodiak College and Mat-Su College. PWSCC and Kodiak have different resident tuition rates than UAA, approximately 12% lower. PWSCC does not charge different tuition for nonresident students; Kodiak College charges UAA nonresident tuition rates. The other community campuses charge the university tuition rates.

In 2015-16, Alaska resident students are charged \$183 per credit hour for lower division credits, \$221 per upper division credits, and \$423 per credit for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters.

Effective Fall 2015, student health insurance is no longer a mandatory fee at University of Alaska Fairbanks.

In 2015-16, nonresident students pay a surcharge of \$466/441 per undergraduate/graduate credit hour. Therefore, they are charged \$649 per credit hour for lower division credits, \$687 for upper division credits, and \$864 per credit hour for graduate credits, with no limit on the number of credits. The figures reported here assume a course load of 30/24 credit hours for undergraduate/graduate for two semesters.

ARIZONA

Cochise County Community College District: All amounts indicated include mandatory registration and technology fees wherever these fees are not broken out separately.

Pima Community College: Differential tuition became effective January 2012 for select courses. Reported figures are base tuition and fees.

Yavapai College: Beginning Fall 2012, a differential pricing model was implemented to eliminate almost all course fees. The tuition differential pricing model is comprised of standard tuition rates, laboratory course rates, career and technical course rates, and market tuition rates for select programs. Full-time resident tuition is based on weighted average of actual enrollment from prior fall term.

Arizona charges additional fees for certain programs: law, pharmacy, nursing, engineering, selected master's degree programs and undergraduate degree programs at Arizona State University and the University of Arizona.

Rates shown for undergraduate resident students at Arizona State University (all campuses) and Northern Arizona University are for new students starting Fall 2015; different rates apply to existing students. Northern Arizona University and University of Arizona undergraduate (resident and nonresident) student rates reflect a Fixed Tuition Program that keep base tuition rates unchanged (for each cohort) for 8 semesters.

Arizona State University fees in 2015-16 for resident students (undergraduate and graduate) include a one-time surcharge of \$320.

CALIFORNIA

2015-16 resident fees were computed by WICHE using the \$46 per-unit fee published at

www.californiacommunitycolleges.cccco.edu/PolicyInAction/KeyFacts.aspx (accessed October 20, 2015). 2015-16 non-resident tuition and fees were computed by the respondent and made available at http://extranet.cccco.edu/Portals/1/CFFP/Fiscal_Services/Standards/NonResTuition/reports/15_16/2015-16_nonresident_fees.pdf.

A student who is a resident of another state is charged an out-of-state or nonresident fee per unit. The fee is set by each community college district and is in addition to the statewide per unit enrollment fee.

A student who is a citizen and residents of a foreign country can be charged an additional nonresident fee per unit strictly for capital outlay expenditures. The fee is set by each community college district but cannot exceed actual expenditures per Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) student in the prior fiscal year and also cannot exceed 50 percent of the regular nonresident fee.

Compton Community College is now a part of El Camino College. They are shown separately because of differences in non-resident fees in earlier

For all California State University and University of California campuses, 2011-12 Tuition rates will remain in effect because the voters of California approved a November 2012 California ballot initiative to increase state taxes. However, there are some changes in campus mandatory fees.

California State University nonresident tuition is \$372 per unit at semester campuses and \$248 per unit at quarter campuses. 30 units reported for Full Time Undergraduate, 24 units for Full Time Graduate. Prior to 2010-11 there was a Full Time Maximum of 11,160 which is no longer used.

Undergraduate students at the University of California are required to show proof of health insurance. Undergraduate totals do not include waivable health insurance fees; 2015-16 health insurance fees were the following: Berkeley: \$2,580; Davis: \$2,115; Irvine: \$1,497; Los Angeles: \$1,931; Merced: \$2,097; Riverside: \$1,653; San Diego: \$1,833; Santa Barbara: \$2,772; Santa Cruz: \$2,634.

University of California, Merced opened in 2005-06.

The University of California, San Francisco currently only offers graduate programs and, accordingly, does not appear on the list of undergraduate institutions.

COLORADO

All Residents, except Aims Community College and Colorado Mountain College: The resident undergraduate tuition amounts for all Colorado institutions do not include the \$2,250 voucher for which all Colorado residents taking a full-time undergraduate course load of 30 credit hours at public institutions in Colorado are eligible. Beginning with the 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state will receive an estimated \$64 per credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process (<https://cof.college-assist.org/>).

All Community Colleges, except Colorado Mountain College: Higher rates apply to certain fields of study.

Aims Community College and Colorado Mountain College both have local district tax standing. This means that the schools have different tuition structure for "in-district residents", "in-state residents", and "out-of-state" students. The values presented are for "in-district residents."

Colorado Mountain College: Effective 2011, Colorado Mountain College began offering a limited selection of four-year degrees. Colorado Mountain College offers bachelor degrees at the following tuition rates—in-district \$99 per credit hour, out-of-state \$429 per credit hour.

The resident undergraduate tuition amounts for all Colorado institutions do not include the \$2,250 voucher for which all Colorado residents taking a full-time undergraduate course load of 30 credit hours at public institutions in Colorado are eligible. Beginning with the 2005-06 academic year, Colorado implemented the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Instead of the direct appropriations to institutions, under COF all public institutions in the state will receive an estimated \$64 per credit hour on behalf of state residents who attend their institutions as undergraduates and who apply for the voucher. Students are eligible for the COF voucher until they reach 145 credit hours of undergraduate study. The per-student allocation is set by the state's General Assembly during its budget process (<https://cof.college-assist.org/>).

Colorado Mesa University: Prior to August 2011, Colorado Mesa University was known as Mesa State College. Colorado Mesa University graduate tuition levels are calculated at 18.0 credit hours for a full academic year. Tuition rates for both resident and out of state are for the teacher education programs. Colorado Mesa University began offering a graduate-level business administration program in Fall 1997.

Effective 2010, Metropolitan State University of Denver (formerly Metropolitan State College of Denver) began offering a limited selection of graduate degrees.

University of Colorado and branches: Higher rates apply to certain fields of study.

University of Colorado, Colorado Springs: Upper division undergraduate students pay a higher tuition rate.

Western State College is now Western State Colorado University (WSCU), effective August 2012. If comparing to prior editions, note that data for some previous years for WSCU were computed by the respondent at 24 credit hours.

Effective 2014, Fort Lewis College began offering a limited selection of graduate degrees.

COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS

The Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) is the first active member from among the U.S. Pacific territories and freely associated states who joined WICHE in December 2012. The Carnegie Classification for CNMI's only public institution of higher education, the Northern Marianas College, is Baccalaureate/ Associates, but it is reported here as a two-year institution because its undergraduate instructional program is primarily Associates.

HAWAII

Community college tuition is charged on a per-credit basis for all enrolled credits effective academic year 2001-02. The amounts reported here are based on 15 enrolled credits per semester (30 per year). The per-credit rates for AY 2015-16 are \$120 (resident) and \$328 (non-resident) for all campuses.

Maui Community College renamed University of Hawai'i Maui College effective February 2010 to reflect the institution's four-year degree offerings. However, UH Maui College will continue to be included with the community colleges for reporting purposes.

IDAHO

Eastern Idaho Technical College: Fees are a best average.

College of Southern Idaho: Prior to 2013-14, 12-15 credits were charged at the 12 credit rate; beginning with 2013-14, there is a straight per credit charge.

North Idaho College: Prior to 2013-14, there was a 12-18 credit hour cap; beginning with 2013-14, there was an additional charge per credit hour above 12 credits.

MONTANA

Resident tuition levels represent amounts charged to residents of the local district/county supporting the institution.

In 2010, The Board of Regents approved an addition of 2-year offerings at Montana State University called Gallatin College.

Undergraduate tuition amounts for Montana State University-Northern, Montana Tech-University of Montana, and University of Montana-Missoula and -Western represent lower division undergraduate costs (i.e., tuition levels for students in their junior and senior years are higher than the amounts listed).

NEVADA

Tuition for College of Southern Nevada, Great Basin College and Western Nevada College is reported for full-time lower-division enrollment only. Select baccalaureate programs are offered.

While Great Basin College's Carnegie Classification is Baccalaureate/ Associates, it is reported here as a two-year institution because its undergraduate instructional program is primarily Associates.

Graduate rates do not include graduate student health insurance fees.

NEW MEXICO

Northern New Mexico college is a four-year institution that grants baccalaureate and associate degrees (and certificates as well). When categorizing Northern New Mexico College among other public institutions in New Mexico, Northern New Mexico College is grouped as a Comprehensive University, along with Eastern New Mexico University, Western New Mexico University, and New Mexico Highlands University. It is categorized in this report as a four year school.

Northern New Mexico College Board of Regents approved a tuition increase on April 19, 2011 to establish a unified rate and become comparable with peer institutions of higher education (IHEs) from New Mexico and offer similar student services while remaining the lowest among comprehensive IHEs in New Mexico and among the lowest in the nation.

NORTH DAKOTA

Two-Year Institutions

Tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 15 credits per semester. Until 2011-12, the 14th and 15th credits were free at Williston State College. The 15th credit was free in 2011-12, and that free credit was eliminated in 2012-13.

Dakota College at Bottineau was formerly Minot State University, Bottineau Campus, until August 1, 2009.

Four-Year Institutions

Mayville State University includes \$249 notebook computer fee (\$795 prior to 2015-16). A significant change occurred in 2006-07, when non-resident students, excluding Minnesota students covered under the ND/MN reciprocity agreement, were charged 1.5 times the resident rate, rather than the previous charge of 2.67 times the resident rate.

Minot State University: A significant change occurred in 2009-10, when non-resident students at Minot State University, excluding Minnesota students covered under the ND/MN reciprocity agreement, were charged the resident rate, rather than the previous charge of 2.67 times the resident rate.

Valley City State University includes a \$798 notebook computer fee. Valley City State University undergraduate tuition and fee rates assume a full-time load of 15 credits per semester.

North Dakota State University: The undergraduate and graduate rates that are reflected in the chart are the "basic" rates charged to most students at NDSU. Beginning Fall 2012, under NDSU's new tuition model, the program fees for engineering, nursing, architecture and pharmacy programs will be integrated into differential tuition rates for these programs. These differential tuition rates are not reflected in the data shown.

Dickinson State University: A significant change occurred in 2012-13, when non-resident students at Dickinson State University, excluding Minnesota students covered under the ND/MN reciprocity agreement and students in contiguous states and Canadian provinces, were charged 1.5 times the ND resident rate, rather than the previous charge of 2.67 times the resident rate.

OREGON

Some community colleges were able to reduce tuition in 2015-16 because of increased funding from the State Legislature.

Oregon Coast Community College is accredited through Chemeketa Community College.

District policy for Southwestern Oregon Community College allows a person to obtain residency in the district after residing in the district for 90 or more days.

Tillamook Bay Community College is accredited through Portland Community College.

Non-resident students from Idaho and Washington pay resident tuition at Eastern Oregon University.

Oregon Institute of Technology's (OIT) branch campus at Wilsonville assesses the same tuition but lower fees as OIT main.

Oregon State University's (OSU) branch campus at Bend assesses lower tuition for resident undergraduates and lower fees for all students.

Western Oregon University (WOU) continues to offer to incoming resident undergraduate freshmen and transfer students a one-time choice between WOU's base tuition rate and the WOU's fixed four year tuition rate (WOU Promise). Students electing the Promise rate option will not be subject to increases for a four year period. Amounts shown in the table represent the WOU base tuition rate.

SOUTH DAKOTA

Lake Area Technical Institute: Figures are based on 18 credits per semester as that is a more standard/average number of credits per semester for the majority of programs.

Southeast Technical Institute: Prior to 2006-07 (e.g., for 2004-05), full-time status was reported as 12 credits per semester.

Western Dakota Technical Institute: Additional required fees may be charged for facility, technology and program costs.

Non-resident undergraduates pay a rate of 150% of the undergraduate resident rate (adopted by the Board of Regents beginning Fall 2006). All new undergraduate non-residents and new transfers pay this rate except for Minnesota students who pay the approved reciprocity rate.

The non-resident graduate tuition rate was lowered \$100.00 per credit hour beginning with the Summer 2009 term.

Since the end of 2012 spring term, differential State-Support Tuition rates apply for the research institutions: South Dakota School of Mines & Technology, South

Dakota State University and the University of South Dakota.

UTAH

Effective July 1, 2010, the College of Eastern Utah became a subsidiary unit of Utah State University as one of USU's Regional Campus sites, and was known as Utah State University-College of Eastern Utah. The name of the institution was change again and as of May 14, 2013 is Utah State University Eastern.

Effective July 1, 2008, Utah Valley State College became Utah Valley University.

The University of Utah charges a slightly lower tuition rate for undergraduate lower division courses than for upper division courses. This applies to both resident and non-resident students. The tuition rate difference is relatively small. In prior years, the average of lower and upper division tuition was submitted; however, starting with 2013-14 the lower division tuition rate amount is being reported.

Utah Valley University began offering graduate degree programs Fall Semester 2008.

The Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) allows differential tuition rates for 51 separate graduate programs. Graduate tuition and fees reported here are basic tuition and fee rates applicable to graduate programs within the USHE (not an average of the 51 separate graduate programs).

The graduate tuition and fee rates for Southern Utah University are based on the rates of the institutions' Master of Education programs.

The graduate tuition and fee rates for Weber State University are based on the rates of the Master's of Criminal Justice and Education.

Effective February 16, 2013 Dixie State College of Utah became Dixie State University. It is one of three institutions in the West with a Carnegie Classification of Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges, with an undergraduate instructional program of 'Associates Dominant'. It is listed as a 4-yr institution for the purposes of this report.

WASHINGTON

In the state of Washington, "tuition fees" is a statutorily defined term consisting of an "operating fee" and a "building fee". The current (1st) year of Washington's 2015-17 biennial operating budget reduced operating fees by five percent while slightly increasing the building fee. Since the operating fee decreased, but building fees increased, the total reduction in "tuition fees" can be less than 5%.

The nonresident tuition rates shown are the approved nonresident rate for each college. Individual colleges have authority to waive all or a part of the nonresident differential, and the majority of the colleges do exercise this waiver authority.

Lake Washington Technical College changed its name to Lake Washington Institute of Technology effective July 22, 2011.

The names of Seattle's three community colleges changed to North Seattle College, South Seattle College and Seattle Central College effective September 2014.

Washington's 2015-17 operating budget provided for tuition reductions, beginning with a 5 percent reduction of the operating fee the first year of the biennium for all colleges and universities and additional reductions in 2016 for the universities. Tuition is statutorily defined as operating fees plus building fees, and building fees were not reduced so the reductions in tuition for 4-year institutions are less than 5%.

Full-time tuition for undergraduates is for 45 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for undergraduates at Washington State University is for 30 semester credit hours.

Full-time tuition for graduates is for 30 quarter credit hours at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Evergreen State College, University of Washington, and Western Washington University. Full-time tuition for graduates at Washington State University is for 20 semester credit hours.

Tuition and fee data provided for Washington beginning with and going forward from academic year 2008-09 represent a shift in fee reporting to align Washington tuition and fees with the WICHE methodology. Tuition and fee totals prior to 2008-09 included only services and activities and technology fees, whereas beginning in 2008-09 fees include all institutional fees that a majority of full-time students are required to pay in addition to tuition. For more information about adjustments to previous years please contact the Washington State Student Achievement Council.

Graduate rates at the University of Washington reflect those for graduate tier I.

WYOMING

In the Wyoming Community College System, credit hours in excess of 12 per semester are provided at no cost to the student.

The reported tuition and fees reflect costs for the Wyoming Community College System and do not include the University of Wyoming.

Fees for 2014-15, and total tuition and fees for 2015-16, reflect those published online by each campus, whereas in previous years they were provided by the system respondent. Changes from previous years may therefore reflect actual fee changes or differences in computation method.

Appendix A

The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education, 2010

The Carnegie Classification™ has been the leading framework for recognizing and describing institutional diversity in U.S. higher education for the past four decades. Starting in 1970, the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education developed a classification of colleges and universities to support its program of research and policy analysis. Derived from empirical data on colleges and universities, the Carnegie Classification was originally published in 1973, and subsequently updated in 1976, 1987, 1994, 2000, 2005, and 2010 to reflect changes among colleges and universities. This framework has been widely used in the study of higher education, both as a way to represent and control for institutional differences, and also in the design of research studies to ensure adequate representation of sampled institutions, students, or faculty.

To ensure continuity of the classification framework and to allow comparison across years, the 2010 Classification update retains the same structure of six parallel classifications, initially adopted in 2005. They are as follows: Basic Classification (the traditional Carnegie Classification Framework), Undergraduate and Graduate Instructional Program classifications, Enrollment Profile and Undergraduate Profile classifications, and Size & Setting classification. These classifications provide different lenses through which to view U.S. colleges and universities, offering researchers greater analytic flexibility.

These classifications were updated using the most recent national data available as of 2010, and collectively they depict the most current landscape of U.S. colleges and universities.

Descriptions below were pieced together using the language from the Carnegie Foundations web site. For full descriptions and more detailed information on classification procedures, refer to the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education website available at <http://carnegieclassifications.iu.edu> (the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching transferred responsibility for the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education to Indiana University Bloomington's Center for Postsecondary Research effective January 2015).

Doctorate-granting Institutions

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 20 research doctorates in 2008-09. First professional and Professional doctoral degrees (J.D., M.D., Pharm.D., Aud.D., DNP, etc.) were not counted for the purpose of this criterion. Institutions which granted fewer than 20 research doctorates can be identified by using Custom Listings to intersect categories of the Basic and Graduate Instructional Program classifications. As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

Level of research activity Doctorate-granting institutions were assigned to one of three categories based on a measure of research activity. It is important to note that the groups differ solely with respect to level of research activity, not quality or importance.

The analysis examined the following correlates of research activity: research & development (R&D) expenditures in science and engineering; R&D expenditures in non-S&E fields; S&E research staff (postdoctoral appointees and other non-faculty research staff with doctorates); doctoral conferrals in humanities fields, in social science fields, in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) fields, and in other fields (e.g., business, education, public policy, social work). These data were statistically combined using principal components analysis to create two indices of research activity reflecting the total variation across these measures (based on the first principal component in each analysis)

Master's Colleges and Universities

Institutions were included in these categories if they awarded at least 50 master's degrees in 2008-09, but fewer than 20 research doctorates (as defined above). Some institutions with smaller master's programs were also included (see below). As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

Program size Master's program size was based on the number of master's degrees awarded in 2008-09. Those awarding at least 200 degrees were included among larger programs; those awarding 100–199 were included among medium programs; and those awarding 50–99 were included among smaller programs. The smaller programs group also includes institutions that awarded fewer than 50 master's degrees if (a) their Enrollment Profile classification is Exclusively Graduate/Professional or (b) their Enrollment Profile classification is Majority Graduate/Professional and they awarded more graduate/professional degrees than undergraduate degrees.

Baccalaureate Colleges

Institutions were included in these categories if bachelor's degrees accounted for at least 10 percent of all undergraduate degrees and they awarded fewer than 50 master's degrees (2008-09 degree conferrals). In addition, these categories were limited to institutions that were not identified as Tribal Colleges or as Special Focus Institutions.

Among institutions where bachelor's degrees represented at least half of all undergraduate degrees, those with at least half of bachelor's degree majors in arts and sciences fields were included in the "Arts & Sciences" group, while the remaining institutions were included in the "Diverse Fields" group.

Institutions where bachelor's degrees represented at least 10 percent but less than half of undergraduate degrees were assigned to the Baccalaureate/Associate's category.

Associate's Colleges

Institutions were included if their highest degree conferred was the associate's degree or if bachelor's degrees accounted for less than 10 percent of all undergraduate degrees (according to 2008-09 degree conferrals as reported in [IPEDS](#)). As in previous editions, these categories were limited to institutions that were not eligible to be classified as Tribal Colleges or Special Focus Institutions.

Special Focus Institutions

The special-focus designation was based on the concentration of degrees in a single field or set of related fields, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Institutions were determined to have a special focus with concentrations of at least 75 percent of undergraduate and graduate degrees. In some cases the percentage criterion was relaxed if an institution identified a special focus on the College Board's Annual Survey of Colleges, or if an institution's only recognized accreditation was from an accrediting body related to the special focus categories.

Appendix D Procedure for Converting Current Dollars To Constant Dollars

The Higher Education Cost Adjustment (HECA), calculated by SHEEO, was used in Tables 2a and 2b to adjust for the effects of inflation. The base year for the constant dollar conversions was 2015, and the 2015 figure is preliminary at the time of this publication.

The formula for the constant dollar conversion is:

$$TF_{\text{Constant}} = \frac{TF_{\text{Current}}}{(HECA_{\text{Base}}/HECA_{\text{Current}})}$$

For example, the procedure to convert average resident undergraduate tuition in 2010-11 shown in Table 1a, \$6,297 to 2015 constant dollars is as follows:

$$TF_{\text{Constant}} = \frac{6,297}{(91.1/100)},$$

where the HECA value for 2015 is 100 and the HECA value for 2010 is 91.1.

Appendix E Methodology

Since 1980, WICHE has collected tuition and fees data annually from public four-year and two-year institutions in its 15 member states, and beginning with 2013 also from the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, the first participant among WICHE's newest member, the U.S. Pacific territories and freely associated states.

The data are generally provided by staff at system offices or at state higher education governing and coordinating board offices; a small number of individual institutions provide their data directly. Each year, respondents are asked to provide current published tuition and fees data for resident and nonresident undergraduate, graduate, and professional students in public four-year colleges and universities, and for resident and nonresident students in public two-year colleges. Data are charged to full-time students attending for the full academic year, except special sessions and summer terms. Respondents were asked to indicate tuition and mandatory fees separately. In addition, they are asked to verify and, if necessary, correct previously reported data. They also provide additional interpretive information about specific circumstances in their states or institutions that is shown in the State Notes.

The 2015 survey was mailed to state and institutional staff in June 2015. Surveys were returned by October 2015. The survey data were reviewed for possible errors, and problems were discussed with the staff in the appropriate office. This year's breakdown by institutional type used the "Basic Classification" of the 2010 revision to *The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education*; more information on the Carnegie classifications is available at <http://classifications.carnegiefoundation.org/index.php>.

This year's edition provides enrollment-weighted averages of tuition and fees in addition to the unweighted averages historically reported. WICHE used the *Fall Enrollment Survey* from the National Center for Education Statistics' (NCES) Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) to determine full-time equivalents (FTEs) for each public 2-year and 4-year institution in the West. The weighted averages used FTEs by institution as the weights and FTE was calculated as equal to the full-time enrollment plus 1/3 of the part-time enrollment as reported in IPEDS for the applicable year. 2015-16 and 2014-15 enrollment weights are set equal to the 2013-14 FTE since the most recent years' enrollment data were not available before publication.
