## 2019-20 Annual Enrollment Report



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## Report Summary

The North Dakota University System *2019-2020 Annual Enrollment Report* is an effort to report system wide, duplicated and unduplicated student headcount by combining degree credit, non-degree credit, and non-credit enrollments across the eleven NDUS institutions for an entire academic year. Non-credit enrollments provided through TrainND, a legislatively established organization powered by the public community colleges whose purpose is to provide customized employee training to North Dakota business and industry, are provided in Appendix 1. The academic year reported in this document is Summer 2019, Fall 2019 and Spring 2020 semesters.

The three credit types reported in this report are defined as follows:

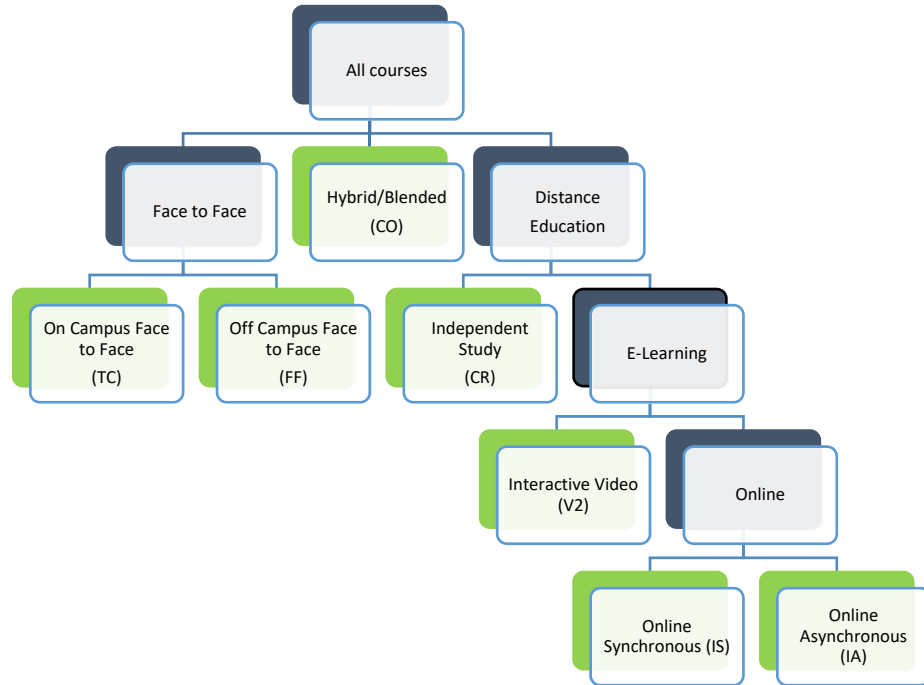
- **Degree Credit** - instructional activities which result in the award of college credit that can be applied toward a college degree.
- **Non-Degree Credit** – instructional activities which result in the award of college credits, which typically cannot be applied toward a college degree. This includes remedial and continuing education coursework.
- **Non-Credit Activity** – institutional activities, including Continuing Education Units (CEU) and TrainND activities, which do not result in award of college credit

Table 1 (pg. 2) provides the summative data for annual enrollment. Campus Solutions reporting has allowed identification of 74,014 unduplicated student enrollments across the eleven system institutions. Included in this number are 7,309 first time freshmen, 4,659 new transfer students, and 3,020 new post-baccalaureate (graduate) students, which are summarized in Tables 7, 8, and 9. Non-credit coursework reported by TrainND (Appendix 1) accounts for an unduplicated headcount of 19,008 across 1,412 participating businesses.

In addition to credit types, this report also presents course enrollments by delivery method. Delivery methods both face to face and distance education delivery as shown in the hierarchy that follows. There are two explanations worthy of note regarding delivery methods for this past academic year:

- *SBHE Policy 404.1 Distance Education Program Approval* was modified in February 2019 to reclassify which course delivery methods are included in the distance education category. This modification was made to align the NDUS definition of distance education with the federal definition used in IPEDS reporting. This policy change is reflected in changes to tables 2, 3, 4, and 5 within this report.
- The covid-19 pandemic resulted in all NDUS coursework being provided in a remote delivery method after mid-term of Spring 2019. In total, over 11,000 courses were modified to online or other remote delivery. In this report, course delivery data for Spring 2019 is indicated by the course delivery method in use at the start of the term (prior to pandemic).

Worthy of note is that even when disregarding the pandemic transition of courses to remote delivery, the number of students who enrolled in distance education courses increased by 6% over the prior year.



### Duplicated versus Unduplicated Counts

Totals are reported in the tables in this report as both duplicated and unduplicated. Students are duplicated in institutional counts when they enroll in two separate institutions during the same term, i.e., they are counted at both institutions. Students are duplicated in course delivery categories when they are enrolled in multiple courses with different delivery methods, i.e., they can be counted as both distance ed and face to face, or as interactive video and online synchronous.

Totals are unduplicated by delivery category as well as headcount. Unduplication results in total column/row  $\neq$  sum of categories in cases where students take course by more than one delivery method, or in total  $\neq$  sum of institutional totals in cases where students attend more than one institution.

For system level reporting, full time undergraduate is defined as students enrolled in 9 or more credits; full time graduate is defined as students enrolled in 6 or more credits. For system level reporting, full time summer FTE is calculated using the undergraduate total credit hours divided by 9; graduate total credit hours divided by 6. Summer full time and FTE on Table 6 may not match what is published by the individual institution.

\*For summer term, full time for undergraduates is 9 or more credit hours; graduate and professional students is 6 or more credit hours.

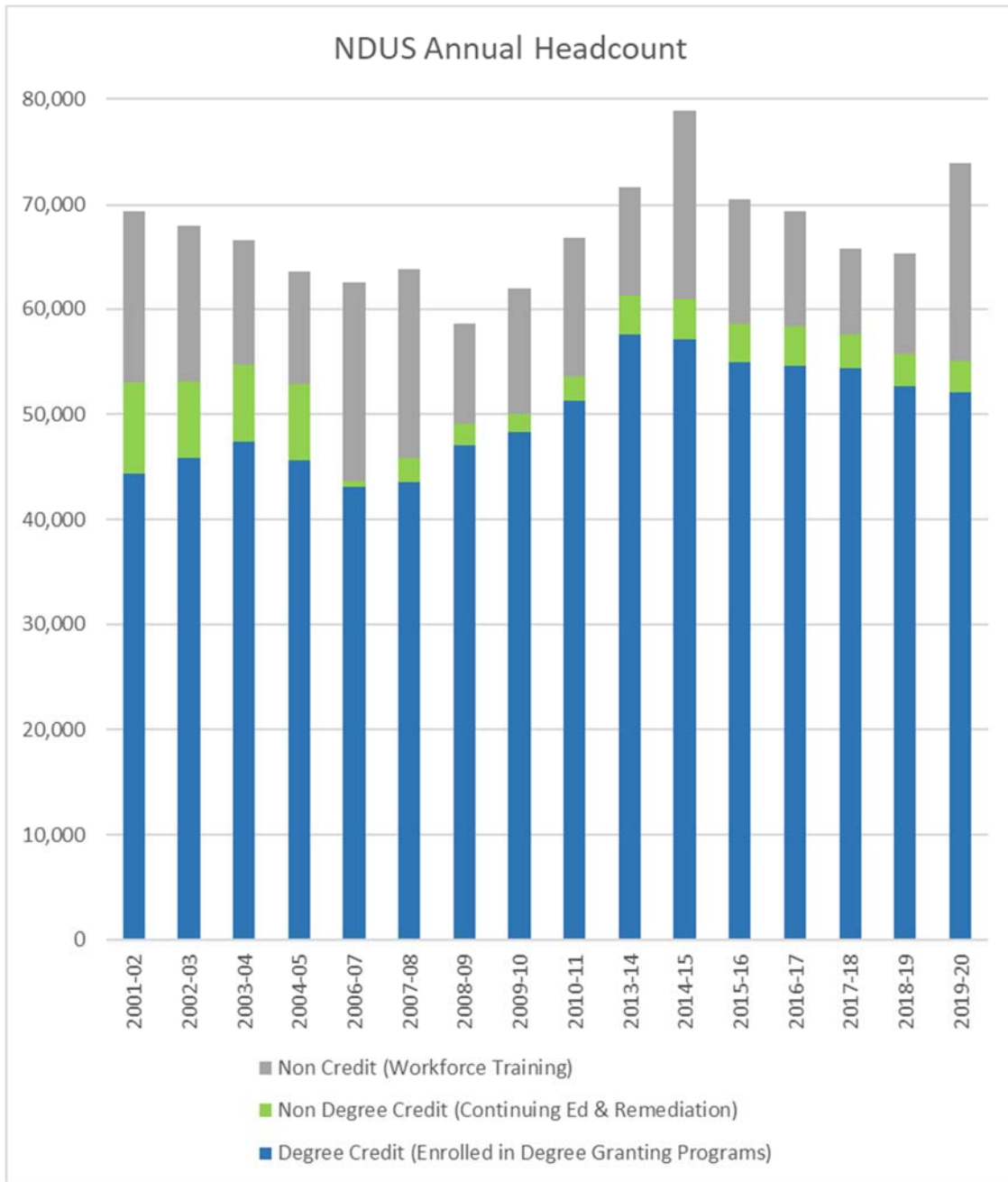

## Data Definitions

#	Term	Definition
1	Beginning Freshmen (FYR)	A full-time or part-time student attending for the first time as a freshman. This is a calculated value in Report D of the census enrollment reporting. For the Fall semester, this value does include the students who started in the summer. Because part-time students are included, this number is not the same as the IPEDS first-time full-time count.
2	Degree Credit (DC)	Instructional activities which result in the award of college credit that can be applied toward a college degree.
3	Distance Education (DE)	An academic program or institutional-approved credit course that uses one or more technologies to deliver instruction to students who are separated from the instructor and to support regular and substantive interaction between the students and the instructor synchronously or asynchronously. Distance education delivery modes includes the following (parentheses indicate coding of these courses in the NDUS student information system): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Online synchronous (IA)</li> <li>b. Online asynchronous (IS)</li> <li>c. Interactive Video (V2)</li> <li>d. Independent Study (CR)</li> </ul>
4	Duplicated	An enrollment count in which an individual student may be counted more than once because they are enrolled in more than one course delivery method or on more than one campus.
5	E-Learn/E-Learning	Instruction in an electronic format via the internet. Includes online asynchronous, online synchronous internet, and interactive video.
6	Enrollments	A single enrollment constitutes a single student enrolled in one course or institution. One student may carry more than one enrollment per term.
7	Full Time (FT)	Undergraduate students enrolled in 12 or more credit hours or graduate and professional students enrolled in 9 or more credit hours (as of the 20th scheduled day of class). For summer session, full time is 9 or more credits for undergraduate and 6 or more credits for graduate and professional (SBHE policy 440.1)
8	Full Time Equivalent (FTE)	On a semester basis means undergraduate total credit hours divided by 15; graduate total credit hours divided by 12. Full-time equivalency on an annual basis means undergraduate total credit hours divided by 30; graduate total credit hours divided by 24. Every professional student is counted as one FTE student.
9	Headcount Enrollment (HC)	The number of individual students enrolled in credit courses, regardless of credit load.
10	Hybrid/Blended (CO)	A form of instruction that includes students from different locations and/or environments (face-to-face, online, IVN, etc.) for synchronous and/or asynchronous instruction. Most “Hyflex”

		courses established during the 2020 pandemic are categorized as hybrid/blended.
11	Independent Study (CR)	Instruction is provided in a self-study, self-paced format where the instructor and student mutually establish method(s) of communication.
12	Interactive Video (IVN)	A video and audio communications session between two or more remote sites with live, animated image transmission and display. This connection allows for both the faculty and students to be seen and heard by each other.
13	Non-Credit Activity	Institutional activities, including Continuing Education Units (CEU) and TrainND activities, which do not result in award of college credit.
14	Non-Degree Credit	Instructional activities which result in the award of college credits, which typically cannot be applied toward a college degree.
15	Off Campus Face-to-face (FF)	Describes the traditional classroom setting where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place in an off-campus location and may incorporate the use of multiple supportive technologies as appropriate.
16	Online Asynchronous (IA)	Online instruction occurring independent of time or location.
17	Online Synchronous (IS)	Online instruction occurring independent of location, but at the same time (real time).
18	Part Time (PT)	All students enrolled in courses for credit but less than full-time.
19	Post Baccalaureate	Students who have earned a bachelors degree and are enrolled in courses at the graduate level. This includes traditional graduate students, medical students, law students, and professional students.
20	TrainND	A statewide network of training & courses for the workforce, with office locations at BSC, LRSC, NDSCS, and WSC. <a href="http://trainnd.com/">http://trainnd.com/</a>
21	Transfer (TR)	Undergraduate students who have earned college credit at another postsecondary institution following high school graduation (SBHE Policy 440).
22	Unduplicated	The enrollment count that removes duplicate enrollments of students across institutions or categories, so they are only counted only once. For instance, a student who is enrolled in two institutions at the same time would count as one unduplicated enrollment.
